#### INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

OPPENHEIMER PROGRAM SEEKS ORDER. The SEC has issued an order under the Investment Company Act (Release C-6055) giving interested persons until June 4 to request a hearing upon an application of Oppenheimer ystematic Capital Accumulation Program ("OSCAP"), New York unit investment trust, of which Oppenheimer sanagement Corporation ("Management Company") is the sponsor and depositor, for exemption from provisions of Section 22(d) of the Act to the extent that such provisions require investment company securities to be sold at the same public offering price to all persons. Management Company offers two redeemable securities issued by OSCAP--a single payment plan which contemplates a single investment of \$500 or more and a systematic capital accumulation program which contemplates regular monthly payments over a 10- or 15-year period. Since the initial offering of these securities in 1962, the maximum amount deducted as sales charges has been 50% of first year's payments. Recently, the West German government enacted a law which limits the amount of sales charges that can be deducted from the first year's payments under periodic payment plans to not more than 1/3 of each payment. In order to continue to sell OSCAP securities in Germany, Management Company proposes to reduce the sales charge on first year payments on all of OSCAP's systematic capital accumulation programs to an amount that, when added to the monthly custodian fee, would not exceed 1/3 of the first year's monthly payments, and by increasing the sales charge deducted from payments after the first year's payment, to such amount that the aggregate sales charge over the full period of the plans sold in Germany would be the same as the aggregate sales charge over the full period of the plans sold in the United States.

<u>SEILON RECEIVES ORDER</u>. The SEC has issued an order under the Investment Company Act (Release IC-6056) temporarily exempting Seilon, Inc., <u>Toledo, Ohio</u>, from Section 7 of the Act until its application of February 20 for an order declaring it to be primarily engaged in a business or businesses other than that of an investment company is acted upon by the Commission.

#### COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTION

PROFESSIONAL SERVICE, OTHERS INDICTED. The SEC Fort Worth Regional Office announced May 12 (LR-4608) the return of an indictment by a Federal court jury in Alexandria, La., charging violations of the Securities Act anti-fraud provisions by William M. Campbell, New Orleans, Walter H. Johnson, Monroe, Charlie F. Parker, New Orleans, and Professional Service Corporation, in the offer and sale of securities of Professional Service.

#### SECURITIES ACT REGISTRATIONS

ST. REGIS PAPER SHARES IN REGISTRATION. St. Regis Paper Company, 150 East 42nd St., New York, N. Y. 10017, filed a registration statement (File 2-37398) with the SEC on May 15 seeking registration of 500,000 shares of common stock, to be offered pursuant to the company's 1970 Stock Option Plan.

CONSULTING TECHNOLOGY TO SELL STOCK. Consulting Technology, Inc., 8117 Old York Rd., Elkins Park, Pa. 19117, filed a registration statement (File 2-37399) with the SEC on May 15 seeking registration of 250,000 shares of common stock, to be offered for public sale at \$2 per share. The offering is to be made through underwriters headed by L. C. Wegard & Co., Inc., U. S. Highway 130 & Levitt Parkway, Willingboro, N. J. 08046, which will receive a 20¢ per share commission. The company has agreed to pay the Wegard firm \$10,000 for expenses and to sell it, at 1¢ per warrant, six-year warrants to purchase 25,000 shares, exercisable after one year at \$2 per share.

The company was organized in February to offer an integration of management consulting and financial services. Of the net proceeds of its stock sale, \$350,000 will be used to capitalize CTI Securities Corporation, the company's investment banking subsidiary; the balance will be added to the company's working capital and may be used, in part, to defray any negative cash flow incurred during the period between commencement of projects and compensation therefor. The company has outstanding 500,000 common shares (with a 29¢ per share net tangible book value), of which David Fields, president, and Sheldon S. Somerman, vice president, own 29% each.

