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## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

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### OWEN V. KANE SUSPENDED

Chief Administrative Law Judge Warren E. Blair issued an initial decision suspending Owen V. Kane, a securities salesman employed in Minneapolis, Minnesota, from association with a broker or dealer for six months.

Judge Blair found that Kane had wilfully violated Section 5 of the Securities Act of 1933 in the offer and sale of 150,000 shares of unregistered stock of Grandma Lee's Inc., a Canadian corporation.

### DENNIS RUPPERT BARRED IN DRYSDALE MATTER

The Commission barred Dennis Ruppert, of Teaneck, New Jersey, from association with a broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment adviser or investment company. The sanction was imposed in settled administrative proceedings based upon Ruppert's recent Drysdale related state conviction for securities fraud and his having been enjoined from committing federal securities fraud and aiding and abetting the broker-dealer recordkeeping provisions of the securities laws.

Ruppert was comptroller of the now defunct Drysdale Securities Corporation (DSC) when that entity was a registered broker-dealer and member of the New York Stock Exchange. DSC, in February 1982, spun-off Drysdale Government Securities, Inc. (DGS), the government securities dealer run by David Heuwetter that collapsed on May 17, 1982, causing losses of about \$290 million to two large New York City banks. Ruppert's participation in the massive Drysdale fraud consisted primarily of falsifying and altering DSC's books and records to hide its government securities positions and then to facilitate establishment of DGS and fraudulently represent it as a solvent dealer.

On December 28, 1984, the Commission also barred Joseph V. Ossorio, formerly Ruppert's superior and Chairman of DSC, and Edward Davis, formerly Ruppert's subordinate. (Rel. 34-21857)

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## CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

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### DAVID HEUWETTER SENTENCED IN DRYSDALE CASE

The New York Regional Office and the U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of New York announced that on March 15 U.S. District Judge Morris E. Lasker sentenced David J. Heuwetter of New York City to three years imprisonment, to be followed by four years probation with 200 hours of community service per year, for his role in Drysdale Government Securities, which collapsed in May 1982 with almost \$300 million in losses, and for tax violations. The sentence followed Heuwetter's earlier plea of guilty to conspiracy and securities and tax fraud. Heuwetter fraudulently traded billions of dollars in government securities while the firms he represented were insolvent because of massive, hidden short positions. Also on March 15, Heuwetter was sentenced in New York State Supreme Court, on related charges, to three years imprisonment, to run concurrently with the federal sentence. (U.S. v. David J. Heuwetter, 84 Cr. 188, SDNY). (LR-10708)

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## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### EQUITABLE LIFE FINANCING CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 19 to request a hearing on an application filed by Equitable Life Financing Corporation for an order exempting it from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-14436 - March 26)

## SMA LIFE ASSURANCE COMPANY

An order has been issued exempting SMA Life Assurance Company, several separate accounts of the Company (Accounts), registered as open-end management investment companies, SMA Investment Trust, and SMA Equities, Inc. (together, Applicants), from Section 17(a) of the Investment Company Act to permit a proposed reorganization of the Accounts. The order also permits certain transactions in furtherance of the proposed reorganization and exempts Applicants from Sections 26(a)(2)(C) and 27(c) of the Act to permit deductions of certain charges from the Accounts. 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## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC SYSTEM

An order has been issued authorizing New England Electric System (NEES), a registered holding company, to issue and sell up to \$40 million of short-term notes to banks through March 31, 1987. (Rel. 35-23641 - March 26)

An order has also been issued authorizing a proposal by NEES and four of its subsidiaries whereby the subsidiaries will issue and sell short-term notes to banks and commercial paper and borrow on open account from the system money pool, through March 31, 1987, in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$78 million outstanding at any one time. (Rel. 35-23642 - March 26)

### MIDDLE SOUTH ENERGY, INC.

An order has been issued authorizing Middle South Energy, Inc. (MSE), subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc., to enter into one or more agreements through December 31, 1985 to make fixed interest rate payments on a certain amount of an outstanding loan agreement debt of \$378 million. MSE would receive floating interest rate payments on the same amount from a counterparty. (Rel. 35-23643 - March 26)

Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of March 25. (Rel. 34-21890)
