CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

JAMES DALE DAUGHERTY ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on August 19 the Honorable Joel M. Flaum, U.S. District Court Judge for the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief against James Dale Daugherty of West Dundee, Illinois. The Judgment was entered after Daugherty was adjudged in default for his failure to answer, plead or otherwise defend in the action and after the Court considered the pleadings, affidavits and exhibits filed by the Commission.

The Judgment enjoins Daugherty from violating Sections 5(a), 5(c) and 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 promulgated thereunder, and Sections 203(a), 206(1) and 206(2) of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. The Judgment also orders Daugherty to provide to the Court, within 60 days of service upon him of the Judgment, accountings of all funds received from investors, any interests in oil and gas ventures he received, and all his assets and liabilities. (SEC v. James Dale Daugherty, et al., N.D. Ill., Civil Action No. 81 C 6583). (LR-9751)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

ADRIAN ANTONIU SENTENCED

The New York Regional Office announced that on August 11 Adrian Antoniu was sentenced by U.S. District Judge Charles E. Stewart to three months incarceration, three years probation and a \$5,000 fine for criminal violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. On November 13, 1980, Antoniu had pled guilty to a two-count information charging him with participating with four other defendants in a scheme to effect transactions in the securities of 17 companies on the basis of material, nonpublic information about impending takeovers of those companies. On February 3, 1981, a federal grand jury indicted the other four defendants, James Mitchell Newman, E. Jacques Courtois, Jr., Franklin Carniol and Constantine Spyropoulos on 27 counts of securities fraud, conspiracy to commit securities fraud, and mail fraud stemming from the same transactions. Newman was convicted on 15 counts of that indictment on May 21, 1982 and has been sentenced to one year and a day in jail and three years of probation and fined \$10,000. (U.S. v. James Mitchell Newman, et al., 82 Cr. 166, CSH, S.D.N.Y.). (LR-9750)