SCOTT PAPER TO SELL DEBENTURES. Scott Paper Company, Scott Plaza, Philadelphia, Pa., filed a registration statement (File 2-37400) with the SEC on May 15 seeking registration of \$100,000,000 of sinking fund debentures, due 2000, to be offered for public sale through underwriters headed by Smith, Barney & Co. Incorporated, 20 Broad St., New York, N. Y., and two other firms. The interest rate, offering price and underwriting terms are to be supplied by amendment.

OVER

The company is principally engaged in the manufacture and sale of a variety of packaged paper products and printing, converting and specialty papers. Net proceeds of its debenture sale will be used principally to reduce outstanding commercial paper (\$40,725,000 at March 28) and to refund long term indebtedness maturing during the balance of 1970 (\$47,311,000 at March 28); the balance will be added to the company's general funds and used for similar purposes. Proceeds of such indebtedness were used for general corporate purposes including additions and improvements to existing facilities, construction or purchase of new facilities, the purchase of timber resources, acquisition of common shares as treasury shares and working capital. In addition to indebtedness and preferred stock, the company has outstanding 34,459,910 common shares. Harrison F. Duming is board chairman, Paul C. Baldwin, vice chairman and Charles D. Dickey, Jr., president.

AMERICAN AIRLINES TO SELL LOAN CERTIFICATES. American Airlines, Inc. ("American"), 633 Third Ave., New York, N. Y., filed a registration statement (File 2-37401) with the SEC on May 15 seeking registration of \$78,500,000 of guaranteed loan certificates, Series A, due 1988, to be offered for public sale through underwriters headed by Lazard Freres & Co., 44 Wall St., New York, N. Y. 10005. The interest rate, offering price and underwriting terms are to be supplied by amendment.

American is a scheduled airline serving 48 domestic cities in 20 states and the District of Columbia, as well as Toronto, Canada, and Mexico City and Acapulco, Mexico. Net proceeds of its sale of loan certificates will be used toward payment of the first five of 16 Boeing 747-123 jet aircraft ordered from The Boeing Company, to be purchased through a lease arrangement. In addition to indebtedness and preferred stock, the company has outstanding 20,281,000 common shares. George A. Spater is board chairman and president.

HANOVER PLANWING PROPOSES OFFERING. Hanover Planning Company, Inc., 8 Hanover St., New York, N. Y. 10004, filed a registration statement (File 2-37402) with the SEC on May 15 seeking registration of \$7,500,000 of interests in its 1970 Hanover Year End Drilling Fund, Series 4 (the "Program"), to be offered for public sale in 1,500 units and at \$5,000 per unit (with a minimum investment of \$10,000). The offering is to be made on a best efforts basis by Hornblower & Weeks-Hemphill, Noyes, 8 Hanover St., New York, N. Y. 10004, as agent, and by other MASD members appointed by Hornblower; Hornblower will receive a 3% selling commission plus a portion of the company's overriding royalty; it will pay participating NASD members a 5% selling commission. The Program was organized to provide for participation in oil and gas drilling ventures under the administration, supervision and accounting by the company. William G. Maloney is board chairman and W. F. West president.

PENROC OIL PROPOSES OFFERING. Penroc Oil Corporation ("general partner"), 406 Building of the Southwest, Midland, Tex. 79701, filed a registration statement (File 2-37404) with the SEC on May 15 seeking registration of \$5,000,000 of limited partnership interests in Penroc Oil and Gas Funds, Ltd. (a series of five limited partnerships), to be offered for public sale in minimum amounts of \$5,000. No underwriting is involved; participating NASD members will receive up to a 12% selling commission. Each partnership will be formed to acquire oil and gas leases and to explore for and develop oil and gas and associated minerals thereon. John B. Castle, president of the general partner, and H. Brace Wigzell, secretary-treasurer, own 11.81% each and Castle and Wigzell (a general partnership owned equally by John Castle and Brace Wigzell) 76.19% of the outstanding common stock of the general partner.
