## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PARHAM AND COMPANY, INC. AND  
ROBERT GERALD PARHAM, JR. CITED

The Commission has instituted public administrative proceedings pursuant to Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Parham and Company, Inc. (PCI), a registered broker-dealer located in Little Rock, Arkansas, and PCI's president, Robert Gerald Parham, Jr., also of Little Rock.

The Order for Proceedings alleges that from on or about June 2, 1980 to at least February 26, 1981, PCI and Parham violated the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Exchange Act. These violations are alleged to have occurred in connection with the offer, purchase and sale of municipal securities.

Specifically, the Order alleges that PCI and Parham issued confirmations of sales to customers for securities the customers had not ordered. The Order further alleges that PCI and Parham induced customers to purchase securities by agreeing that PCI would repurchase the same securities within a stated period of time. In connection with this activity, PCI and Parham failed to disclose that PCI did not have the financial capability to honor all of its agreements to repurchase securities. Finally, the Order alleges that on April 21, 1981, PCI and Parham were permanently enjoined from violations and aiding and abetting violations of the net capital, notification and recordkeeping provisions of the Exchange Act.

A hearing will be scheduled to take evidence on the allegations against PCI and Parham and to afford them an opportunity to present any defenses they may have. The purpose of the hearing is to determine whether the allegations against PCI and Parham are true and, if so, what, if any, remedial action would be appropriate and in the public interest. ## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

ORDERS OF PERMANENT INJUNCTION ENTERED  
AGAINST FIVE STAR ENERGY CORPORATION, OTHERS

The Houston Branch Office announced that on September 27 the Honorable William S. Sessions, U.S. District Judge for the Western District of Texas, entered Orders of Permanent Injunction against Five Star Energy Corporation, a publicly-held company based in California, and Charles W. Knight, Richard H. P. Padon, and Brenda B. Brandes, former Five Star officers and directors, all of San Antonio, Texas. The defendants consented to the entry of the Orders of Permanent Injunction without admitting or denying the allegations set forth in the Commission's complaint.

The Orders enjoined Five Star and Padon from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933, while Knight, Padon, and Five Star were enjoined from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Orders also enjoined the corporation, Knight, Padon and Brandes from violating and aiding and abetting violations of the periodic reporting provisions, and, with the exception of Padon, from violating and aiding and abetting violations of the proxy solicitation provisions of the Exchange Act. Finally, Five Star was required to provide an accounting of all monies owed to it by each of the other defendants to this action. (SEC v. **ORDER OF PERMANENT INJUNCTION BY DEFAULT ISSUED  
AGAINST STANDARD DREDGING CORPORATION**

The Houston Branch Office announced that on September 16 the Honorable Robert O'Connor, Jr. of the U.S. District Court, Southern District of Texas, issued an Order of Permanent Injunction by Default against Standard Dredging Corporation of Jersey City, New Jersey based upon Standard's failure to answer, plead or otherwise defend the complaint served on it on June 15, 1981. The Order enjoins Standard from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Court further ordered that Standard file with the Commission its delinquent Annual Reports on Form 10-K for its fiscal years ended December 31, 1979 and 1980, and its Quarterly Reports on Form 10-Q for its fiscal quarters ended March 31, June 30 and September 30, 1980, and March 31, 1981. Orders, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, have been issued on an application by Shearson Daily Tax-Free Dividend, Inc., and United Government Cash Fund, Inc., open-end, diversified, management investment companies, exempting them from the provisions of Section 2(a)(41) of the Act and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 thereunder, to the extent necessary to permit Shearson's price per share for purposes of sales, redemptions and repurchase to be calculated by using the amortized cost method of valuation; and to permit United Government to compute its net asset value per share using the amortized cost method of valuing portfolio securities.
