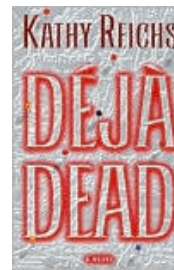
Mystery Book Club

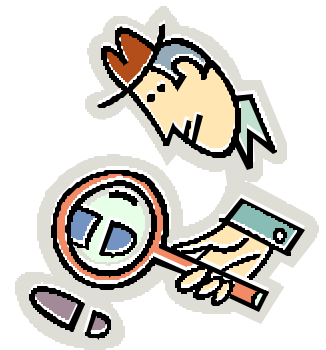
police procedural and the first book in her fantastic Inspector Lynley series. This will be followed in February with *Déjà Dead* by Kathy Reichs, a forensic mystery set

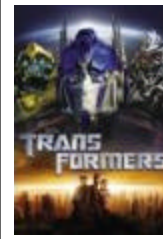
Are you a teen in grades 6 - 12 who knows what's cool and trendy? Join us and find out how you can make a difference in the library!
