ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES
EXCHANGE COMMISSION

INITIAL DECISION REVOKES STUART-JAMES REGISTRATION, BARS PRINCIPALS, IMPOSES LESSER SANCTIONS ON OTHERS

Administrative Law Judge Max O. Regensteiner has issued an initial decision revoking the registration of Stuart-James Co. and barring C. James Padgett and Stuart Graff, its principals, from association with a broker or dealer. The firm ceased doing business in 1990. The decision imposed varying lesser sanctions on certain former vice-presidents (Dirk Nye and Douglas P. Ward) and branch managers (John M. Beard, Michael C. Czaja, Robert E. Gibbs, Ronald J. Lasek, Shaw P. Sullivan and John W. Sutton).

According to the decision, the firm, under the direction of Padgett and Graff, violated antifraud provisions by charging undisclosed excessive markups in pre-arranged, riskless cross-trades from purchasers in two initial public offerings to aftermarket buyers at the opening of trading. The firm and its principals also distributed fraudulent sales scripts for use by sales agents. The branch managers violated antifraud provisions by encouraging agents to condition customer IPO purchases on "tie-in" agreements. Ward and Lasek were found to have established fraudulent no net selling policies. The firm, Padgett, Graff and Nye failed to provide reasonable supervision with respect to the tie-in practices. The initial decision is subject to Commission review on petition of a party or on the Commission's own initiative. (Initial Decision Rel. 32)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER, ORDER FREEZING ASSETS AND GRANTING OTHER EQUITABLE RELIEF ISSUED AGAINST WALTER ALEXANDER AND AMERICAN SPORTS ENTERTAINMENT NETWORK, INC.

The Commission announced today that on March 22 the Honorable Milton Pollack, U.S. District Judge for the Southern District of New York, granted the Commission's application for a temporary restraining order and an order freezing assets and granting other equitable relief against Walter E. Alexander (Alexander) and American Sports Entertainment Network, Inc. (ASEN). Judge Pollack scheduled a hearing on the Commission's application for a preliminary injunction for April 1, 1993. The complaint seeks preliminary and permanent injunctions against defendants Alexander and ASEN, enjoining them from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws, disgorgement and civil penalties.

Specifically, the complaint alleges that since at least January 1993, Alexander has attempted to raise money for the soliciting members of the public to make loans to ASEN through the use of material misrepresentations and omissions of fact. Alexander has solicited investors through advertisements in the Wall Street Journal and USA Today and continues to solicit them through a referral network. To date, Alexander

Today and continues to solicit them through a referral network. To date, Alexander and ASEN have raised at least \$85,000 from at least two investors. Alexander and ASEN have falsely represented to investors and prospective investors that their investment will be fully secured either by a bank, an insurance company or a broker-dealer. In fact, the banks, insurance company and broker-dealer identified by Alexander and ASEN have no knowledge of the transactions described by Alexander and ASEN. [SEC v. Walter E. Alexander, a.k.a. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NATIONAL FUEL GAS COMPANY, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 12, 1993 to request a hearing on a proposal by National Fuel Gas Company (National), a registered holding company, and its wholly-owned subsidiary companies, National Fuel Gas Distribution Corporation (Distribution), National Fuel Gas Supply Corporation (Supply), Seneca Resources Corporation (Seneca), Penn-York Energy Corporation (Penn-York), Empire Exploration, Inc. (Empire) and Utility Constructors, Inc. (Constructors) (collectively, Subsidiaries). It is proposed that National issue and sell, through December 31, 1994, in one or more transactions, up to an aggregate principal amount of \$350 million. This may be accomplished through any combination of (a) one or more series of its debentures (Debentures) by, or under an exception from the requirements of, competitive bidding and (b) medium-term notes (MTNs), under an exception from competitive bidding, such Debentures and MTNs to mature in not more than forty years. It is further proposed that National lend, through December 31, 1994, up to (a) \$250 million to Distribution, (b) \$150 million to Supply, (c) \$100 million to Seneca, (d) \$50 million to Penn-York, (e) \$40 million to Empire and (f) \$15 million to Constructors, all such loans to be made in exchange for unsecured notes. The total amount lent by National to the Subsidiaries would not exceed the proceeds received by National from the issuance of the Debentures and/or MTNs. (Rel. 35-25763)

NATIONAL FUEL GAS COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 12, 1993 to request a hearing on a proposal by National Fuel Gas Company (National), a registered holding company, to issue and sell in one or more transactions through March 31, 1995 up to 2.5 million shares of its common stock (Additional Common Stock). National also proposes to use the proceeds from the sale of the Additional Common Stock to make capital contributions from time to time through March 31, 1995 to its wholly-owned subsidiaries, Seneca Resources Corporation, National Fuel Gas Distribution Corporation, National Fuel Gas Supply Corporation, Penn-York Energy Corporation and Utility Constructors, Inc. OHIO POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 12, 1993 to request a hearing on a proposal by Ohio Power Company (Ohio Power), a subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., a registered holding company. Ohio Power proposes, in connection with its issuance and sale of up to \$30 million aggregate par value of one or more new series of its cumulative preferred stock, to acquire or redeem such stock through a sinking fund or optional redemption provision and to amend its Articles of

Incorporation to allow for such issuance and sale of stock. (Rel. 35-25763)

CENTRAL AND SOUTH WEST CORP., ET AL.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing three actions by Central and South West Corporation, a registered holding company, and three of its nonutility subsidiaries, CSW Energy, Inc., CSW Development-I, Inc., and ARK/CSW Development Partnership. Applicants are authorized to increase the maximum amount of aggregate equity contributions to Polk Power Partners, L.P., a Delaware limited partnership organized to own and operate a 122.2 megawatt, gas-fired cogeneration facility (Project) located in Polk County, Florida, to \$32 million. They are also authorized to increase the amount to be borrowed from third party lenders for use in constructing and developing the Project to \$160 million and to self-finance the construction of the Project. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Chicago Board Options Exchange filed a proposed rule change (SR-CBOE-93-04) to permit the Exchange to list and trade quarterly index expiration, capped-style options on the Standard & Poor's Corporation 100 and 500 stock indexes. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of March 22. (Rel. 34-32002)

The National Association of Securities Dealers filed an amendment to its proposed rule change (SR-NASD-91-05) amending Schedule I to the NASD By-Laws which govern the operation of the PORTAL Market and any trading effected in PORTAL securities. The PORTAL Market was established to provide a marketplace for primary distributions and secondary trading meeting the requirements of Rule 144A under the Securities Act of 1933.
