ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS AGAINST BRUCE BOWEN AND THOMAS CANON, JR.

On June 1, the Commission issued an amendment to the Order Instituting Public Proceedings in In the Matter of Bruce Bowen and Thomas Canon, Jr., Administrative Proceeding No. 3-7988). The Amended Order states that Richard L. Warner, co-founder and chairman of the board of AlpNet, Inc., manipulated the price of AlpNet stock by frequently making purchases of AlpNet stock during the trading day, either directly or through nominee accounts, in order to move the price of the stock higher. Warner's purchases were often made at or near the end of the trading day -- a practice known as "marking the close." The Order was also amended to allege that respondents Bruce Bowen and Thomas Canon, Jr., account executives at PaineWebber, Inc. and Wilson-Davis, Inc., respectively, knew or were reckless in not knowing that Warner and his nominees usually entered orders when the price of the latest trade in AlpNet stock was below the ask price and that Warner frequently directed a purchase in one of his nominee accounts for the purpose of causing the stock to trade at a higher price. NASD DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST SACKS INVESTMENT COMPANY, INC. AND RICHARD SACKS SUSTAINED

The Commission has sustained disciplinary action against Sacks Investment Company, Inc. of Novato, California and Richard Lawrence Sacks, its president and sole shareholder. The Commission found that between October 1988 and February 1989 Sacks Investment charged customers unfair and fraudulent markups in sales of three securities. With respect to one of the securities, because the firm's prices for several of the transactions were either at or lower than the market, the Commission reduced the fine imposed by the NASD, which was calculated based on the excessive markups. The Commission further found, as had the NASD, that Sacks Investment failed to report certain trades to NASDAQ, to abide by an agreement with the NASD restricting it from engaging in the purchase and sale of securities on a principal basis, and to employ two registered securities principals, a financial and operations principal and a municipal securities principal. It therefore sustained the findings of violation and the sanctions imposed by the NASD. The NASD had censured the firm and Sacks, and barred Sacks from associating in any capacity with any NASD member. The Commission adjusted the fine assessed against Sacks and Sacks Investment, jointly and severally, to \$159,956.42. (Rel. 34-32436)

NASD ACTION AGAINST MICHAEL ALAN LEEDS MODIFIED

The Commission has modified NASD disciplinary action against Michael Alan Leeds of Guttenberg, New Jersey. Leeds was president of Brooks, Weinger, Robbins & Leeds, Inc. (Brooks), a former NASD member firm. The Commission affirmed the NASD's censure of Leeds and its decision to bar Leeds from association with any NASD member. However, the Commission reduced the NASD's fine from \$376,396 to \$238,254.

In June 1987, Brooks was the principal underwriter of an offering of 85 million shares of common stock of Advanced Medical Products, Inc. (ADVA). The Commission found that on the first day of aftermarket trading in ADVA (July 1, 1987) Leeds was responsible for charging retail customers excessive markups in 1,159 sales of that stock and excessive markdowns in 590 purchases. The Commission also found that Leeds failed to register as a general securities principal with Brooks from November 1986 to December 31, 1987. The Commission concluded that Brooks dominated and controlled the market for ADVA stock. It also found that Leeds recklessly disregarded indications that he might be charging customers unfair prices, including a specific warning from the firm's compliance officer.

The Commission concluded that the NASD had improperly computed the unfair markdowns charged Brooks' customers. Because the NASD's fine was calculated as a percentage of Brooks' profits, the Commission reduced Leeds' fine from \$376,396 to \$238,254 to reflect the Commission's recalculation of the number and size of excessive markdowns and the profits related thereto. However, the Commission found that the NASD's remaining sanctions were not excessive, noting Leeds' clear disregard for compliance with the NASD's pricing policy. (Rel. 34-32437)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

SOUTHWEST INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on June 14 U.S. District Judge A. Andrew Hauk granted the Commission's motion for entry of a judgment of permanent injunction and other relief by default against Southwest International Exchange (SIE). The Judgment provides that SIE is permanently enjoined from violating the registration and antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Judgment also provides that SIE is ordered to pay disgorgement, prejudgment interest and civil penalties in amounts to be subsequently determined by the Court. Additionally, the Judgment states that a previously ordered asset freeze against SIE shall remain in effect.

