CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CIVIL COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST OFFICERS, DIRECTORS AND SALESPeOPLE OF GERMANIA BANK

The Commission announced the filing of a complaint on December 10 in U.S. District Court in St. Louis, Missouri seeking permanent injunctions against Edward Morris, Jimmie New, Steven Gardner, Joseph Mason, Douglass Horner, Douglas DeShong and Robert Freshour for violating or aiding and abetting violations of the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws.

The Commission alleged that Morris, New, Gardner and Mason, former directors of Germania Bank of St. Louis, Missouri, issued or aided and abetted the issuance of false financial statements dated September 30, 1987 which understated by \$4.1 million, reserves for losses on loans and other assets, in connection with the offer and sale of \$10 million of subordinated notes.

The complaint also alleged that Gardner and Horner aided and abetted Germania's misrepresentations concerning the payment of commissions to its Note salespeople. The complaint further alleged that Horner aided and abetted DeShong's and Freshour's misrepresentations and omissions concerning, among other things, the risk associated with the Notes and their receipt of commissions. JOSEPH PIGNATIELLO ORDERED TO DISGORGE

The Commission announced that on January 3 the U.S. District Court in Colorado ordered Joseph V. Pignatiello (Pignatiello) to disgorge \$100,000, payable in monthly installments of \$1,000. In entering the order the court granted the Commission's motion for summary judgment and rejected Pignatiello's claims of inability to pay. Also, on January 23 the court denied a motion by Pignatiello's counsel to withdraw based on Pignatiello's failure and asserted inability to pay counsel. The court found that its January 3 order rejecting Pignatiello's claims of inability to pay disgorgement also resolved his claims of inability to pay counsel.

Pignatiello, a defendant to a Commission injunctive action filed June 3, 1982, was vice president of now defunct Denver-based OTC Net, Inc. (OTC Net) that began SIPC liquidation simultaneously with the Commission's injunctive action filed June 3, 1982. The injunctive action, charging violations of the registration, antifraud, anti-manipulation, recordkeeping, bookkeeping and financial responsibility provisions of the federal securities laws, involved OTC Net's activities as principal underwriter of IPOs and manipulative trading in the immediate aftermarket of stock issued in the

IPOs. The complaint sought, among other things, disgorgement from Pignatiello of illegal profits earned through Swiss bank accounts used to secretly purchase stocks underwritten by OTC Net and to then sell the stocks in aftermarket trading at inflated prices. CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

ROLAND OTHICK, SAMUEL FRANCIS AND ROBERT REDMER PLEAD GUILTY

The U.S. Attorney for the District of New Mexico and the Securities and Exchange Commission announced that Roland "Buddy" Othick, Samuel A. Francis and Robert Redmer pled guilty on January 6, 1992 to one count Informations charging them with violations of Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder in connection with a scheme to defraud purchasers of the securities of Hal-Rad Communications, Inc., T.O.N.M. Oil and Gas Exploration, Corp. and Radtech, Inc., respectively. [U.S. v. Ronald "Buddy" Othick, Samuel A. Francis and Robert Redmer, Criminal Action No. 90-329, JC, D. N.M.] (LR-13150)

JUAN CARLOS SCHIDLOWSKI, FUGITIVE FROM JUSTICE, ARRESTED

On January 10, Juan Carlos Schidlowksi (Schidlowksi) was arrested after being a fugitive from October, 1986 until his January 10 arrest. A federal indictment issued March 21, 1985, charged Schidlowksi and two others with conspiring to impede the IRS by concealing and not reporting income made from buying and selling stocks through foreign banks and brokerage accounts, specifically buying and selling stocks issued in initial public offerings (IPOs) for which OTC Net, Inc. (OTC Net) was primary underwriter. OTC Net, formerly a Denver-based penny stock broker-dealer, was one of the nation's largest when it closed in 1982. Schidlowksi, president of OTC Net, pursuant to his guilty plea, was sentenced on May 23, 1986 to a two year prison term and fined \$35,000. Schidlowksi fled rather than report to prison and was a fugitive until his January 10, 1992 arrest. No details regarding Schidlowksi's arrest have been released. He is subject to serving his 1986 sentence and prosecution for fleeing the jurisdiction. [U.S. v. Joseph V. Pignatiello, Juan Carlos Schidlowksi and Arlan I. Preblud, Crim. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE MONTGOMERY FUNDS

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until February 25 to request a hearing on an application filed by The Montgomery Funds for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting the applicant from the provisions of Section 12(d)(3) of the Act and Rule 12d3-1 thereunder. The exemptions apply to the extent necessary to permit one of its series, Montgomery Emerging Markets Fund, to invest in equity and convertible debt securities of foreign issuers engaged in securities related activities in accordance with the conditions of the proposed amendments to Rule 12d3-1.
