## COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

PUBLIC REFERENCE ROOM TO RELOCATE. Beginning Monday, November 12, the Public Reference Room will be located in Room 6101 at 1100 L Street, N.W., Washington, D. C. The visiting hours will remain 9:00 - 4:30. Though the reference room will not be closed at all during this period, the timeliness of service may be impaired the week before and the week after relocating.

Written requests for documents should still be addressed to the Public Reference Room, Securities and Exchange Commission, 500 North Capitol Street, Washington, D.C. 20549.

FAIRFIELD GENERAL TRADING SUSPENDED. Over-the-counter trading in the securities of Fairfield General, Inc., of Fairfield, New Jersey was suspended for a ten-day period beginning October 31 and terminating at midnight (EST) on November 9, 1973.

The Commission initiated the suspension because Fairfield has failed to comply with the reporting provisions of the Exchange Act. Fairfield is delinquent in filing its annual report on Form 10-K for 1972 and its quarterly reports on Form 10-Q for the first two quarters of 1973. (Rel. 34-10470)

UNITED GILBRALTAR TRADING HALTED. Exchange and over-the-counter trading in the securities of United Gibraltar Corporation of Scottsdale, Arizona was suspended for one ten-day period beginning October 31 and terminating at midnight (EST) on November 9, 1973.

United represents that, through wholly-owned subsidiaries, it develops, operates and sells controlled environment agricultural units.

The suspension was initiated because of questions raised concerning the adequacy and accuracy of financial information about United available to the public. The certified public accountant's opinion on United's financial statement in its 10-K annual report for the fiscal year ended April 30, 1973 stated that United did not follow accepted principles of accounting on a consistent basis during that fiscal year. In addition, in footnotes to financial statements in the same annual report the accuracy of United's liabilities, cash receipts, and cash disbursements is questioned by the CPA because of the lack of controls and the incompleteness of the financial records of United. ## DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDING

CAPITAL COUNSELLORS, CAPITAL ADVISORS AND FORMER ASSOCIATE SANCTIONED. The SEC has revoked the broker-dealer registration of Capital Counsellors, Inc., of New York, and barred Capital Advisors, Inc. from association with any broker or dealer. The action was based on findings that during the period 1967-1971 the firm had violated or aided and abetted violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of Counsellors' Government Bond Plan, an investment contract, and also of net capital and recordkeeping requirements, and had failed reasonably to supervise others with a view to preventing violations by such others. The receiver for both firms consented to the above findings and sanctions, without admitting or denying the allegations in the order for proceedings. (Rel. 34-10455)

In a related action, the Commission barred Sherman Bush, South Chatham, Mass., from association with any broker, dealer or investment adviser. The action was based on findings that in 1970-71 Bush had been associated with Counsellors and had violated the registration and antifraud provisions in the offer and sale of Counsellors' Bond Plan. Bush, without admitting or denying the charges, consented to the findings and the sanction. (Rel. 34-10456)

ROBERT E. PAGE SUSPENDED. An order has been issued suspending Robert E. Page, of Jamestown, New York, from association with any broker-dealer for 45 days. The sanction was based on findings that, during the period May 1972 to February 1973, Page violated registration provisions of the Securities Act in the offer and sale of unregistered common stock of International Scanning Devices, Inc.

The Commission's order was issued under an offer of settlement in which Page, without admitting or denying the charges against him, consented to the above findings and the indicated sanction. (Rel. 34-10457)

## COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

CENTENNIAL INVESTMENT ASSOCIATES, OTHERS ENJOINED. The Denver Regional Office announced that on October 24 the Federal court in El Paso, Tex. permanently enjoined Centennial Investment Associates, Inc. of El Paso, Texas and Frank Annunizato of El Paso, Texas, and preliminary enjoined Bankers Trust Company, Inc. of Albuquerque, New Mexico, Ernie W. Totten of El Paso, Texas, Donald W. Chave, William Annos and Arthur Hertzberg of Phoenix, Arizona and Jerry McFarland of Denver, Colorado, from violating the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The Court also entered findings of fact and conclusions of law in support of the preliminary injunction. Defendants Centennial Investment Associates, and Annunizato consented to the court order without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint. (LR-6116)

