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## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

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### DEFAULT ENTERED AGAINST LYLOG INTERNATIONAL ENERGY CORP. AND LYLE OGDEN

The Commission entered an Order, based on the default of all respondents, whereby Lyle Ogden was barred from association with any broker-dealer and the registration of Lylog International Energy Corp., a Denver, Colorado broker-dealer, was revoked. On October 16, 1984, the Commission instituted public administrative proceedings under Section 15(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Lylog and Ogden, Lylog's principal.

The Order for Public Proceedings alleged that while engaged in the offer and sale of securities, Lylog and Ogden violated the antifraud provisions of the Securities and Exchange Acts, and Lylog, wilfully aided and abetted by Ogden, violated Sections 15(a), 15(b)(8) and 17(a) of the Exchange Act and Rules 15b3-1, 15c2-4, 17a-3 and 17a-11. The Order also cited the Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction entered against Lylog and Ogden by the U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado on May 3, 1984 and criminal conviction of Ogden for forgery entered by a Denver, Colorado state court on September 21, 1983 as further grounds for the administrative proceedings. 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## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

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### COMPLAINT NAMES APPALACHIAN RAILCAR MANUFACTURING AND REPAIR INC. AND CLAUDE E. CHUMLEY

The Chicago Regional Office filed a complaint on February 6 in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Kentucky, London Division, seeking to permanently enjoin Appalachian Railcar Manufacturing and Repair, Inc. and Claude E. Chumley from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws.

The complaint alleges that: at different times from June 1982 to January 1984, the defendants sold over \$500,000 worth of unregistered Appalachian notes to over 300 investors located in Kentucky, Tennessee, Virginia, Indiana and Michigan; in these sales, the defendants misrepresented to the investor the safety of their investments, how the investor funds were to be used, the existence of a highly marketable patent, and the financial support of the company; and in these sales, the defendants omitted to state the financial condition of the company and the fact that the product designed by the company would not be approved by the regulators. ### "FREE RIDING ACTIVITIES" SUBJECT OF CIVIL COMPLAINT

The Boston Regional Office filed a complaint on February 19 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Connecticut against James L. Condron of Wilton, Connecticut, Condron Associates, Inc., J. L. Condron & Co., Inc., Raymond O. Rose, Oliver Rose Securities, Inc. (ORSI), Richardson Greenshields, Inc. (RGI) and Jerome King. The complaint alleges antifraud provisions of the securities laws and the credit extension provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

The complaint describes a complex web of numerous securities accounts opened and maintained by money manager Condron at a multitude of broker-dealers nationwide. The key broker is indicated to be ORSI, of Westport, Connecticut, which supplied a computerized system permitting the purchase and sale of securities using a single clearing broker, RGI, of New York City, even though the money manager might use a large number of executing brokers.

The Commission alleged that: Condron manages the funds and trades on behalf of five limited partnerships which had total assets of \$3.4 million but which experienced losses that were concealed from investors; King, CPA, participated in concealing these losses; and Condron used voluminous trading activity and "free riding" to manipulate the price of at least one security. **PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION ENTERED AGAINST BRENTWOOD SECURITIES, INC.  
AND CHRISTOPHER J. DELAHUNTY**

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that on February 14 the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California entered a preliminary injunction against Brentwood Securities, Inc. and Christopher J. Delahunty based upon a Commission complaint alleging violations of the antifraud, net capital and recordkeeping provisions of the securities laws. Brentwood and Delahunty consented to the preliminary injunction without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations.

The February 7 complaint alleged that: Brentwood and its sole shareholder and president, Delahunty, engaged in unauthorized transactions using clients' funds and converted some of these funds to Delahunty's use; Brentwood operated in violation of the net capital and recordkeeping rules; and Brentwood did not telegraphically notify the Commission, as required, of its failure to meet the requirements of the net capital rule. **INJUNCTION ENTERED AGAINST JOSEPH L. SOULIERE**

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on February 13 the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Ohio entered a Final Judgment against Joseph L. Souliere of Toledo, Ohio permanently restraining and enjoining him from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Souliere consented to the Final Judgment without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations.

The complaint alleged that Souliere: schemed to defraud investors in the sale of Purchasing Consultants, Inc. (PCI) securities; misrepresented the return investors could expect on their investments; and failed to disclose that PCI had never been profitable and could not survive without additional investor funds. (SEC v. Purchasing Consultants, Inc., et al., WDOH, C-84-7293, filed March 29, 1984). (LR-10689)

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## **CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS**

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**F. DUNCAN FRAZER INDICTED**

The Boston Regional Office and the U.S. Attorney in Boston, Massachusetts announced that on February 12 F. Duncan Frazer of Lynnfield, Massachusetts was indicted in a ten-count mail fraud indictment. Frazer, formerly Treasurer and Chief Financial Officer of Massachusetts Financial Services Company (MFS), a Boston-based investment adviser registered with the Commission which advises and manages approximately 18 registered investment companies, embezzled over \$1.4 million in a scheme in which he submitted false expense vouchers purportedly for travel expenses of MFS' employees. 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## **HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

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**NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC SYSTEM**

A notice has been issued extending, from March 1 to March 21, the time in which interested persons may request a hearing on a proposal by New England Electric System, and its subsidiary, NEES Energy, Inc. Original notice was previously given in Release 35-23589, dated February 4, and in the News Digest on February 6.

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## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

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### ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission granted accelerated approval of proposed rule changes filed under Rule 19b-4 by The Chicago Board Options, Pacific Stock and Philadelphia Stock Exchanges (SR-CBOE-84-22, SR-CBOE-85-1 [partial approval], SR-PSE-85-2, and SR-Phlx-84-26) to amend their rules and policies concerning exercise prices for stock indexes and individual stock options. The CBOE also filed a proposed rule change (SR-CBOE-85-1) to permit: (1) the addition to series of individual stock options until the first day of the month in which the series expires, and until the fifth business day prior to the series expiration in unusual market conditions; and (2) strike price intervals of \$2.50 for individual stock options with underlying stock prices of less than \$25. 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## TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

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### ACF INDUSTRIES, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 19 to request a hearing on an application by ACF Industries, Inc. under Section 310(b)(1)(ii) of the Trust Indenture Act of 1939. The application declares that the trusteeship of Mercantile-Safe Deposit and Trust Company under the following agreement and a certificate is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify Mercantile from acting as trustee: an Equipment Trust Agreement dated March 20, 1973, under which \$9,500,000 principal amount of Series B Equipment Trust Certificates are currently outstanding; and a second Equipment Trust Certificate dated December 21, 1984, under which \$63 million aggregate principal amount is outstanding.
