## BART and Cal Bears football ready to roll

## BART Board makes history, picks first female to lead agency

After a nationwide search, the BART Board of Directors made history last month by appointing the first female to the agency's top spot.

The Board appointed Dorothy W. Dugger to be BART's eighth general manager on August 23.

Dugger has served as BART's Deputy General Manager for the past 13 years.

In her new position, Dugger will lead an orga-

nization of 3,300 employees, with operating and capital budgets totaling \$1 billion, serving 355,000 customers a day in 4 counties over 104 miles of track.

"It is a great honor to be appointed the General Manager of one of the best rail transit agencies in the country and I want to thank the Board for its vote of confidence," Dugger said. "BART's great legacy started decades ago when the public boldly invested in creating a transit system that now provides more than 100 million passengers each year with safe, reliable and convenient transportation. We now have a vital responsibility to

make the needed reinvestment to preserve that legacy even as we grow to meet the demands of the next several decades. High among those demands is to help the Bay Area reduce greenhouse gases. We must have a laser-like focus on providing a quality of customer service that entices people to take BART instead of their cars."

Dugger joined BART in 1992 as the Executive Manager of External Affairs, responsible for the Customer Services, Government & Community Relations, Marketing & Research, Media & Public

# New BART ticket kiosk opens at Coliseum/ Oakland Airport Station

Tectrans (CDSNet), BART's contractor for tickets sales and exchanges, has opened a new "mytransitplus" ticket kiosk at the Coliseum/Oakland Airport BART station. The kiosk will be open Monday through Friday, 11 a.m. to 7 p.m.

This new location will sell \$64 and \$48 high-value blue tickets, red discount tickets (youth 5-12 years old and qualified disabled), green discount tickets (seniors 65+ years old), Paratransit books, \$3 blue tickets (for use on the AirBART shuttle between the Coliseum/Oakland Airport BART Station and the Oakland International Airport) and \$6.70 blue tickets (round trip from Coliseum Station to downtown S.F.).

Customers can also consolidate and exchange \$64 and \$48 high-value blue tickets, BARTPlus tickets (current period only), red discount tickets and green discount tickets. There is a 30-ticket limit per exchange/consolidation transaction.

Cash refunds will not be offered at this location. Commuter Check, debit card, and cash are accepted for payment. No personal checks. Credit card acceptance will be available in the near future.

All locations are closed on holidays. Tickets purchased from BART ticket vending machines by credit card cannot be exchanged at these locations.

## **Question of the Month**

I've seen people selling BART tickets outside of some stations, and even seen BART tickets listed on ebay. Is it ok to buy tickets from these non-BART sources?

Purchasing BART tickets from sources other than those listed in BART brochures or on bart.gov is highly discouraged.

Purchasing tickets from a BART ticket vending machine, through your company's payroll program, or from an authorized BART ticket retail vendor assures that the value of the ticket purchased will be honored for that full amount, or can be refunded or applied

toward replacement based on the remaining cash value. Tickets purchased from unauthorized sources carry no provision of refund or replacement by BART, and may not even work when you try to use them.

Protect your travel dollars and purchase BART tickets only from authorized sources.
