RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

AMENDMENTS TO RULE 12a-6 ADOPTED

The Commission adopted amendments to Rule 12a-6 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The amendments exempt from the registration provisions of Section 12(a) of the Exchange Act stocks underlying exchange traded options that are quoted on the National Association of Securities Dealers Automated Quotations System. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

RESEARCH RESOURCES, INC. AND SWISSOIL CORPORATION NAMED IN REPORTING VIOLATIONS COMPLAINT

The New York Regional Office filed a civil injunctive action on May 9 in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York against Research Resources, Inc. (RRI) and Swissoil Corporation, related New York City companies. The complaint alleges violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws and seeks a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Relief.

The complaint alleges that both RRI, formerly Burel Enterprises, Inc., and Swissoil failed to file Annual Reports on Form 10-K for fiscal years ending July 31 and April 30, 1984, respectively. The complaint also alleges that Swissoil both failed to file a Form SR reporting on its use of proceeds from its November 1983 registered public offering, and filed a misleading Form 8-K in June 1984 concerning a control change. Previously, on December 10, 1984, the Commission suspended trading in Burel securities due to a lack of current company information and unusual market activity.

The Commission requests that the Court order both RRI and Swissoil to file their delinquent reports, order Swissoil to correct its inaccurate and misleading Form 8-K, and enjoin the defendants from further violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws. (SEC v. Research Resources, Inc., et al., 85 Civ. 3536, ADS, SDNY). (LR-10749)

CIVIL ACTION FILED AGAINST COMSERV CORPORATION, OTHERS

The Commission filed a civil action on May 9 against Comserv Corporation, Richard P. Daly, Theodore Priem, William Gilster and Thomas A. Johnson, all former officers, directors or employees of Comserv and located in or around Minneapolis, Minnesota, variously alleging violations of the antifraud, reporting, internal accounting controls and books and records provisions of the securities laws. Without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations, Comserv, Daly, Priem and Gilster consented to the Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction.

The complaint alleges that Comserv, Daly, Priem, Johnson and Gilster, singly and in concert, employed devices, schemes and artifices in order to materially overstate Comserv's revenues and earnings before taxes for the years ended December 31, 1981 and 1982. The complaint also alleges that as a result of these practices, Comserv overstated its income before taxes for 1981 and 1982 by approximately \$485,000 (15%) and \$3,139,600 (600%), respectively. The complaint further alleges that in 1983, the defendants participated in a scheme first to conceal the overstatement of revenue and later to contain the extent to which the overstatement was disclosed. (SEC v. Comserv Corporation, et al., USDC DMN). (LR-10750)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

EDMOND A. TIERNO SENTENCED - RESTITUTION ORDERED

The Philadelphia Branch Office and the U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania announced that on April 12 Edmond A. Tierno of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania was sentenced to six months in jail, five years' probation, and ordered to pay restitution of \$612,000 in his participation in the offer and sale of Chris-Mond Corporation securities.

Tierno was indicted on December 21, 1982 on seven counts of mail fraud, nine counts of securities fraud, one count of wire fraud, 17 counts of perjury and two counts of interstate transportation of money taken by fraud in the offer and sale of Chris-Mond securities. He subsequently pleaded guilty to one count of securities fraud and three other counts of the indictment. Tierno was president and chief executive officer of Chris-Mond.

Tierno and Chris-Mond were previously the subjects of a Commission injunctive action in which both were permanently enjoined from the registration and antifraud violations of the securities laws. (U.S. v. Edmond A. Tierno, USDC EDPA, Criminal Action No. 82-427). (LR-10748)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

AMERICAN PENSION INVESTORS TRUST

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 3 to request a hearing on an application by American Pension Investors Trust (Trust) and American Pension Distributors, Inc. for an order exempting them from Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 22(c) and 22(d) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 22c-1 to permit assessment (and waiver) of a contingent deferred sales load on certain redemptions of Trust shares. (Rel. IC-14506 - May 8)

BENHAM CALIFORNIA TAX-FREE TRUST

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 3 to request a hearing on an application filed by Benham California Tax-Free Trust and Benham National Tax-Free Trust for an order exempting them from the provisions of Section 12(d)(3) of the Investment Company Act to permit them to acquire rights to sell their portfolio securities to brokers or dealers.
