COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

ATTORNEY FELLOW PROGRAM TO BEGIN AT COMMISSION IN JULY. An Attorney Fellow Program designed to appoint qualified attorneys to the staff of the SEC was announced today by G. Bradford Cook, Commission Chairman. Appointments would be made from attorneys who have practical experience in the fields of corporate and securities law and litigation. They would be appointed annually, beginning July 1, 1973 for 2-year renewable terms. Mr. Cook, in a recent speech before a Practicing Law Institute Conference, said in outlining the concept, "the Commission will benefit from the infusion of new ideas and new legal approaches. The participating attorneys will find themselves involved in the substantive legal problems confronting us."

Candidates will be appointed by a committee composed of the Chairman of the Commission, the General Counsel of the Commission, and a SEC Division Director. Applicants should contact the General Counsel, Securities and Exchange Commission, Washington, D. C. 20549. (Rel. U-441)

DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDING

TWO FIRMS REVOKED, OFFICER BARRED. The SEC has revoked the broker-dealer registration of Charles T. Johnson, Inc., St. Petersburg, Fla., and the investment adviser registration of Kehr-Johnson, Inc., and barred Charles T. Johnson, president and vice president, respectively, of the two firms, from association with any broker-dealer, investment adviser or otherwise engaging in the securities business. The action was based on findings that respondents during the period 1971-1973 had violated or aided and abetted violations of the antifraud, hypothecation, net capital, recordkeeping and reporting provisions of the securities acts. The respondents consented to the above findings and sanctions, without admitting or denying the allegations in the order for proceedings. (Rel. 34-10060)

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

MOORE, KELLOGG AND SPARKS, INC. ENJOINED. The SEC Denver Regional Office announced that on March 26 the Federal court in Nebraska permanently enjoined the following from violations of, and/or aiding and abetting violations of, the registration, antifraud and antimanipulative provisions of the Federal securities laws in the offer and sale of notes and evidences of indebtedness of certain Arizona real estate development companies: Moore, Kellogg and Sparks, Inc. (MKS), a registered broker-dealer located in Omaha, Nebr., Roland S. Moore, Omaha, Nebr., Donald W. Sparks, Omaha, Nebr., Kenneth H. Kellogg, North Platte, Nebr., Elary Rinehart, Wayne, Nebr., Edward J. Sarpan, Omaha, Nebr., all of whom are officers, directors, stockholders and registered representatives of MKS, C. Michael Holt, Omaha, Nebr., Kermit O. Pearson, Cozad, Nebr., Herbert L. Heckman, Hastings, Nebr., Melvin L. Trebold, Campbell, Nebr., Van J. Vopat, Kearney, Nebr., W. Clinton Myers, Hastings, Nebr., and Ellis Friend, York, Nebr., all of whom are registered representatives of MKS. The defendants consented to the court order without admitting or denying the allegations. (LR-5818)

PERICLES CONSTANTINOU AND PROVIDENT SECURITIES INDICTED. The SEC today announced that on March 28 a special Federal grand jury in New York indicted Pericles Constantinou and Provident Securities, Inc., a New York City broker-dealer firm. Named as a co-conspirator but not as a defendant was Robert R. Hagopian, who at the time of the violative activities was an investment adviser to the Performance Plus Fund, Ltd. The indictment charged Constantinou and Provident Securities with engaging in a scheme to illegally compensate Hagopian for causing the Performance Plus Fund to purchase securities designated by Constantinou. In order to conceal these payments, Constantinou caused Provident to establish nominee accounts for Hagopian and the purported profits from these transactions were directed to Hagopian at the time of the purchases by the Performance Plus Fund. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MCI COMMUNICATIONS CORP. The SEC has issued an order permitting a proposed transaction whereby Baker, Fentress & Company (B-F), Chicago non-diversified, closed-end management investment company, would transfer to MCI Communications Corporation (Micom) of Washington, D. C., stock held by B-F in certain Micom affiliates, together with options to purchase additional stock in such affiliates and commit itself to make certain loans to Micom, in exchange for shares of Micom stock, a warrant to purchase additional Micom stock, and the assumption by Micom of certain loan obligations of B-F. AMERICAN RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT CORP. The SEC has issued an order declaring that American Research and Development Corporation of Southport, Conn., has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-7746)

AMERICAN ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT CORP. The SEC has issued an order declaring that American Enterprise Development Corporation, of Southport, Conn., has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-7747)

MASS. MUTUAL LIFE INSURANCE CO. The SEC has issued an order permitting MassMutual Corporate Investors, Inc. and its investment adviser, the Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Company, to invest in and share equally, a package of securities consisting of a new issue of senior notes and debentures of Aberdeen Manufacturing Corp. in the total principal amount of \$3,215,000. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM. The SEC has issued a notice giving interested persons until April 30 to request a hearing upon a proposal of The Columbia Gas System, Inc., Wilmington, Del. holding company, to issue and sell up to \$195,000,000 of short-term notes (bank loans and commercial paper) to banks and dealers in commercial paper. Columbia has requested exception from competitive bidding requirements in the sale of the commercial paper. (Rel. 35-17920)
