RULE 205-3 PROPOSED FOR COMMENT

The Commission proposes for public comment Rule 205-3 under the Investment Company Act of 1940. The proposed rule would permit registered investment advisers, under certain conditions, to enter into advisory contracts with certain clients providing for compensation based on the capital gains or capital appreciation in a client's account. Comments should be submitted in triplicate to John Wheeler, Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, 450 Fifth Street, NW, Washington, DC 20549. Comments must be received by May 31 and should refer to File No. S7-11-35. All submissions will be available for public inspection at the Commission's Public Reference Room. (Rel. IA-961)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

FIRST STATE FINANCIAL GRANTED CONTINGENT REGISTRATION AS INVESTMENT ADVISER

The Commission granted First State Financial, Inc. (FSF), a Tulsa brokerage firm, contingent registration as an investment adviser. FSF was formerly registered in that capacity. However, in 1979, under offers of settlement that the Commission accepted in prior administrative proceedings, FSF's advisory registration was revoked, and Sidney I. Shupack, the firm's president and principal stockholder, was barred from association with any investment adviser.

The Commission determined that FSF's prior disciplinary history did not require that its application for registration be denied at this time, particularly in light of certain limitations on its activities to which FSF agreed. However, the Commission provided that FSF's registration would not be effective unless a subsequent application by Shupack for association with FSF as an investment adviser is granted. It further provided that, if FSF's registration does become effective, it would be subject to the restrictions to which FSF as agreed. (Rel. IA-959)

REGISTRATION OF BOUNTIFUL REGISTRAR AND TRANSFER CO. REVOKED

The Commission issued an order instituting public administrative proceedings under Section 17A(c)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Bountiful Registrar and Transfer Co., a registered transfer agent, located in Bountiful, Utah. Simultaneously with the institution of the proceedings, the Commission accepted Bountiful Registrar's Offer of Settlement in which it, without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations and findings, consented to an order providing for the findings of violations and the sanctions imposed.

On the basis of the Order for Proceedings and the Offer of Settlement, the Commission found that Bountiful Registrar wilfully violated Section 17(A)(d) of the Exchange Act and Rule 17Ad-7 in that it failed to: maintain each cancelled share and accompanying documentation respecting the securityholder records of New Star Corp., a Delaware corporation; and obtain a written agreement from New Star to the effect that the securityholder records received from Bountiful Registrar would be maintained, preserved and made available to the Commission for examination. Based on the above findings and Offer of Settlement, Bountiful Registrar's registration with the Commission as a transfer agent was revoked. (Rel. 34-21821)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

LEONARD ZARETSKY ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on March 8 the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Leonard Zaretsky, a defendant in SEC v. Mason Benson, et al., enjoining him from further violations of Sections 10(b) and 13(b)(2)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 10b-5 and 13b2-1. Zaretsky consented to the Final Judgment without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations.

The Commission, in its complaint, alleged that Mason Benson, former president and chief executive officer of Empire of Carolina, Inc., a public company, diverted more than \$400,000 from Empire by a variety of means prior to his resignation in 1982. Among other things, the Commission alleged that Benson required Empire's outside sales representatives, including Zaretsky, to pay kickbacks from their commissions to Benson. All the defendants in the action except Benson have consented to injunctive relief and, in some cases, disgorgement. (SEC v. Mason Benson, et al., SDNY, Docket No. 84 Civ. 2263). (LR-10697)

THOMAS W. REID, OTHERS PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The New York and Fort Worth Regional Offices announced that on February 28 Judge John F. Keenan, U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, signed Final Judgments by Consent against Thomas W. Reid and Peter Vito; and on February 25, Judge Keenan signed a Final Judgment by Consent against B & M Investments, Inc. permanently enjoining them from further violations of the antifraud and margin provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

The Judgment against Reid, among other things, requires him to pay \$124,700 to City Securities Corporation, a brokerage firm headquartered in Indianapolis, Indiana, and \$35,000 to E.F. Hutton & Company, Inc., where the Commission alleged that Reid and co-defendant Rogers purchased First City Properties, Inc. common stock and options without intending to make payment.

As security, Reid conveyed to the Commission liens on a ship called Mardi Gras I located at Green Cove Springs, Florida and on his Texas ranch.

The defendants must present a copy of the Judgment to any brokerage firm with which they intend to do business, to any bank to which they pledge securities, and to any delivery versus payment agent. (SEC v. Thomas W. Reid, et al., 85 Civil 1123 [JFK] SDNY). (LR-10698)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved proposed rule changes filed under Rule 19b-4 by The National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc.: (SR-NASD-82-28) to delete Article I, Section 13 of the NASD's By-Laws. This section has been replaced by the NASD's Code of Procedure. (Rel. 34-21841); (SR-NASD-84-23) which modifies the NASD's Code of Procedure by creating a Market Surveillance Committee and specifying that committee's operating procedure. (Rel. 34-21842); (SR-NASD-84-14) which codifies and revises generally the NASD's By-Laws. The proposed amendments: codify existing interpretations of the NASD's Board of Governors; conform the By-Laws' language to changes in the Act made by the Securities Acts Amendments of 1975; and eliminate or modify obsolete provisions of the By-Laws. (Rel. 34-21843); (SR-NASD-84-29) to amend Schedule A under Article III of its By-Laws by adding a new section, Section 11, that will authorize the NASD to impose and collect compensatory charges to cover the cost of data and NASD publications provided, upon request, to members of the public. (Rel. 34-21850)