CHARLES T. DOIAN SENTENCED. The Denver Regional Office announced that on October 25 a Federal Judge in Denver sentenced Charles T. Dolan to 6 months imprisonment to be followed by 4 years probation after he accepted Dolan's plea to one count of securities fraud in the sale and distribution of stock of United States Investment Corporation on October 3, 1973. ROBERT L. TRIPPET ENJOINED. The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on October 25 the Federal District Court at Tulsa, Oklahoma permanently enjoined Robert S. Trippet of Tulsa. Trippet was enjoined from violations of various provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of securities of Home-Stake Production Company and the 1964 through 1972 Program Operating Corporation. Trippet consented to the court order without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint. (LR-6118)

GULF INVESTING CORP., JAMES MIDKIFF RESTRAINED. The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on October 25 the Federal court in Tampa, Fla. temporarily restrained James E. Midkiff and Gulf Investment Corporation, both of St. Petersburg, from violating the anti-fraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of Gulf's common stock. The order, which will expire on November 20, 1973, prohibits any withdrawal of Gulf's assets not necessary to current operations of Gulf's two funeral homes in Pinellas County, Fla., and restrains any attachment proceedings for the duration of the order. COMPLAINT NAMES VIP PHONE OF DELAWARE, INC., PETER JAMES, OTHERS. The Washington Regional Office announced that on October 25 a complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court, Wilmington, Delaware, seeking to enjoin VIP Phone of Delaware, Inc., National Enterprises, Inc., Delaware Securities, Inc., International Magfilm, Inc. and Peter James, all of Ocean View, Delaware, from violations of the anti-fraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of the common stock of VIP Phone of Delaware, Inc. and International Magfilm, Inc. (LR-6120)

## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM. An order has been issued authorizing The Columbia Gas System, a registered holding company, to sell \$50,000,000 of 10-year promissory notes to a group of commercial banks, the proceeds to be used to complete the 1973 capital expenditure program of Columbia's subsidiary companies. Independent Investor Protective League requested that a hearing be held on the ground that competitive bidding should be required for sale of the notes. The Commission denied the request for a hearing because the sale of the proposed notes is automatically exempt by rule from competitive bidding. (Rel. 35-18146)

INDIANA & MICHIGAN ELECTRIC COMPANY. A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 29 to request a hearing on a proposal of Indiana & Michigan Electric Co. (I&M), subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to sell \$40,000,000 of first mortgage bonds and 300,000 shares of Cumulative Preferred Stock at competitive bidding. I&M will use the net proceeds to pay a like principal amount of unsecured short-term indebtedness and for other corporate purposes. (Rel. 35-18147)

METROPOLITAN EDISON COMPANY. A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 20 to request a hearing on an application of Metropolitan Edison Company, subsidiary of General Public Utilities Corporation, to sell \$20 million of first mortgage bonds and \$20 million of debentures at competitive bidding. (Rel. 35-18148)

## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ROYAL BUSINESS FUNDS CORPORATION. An order has been issued declaring that Royal Business Funds Corporation, of New York, has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-8053)

INVESTMENT COMPANY OF AMERICA. An order has been issued granting the Investment Company of America, Los Angeles mutual fund, an exemption from certain provisions of the Act to permit a public offering of the Fund's shares in Japan to Japanese and other non-United States nationals. (Rel. IC-8056)

MOSHER, INC. A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 23 to request a hearing on an application of Mosher, Inc. of Houston, Texas for an order granting it a temporary exemption from all provisions of the Act. Mosher proposes to merge with American General Convertible Securities, Inc., a registered closed-end investment company, and requests an order which will terminate on the later of January 1, 1974, or 20 days following the date of such order. MUTUAL SECURITIES FUND OF BOSTON. A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 16 to request a hearing on an application to amend an order of the Commission dated August 31, 1973 (Rel. IC-7968) to extend from October 31, 1973 to December 31, 1973 the period in which a meeting of the holders of the outstanding voting securities must be held to elect trustees of Mutual Securities Fund of Boston. DEAN WITTER & CO. A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 19 to request a hearing on an application of Dean Witter & Co., Inc., for an order exempting it and its co-underwriters from Section 30(f) of the Act in respect of their transactions incident to the proposed distribution of shares of common stock of Golden Gate Income Securities, Inc., a registered closed-end investment company.
