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## COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

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### CONSUMER AFFAIRS ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING

### INTERPRETIVE RELEASE

The Commission issued an interpretive release to amend the interpretive guidance contained in Financial Reporting Release No. 28 (FR 28) that addresses the accounting for substantive repossessions of collateral. This release conforms the interpretive guidance in FR 28 to the requirements of Statement of Financial Accounting Standards No. 114, "Accounting by Creditors for Impairment of a Loan," which was issued by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) in May 1993. 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## ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

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### NASD DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST ADAMS SECURITIES, INC., JAMES ADAMS AND DANIEL PERRY MODIFIED

The Commission has modified NASD disciplinary action against Adams Securities, Inc., of Las Vegas, Nevada, James William Adams, the firm's chief executive officer, and Daniel Bruce Perry, the firm's secretary-treasurer. The Commission agreed with the NASD's findings that from August through October 1989 respondents charged customers excessive and fraudulent markups ranging from 11% to 133% in numerous sales of two over-the-counter securities. The Commission also found, as did the NASD, that the firm and Adams failed to establish, maintain and enforce adequate supervisory procedures regarding markups.

The Commission recomputed the market price for the stocks at issue at the time of each retail sale, finding a lesser amount of violative markups. It accordingly reduced the joint and several fine assessed by the NASD against the firm and Adams, which the NASD had based on the amount of excessive markups, from \$600,000 to \$450,000. The Commission sustained the remaining NASD sanctions; censure of the firm, Adams and Perry; \$25,000 fines assessed against Adams and Perry; suspensions in all capacities of Adams for two years and Perry for one year; and the requirement that Perry requalify by examination for all NASD licenses. **RICHARD STAGG AND HIS WHOLLY-OWNED COMPANY, FERMETHANOL, INC., ENJOINED**

The Commission announced that on May 4 Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief were entered against defendants Richard Stagg (Stagg) and his wholly-owned company, Fermethanol, Inc., permanently enjoining them from future violations or aiding and abetting violations of the registration, antifraud and broker-dealer provisions of the federal securities laws. Additionally, Stagg was ordered to disgorge \$62,916, plus prejudgment interest, however, payment was waived based on his demonstrated financial inability to pay. The defendants consented to the entry of the Final Judgments without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations.

The Commission's complaint, filed August 20, 1992, alleged that the defendants participated in a scheme which raised approximately \$3 million from 240 investors residing in 28 states during a nationwide "cold call" campaign to sell interests in five unregistered limited partnerships. The complaint further alleged that the defendants either misrepresented or failed to state material facts concerning, among other things, the true financial condition of the corporations serving as general partners and the use of investor funds. **INTERNATIONAL QUARTER PHONES, INC. AND ITS FOUNDER AND PRESIDENT, HAROLD SENNA, PERMANENTLY ENJOINED**

The Commission announced that an Agreed Order of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief was entered against International Quarter Phones, Inc. (IQP) on April 6, 1994 and a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief was entered against Harold Michael Senna (Senna) on May 4, 1994. Without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations, the defendants consented to be enjoined from future violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws.

Senna was also ordered to disgorge specified items of personal property and the sum of \$540,708, provided, however, that payment of \$540,708 of the disgorgement be waived based on his demonstrated financial inability to pay. Disgorgement was also ordered for IQP in an amount to be determined at a later date.

The Commission's complaint alleged that the defendants raised approximately \$10 million from the sale of unregistered securities in the form of interests in coin-operated pay telephones to more than 3,000 investors located nationwide. The complaint further alleged that the defendants misrepresented and omitted to disclose material information concerning, among other things, the profitability and business prospects of IQP, the use of investor proceeds, and the fact that Senna had a criminal record. 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#### INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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#### HARTFORD LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY, ET AL.

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting Hartford Life Insurance Company (Hartford Life), Hartford Life Insurance Company/Putnam Capital Manager Trust Separate Account (Separate Account) and Hartford Equity Sales Company, Inc. from the provisions of Sections 26(a)(2)(C) and 27(c)(2) of the Act. The order provides exemptions to the extent necessary to permit the deduction of a mortality and expense risk charge from the assets of the Separate Account under certain flexible premium deferred variable annuity contracts issued by Hartford Life.
