SUBJECT: Human Trafficking

The NYS Division of Criminal Justice Services is pleased to announce the availability of human trafficking training throughout New York State. This training will review the provisions of New York's human trafficking law, and analyze the new crimes of sex trafficking and labor trafficking. Effective implementation of the law and the procedures for human trafficking victims to obtain rehabilitative services will be discussed and a segment on the human trafficking victim identification will also be included. The trainings are scheduled for Erie County in February 2008, Suffolk and Albany Counties in March 2008, and Westchester, Orange and Monroe Counties in April 2008.

Every year more than 20,000 people are trafficked into and within the United States for commercial sexual exploitation and labor servitude. New York is a frequent transit and destination point for these victims. On November 1, 2007, Governor Spitzer signed into law the most comprehensive and substantive state human trafficking law. This law applies to both U.S. citizens and non-US citizens and provides police and prosecutors with the tools necessary to fight this modern day form of slavery.

The interplay between New York's human trafficking law and federal human trafficking laws will be discussed as will the importance of inter-agency and inter-jurisdictional cooperation in effectively combating human trafficking. The training is primarily geared to non-sworn personnel, non governmental organizations and service providers; however, it is also beneficial to the entire law enforcement community.

Although we are planning for a large enrollment, seating will be limited. You must, therefore, receive confirmation of acceptance to attend.