Previously, on March 25, 1993, the Court entered a preliminary injunction, an asset freeze and other relief against SIE and another defendant, William L. Telander. Also, on March 17, 1993, a Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Relief was entered against the remaining defendant, Roger C. Briggs.

The Commission's complaint alleges that from approximately mid-1990 to at least mid-1992 the defendants engaged in the fraudulent offer and sale of unregistered securities purporting to be limited partnership interests in a foreign currency exchange program. The defendants raised approximately \$7.8 million from about 380 investors nationwide. [SEC v. Southwest International Exchange, Roger C. Briggs and William L. Telander, Civil Action No. 93-1285, AAH, SHx, C.D. Cal.] (LR-13672)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

CORRECTION

The June 4th issue of the Digest contained an inaccurate notice concerning U.S. v. Alexander V. Stein. The corrected version of the notice is as follows.

ALEXANDER STEIN CONVICTED

The Commission and Jack C. Wong, U.S. Attorney for the District of Oregon announced that on May 20, 1993 after a two week trial, a federal jury in Portland Oregon found Alexander V. Stein, formerly of Portland, guilty of thirty five counts of securities fraud, mail fraud, wire fraud and money laundering.

The indictment alleged that Stein, through his company AVS Capital Fund, Ltd., defrauded investors of over \$5 million through an investment scheme which he described as fully hedged arbitrage. Stein failed to disclose practically all trading was in risky call options and diversions of investors' funds for his personal benefit. Stein later lulled his investors into a false sense of security by using a wide variety of forged documents to create the illusion that he had lucrative telecommunication contracts which would allow him to repay all his investors. Sentencing is set for July 26, 1993.

The investigation in this matter was conducted jointly with the United States Attorney's Office and the Criminal Investigation Division of the Internal Revenue Service, with assistance from the Oregon Securities Division. [U.S. v. Alexander V. Stein, No. CR92-150-RE, D. OR.] (LR-13657)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

TEXAS UTILITIES COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Texas Utilities Company (Texas Utilities), a public-utility holding company exempt from registration by order under Section 3(a)(1) of the Act, to acquire all of the outstanding common shares of Southwestern Electric Service Company, a Texas electric utility company. This order also grants Texas Utilities an exemption under Section 3(a)(1) from all provisions of the Act, except Section 9(a)(2), following the proposed transactions. (Rel. 35-25826)

DELISTINGS GRANTED

An order has been issued granting the application of the American Stock Exchange to strike from listing and registration AM International, Inc., Warrants to Purchase Common Stock, Expiring February 28, 1997. (Rel. 34-32464)

An order has been issued granting the application of the Boston Stock Exchange to strike from listing and registration IVF America, Inc., Common Stock, \$.01 Par Value. (Rel. 34-32466)

UNLISTED TRADING PRIVILEGES GRANTED

Orders have been issued granting the applications of three exchanges for unlisted trading privileges in issues which are listed and registered on one or more other national securities exchange and are reported in the consolidated transaction reporting system. ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission granted accelerated approval to a proposed rule change filed by the Midwest Stock Exchange (SR-MSE-93-14) to extend through March 21, 1994 an MSE pilot program relating to stopped orders in minimum variation markets. (Rel. 34-32457)

The Commission granted accelerated approval to a proposed rule change filed by the International Securities Clearing Corporation (SR-ISCC-93-02) that would effect an amendment to the Linkage Agreement between ISCC and the London Stock Exchange and establish a custody agreement between ISCC and Citibank, N.A., London branch. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of June 21. (Rel. 34-32462; International Series Rel. 554)

PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Options Clearing Corporation filed a proposed rule change (SR-OCC-93-09) to permit OCC to have Friday as the expiration date for certain foreign currency option contracts to be listed in the future. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of June 21. (Rel. 34-32458; International Series Rel. 553)

Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
