ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES AND
EXCHANGE COMMISSION

V. MALCOM CIPAR CITED

Public administrative proceedings have been instituted under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against V. Malcolm Cipar, formerly a registered representative with a registered broker-dealer, of Chicago, Illinois.

The Order of Proceedings alleges that while Cipar was employed at the broker-dealer, he wilfully violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer, purchase and sale of securities in that: he executed transactions in customers' accounts which he controlled, which transactions were excessive in view of the customers' financial resources, investment sophistication and investment objectives. Cipar also failed to inform his customers about the risks inherent in the short-term trading practices which he employed, and misrepresented to customers the status of their accounts in order to induce them to continue to allow him to buy and sell securities for their accounts; he further traded these customers' accounts on margin without their authorization; and he effected unauthorized discretionary trades in customers' accounts.

A hearing will be scheduled to take evidence on the allegations against Cipar and to afford him an opportunity to present any defenses he may have. The purpose of the hearing is to determine whether or not the allegations against Cipar are true, and if so, to decide what, if any, remedial action is necessary in the public interest. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES WALCO NATIONAL CORPORATION AND FREDERICK W. RICHMOND

The Commission announced on November 9 the filing of a civil injunctive action in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against Walco National Corporation and Frederick W. Richmond. The complaint alleges violations of the antifraud, proxy, tender offer and certain reporting provisions of the securities laws by Walco and Richmond.

The Commission's complaint alleges that beginning in or about 1977, Walco and Richmond, in Walco tender offer materials, proxy solicitation materials and annual and other reports, materially misrepresented Richmond's role in Walco business matters, Richmond's remuneration from Walco and transactions with Walco and the nature of the pension agreement between Walco and Richmond which became effective on December 31, 1978. In addition, the complaint alleges that Walco and Richmond filed false and misleading schedules pursuant to Section 13(d) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

Simultaneous with the filing of the complaint, Walco and Richmond, without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint, consented to the entry of Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction.

Walco, in settling this action, has agreed, among other things, to establish a committee of its board of directors to review any proposed transactions between Walco and Richmond, directly or indirectly. The committee is to be composed of two new directors to be appointed and a third director. Richmond, in settling this action, has agreed, among other things, to pay to Walco the sum of \$425,000, and to release the company from all further payments pursuant to the Pension Agreement. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

PAINE WEBBER RMA TAX-FREE FUND, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 30 to request a hearing on an application filed by Paine Webber RMA Tax-Free Fund, Inc. (Applicant), a no-load, open-end, diversified management investment company, for an order, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Act, exempting Applicant to the extent necessary (1) from the provisions of Section 2(a)(41) of the Act and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 thereunder to permit Applicant to compute its net asset value per share using the amortized cost method of valuation and (2) from the provisions of Section 12(d)(3) of the Act to permit Applicant to acquire rights to sell its portfolio securities to brokers or dealers. PHOENIX MUTUAL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 3 to request a hearing on an application filed by Phoenix Mutual Life Insurance Company, Phoenix Mutual Variable Accumulation Account, and Phoenix Equity Planning Corporation, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, exempting them from the provisions of Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 22(c), 22(e), 27(c)(1), 27(c)(2), and 27(d) of the Act and Rule 22c-1 thereunder to the extent necessary to permit the transactions described in the application. THE TRAVELERS INSURANCE COMPANY

An order has been issued on an application filed by The Travelers Insurance Company and The Travelers Fund MM for Variable Annuities, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Act, granting exemptions from the provisions of Sections 17(f), 22(c), 22(e), 26(a)(2), 27(c)(1), 27(c)(2), and 27(d) of the Act and Rule 17f-2 and 22c-1 thereunder and, pursuant to Section 11 of the Act, approving the terms of certain offers of exchange in connection with certain individual and group variable annuity contracts. PIA ASSET CASH TRUST

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 6 to request a hearing on an application filed by PIA Asset Cash Trust, registered under the Investment Company Act of 1940 as an open-end, diversified, management investment company, requesting an order, pursuant to Section 8(f) of the Act, declaring that PIA has ceased to be an investment company. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

TEXAS GAS TRANSMISSION CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 7 to request a hearing on an application by Texas Gas Transmission Corporation that it be declared not to be a gas utility company pursuant to Section 2(a)(4) of the Public Utility Holding Company Act of 1935. ENERGYNORTH, INC.

An order has been issued authorizing EnergyNorth, Inc., a New Hampshire corporation, to acquire the common stocks of two New Hampshire gas utility companies, Manchester Gas Company and Gas Service, Inc. (Rel. 35-22704 - Nov. 9)

NATIONAL FUEL GAS COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 2 to request a hearing on a proposal by National Fuel Gas Company (National), a registered holding company, and two of its subsidiaries, National Fuel Gas Supply Corporation and Penn-York Energy Corporation, whereby National will issue and sell at competitive bidding \$50 million of debentures. The proceeds from the sale will be loaned to the subsidiaries and evidenced by unsecured notes. Supply Corporation proposes to declare a cash dividend of \$18 million on its common stock held by National and Penn-York will repay notes held by National in the amount of \$22 million. Thereafter, National proposes to acquire from Penn-York shares of common stock in the amount of \$22 million. (Rel. 35-22705 - Nov. 9)
