RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

COMMENT PERIOD EXTENDED ON PROPOSAL REGARDING PROMOTION OF THE RELIABILITY OF FINANCIAL INFORMATION

The Commission has announced that it has extended by 30 days, until April 11, 1977, the deadline for receipt of public comment on the rulemaking proposals announced in Securities Exchange Act Release No. 13185 (January 19, 1977). These proposals would require each issuer registered pursuant to Section 12 of the Securities Exchange Act, or required to file periodic reports pursuant to Section 15(d), to (1) maintain books and records accurately reflecting the transactions and disposition of assets of the issuer; and (2) maintain an adequate system of internal accounting controls designed to provide reasonable assurance that four specified objectives are satisfied.

Further, the proposals would (1) prohibit the falsification of an issuer's accounting records; and (2) prohibit the officers, directors, or stockholders of an issuer from making false, misleading or incomplete statements to an accountant engaged in an examination of the issuer.

Finally, the proposals would require disclosure, in connection with any proxy solicitation or information statement pursuant to Regulation 14A under the Securities Exchange Act, of the facts pertaining to the involvement of any officer or director in certain corporate payments.

All interested persons are invited to submit their views, in triplicate, to George A. Fitzsimmons, Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, Washington, D.C. 20549 on or before the close of business April 11, 1977. All such communications should refer to File No. S7-671 and will be available for public inspection and copying. (Rel. 34-13381)

EFFECTIVE DATE OF MSRB RULES G-8, G-9, AND G-10 DELAYED UNTIL APRIL 25, 1977

The Commission published an order delaying the effective date of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board's Rules G-8, G-9, and G-10 from April 1 to April 25, 1977. This delay of the effective date is intended to facilitate the implementation of these rules. At the same time, the Commission extended the expiration date of interpretations of Rules 17a-3, 17a-4, and 17a-11 until April 25, 1977. (Rel. 34-13363)

ORDERS FOR PUBLIC PROCEEDINGS

LARRY A. ANDERSON

Public administrative proceedings have been ordered against Larry A. Anderson, Carlisle, Iowa, a former director of a registered investment adviser. The proceedings are based upon alleged violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws, charging, among other things, the making of false statements in the offer and sale of common stock of the registered investment adviser. A hearing will be scheduled to take evidence on the staff's allegations and to afford the respondent an opportunity to present any defenses. (Rel. IA-577)

TRADING SUSPENSIONS

TRADING SUSPENDED IN EUROPA GROUP, INC.

The SEC announced the single ten-day suspension of exchange and over-the-counter trading in the securities of Europa Group, Inc., a Delaware corporation located in Boston, Massachusetts, for the period beginning on March 16 and terminating at midnight (EST) on March 25, 1977.

The Commission ordered the suspension at the request of Europa because of recent adverse developments affecting the financial condition of the company and the lack of adequate and accurate financial information. Europa has ceased doing business and is currently in default on outstanding loans and accounts payable. (Rel. 34-13379)

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

EDWARD S. THOMAS ENJOINED

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on March 3 the Federal District Court in Rome, Georgia issued an order of permanent injunction against Edward S. Thomas of Crossville, Tennessee, enjoining him from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of fractional undivided interests in oil and gas wells or any other securities. (SEC v. American Petroleum, Inc., et al., N.D. Ga., Civil Action No. C-76-25R). (LR-7818)

HARRY M. WEENIG ENJOINED

The San Francisco Branch Office announced that on February 28 Federal District Judge Alfonso J. Zirpoli entered an order of preliminary injunction against Harry M. Weenig of Salt Lake City, Utah. Weenig consented to the order without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint, which was filed on February 7. (SEC v. American Investors Management, Inc., et al., N.D. Cal., C-77-0285 AJZ). (LR-7820)

SOUTHWESTERN RESEARCH CORP., F. M. MCCOWN FOUND IN CONTEMPT

The SEC announced that on February 28 the Honorable Aubrey Robinson, U.S. District Judge for the District of Columbia, entered an order finding Southwestern Research Corporation (Southwestern) and its president, F.M. McCown (McCown), in civil contempt of court for failure to file and cause to be filed reports as required by the Court's final consent judgment of permanent injunction and order of June 12, 1975, (the Final Judgment). This earlier Final Judgment ordered the timely filing in proper form of Southwestern's periodic and current reports required by Section 13(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Judge Robinson further ordered that, should Southwestern or McCown fail to file such non-filed reports and amendments by March 7, 1977, or thereafter, should the Court find Southwestern or McCown has failed to file and cause to be filed reports in proper form in compliance with the Final Judgment, McCown shall be fined \$1,000 for each report for each day and Southwestern shall be fined \$100 for each report and each day they should fail to file or cause to be filed reports in proper form in compliance with the Final Judgment. (SEC v. Southwestern Research Corporation, D.D.C., Civil Action No. 75-0401). (LR-7823)

VANGUARD SECURITY FUNDING CORP. ENJOINED

The SEC has announced that the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia permanently enjoined Vanguard Security Funding Corporation of Montgomery, Alabama, from violating the antifraud and reporting provisions of the securities laws based upon a consent filed by the defendant. In its complaint, the Commission alleged that the defendant made false and misleading disclosures in an annual report on Form 10-K concerning certain exchanges of land for surplus debentures in 1974. (SEC v. Vanguard Security Funding Corporation, U.S.D.C. D.C., Civil Action No. 77-0455). (LR-7828)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

INDIANA & MICHIGAN ELECTRIC COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 4 to request a hearing on a proposal of Indiana & Michigan Electric Company, subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to assign the purchase rights to coal barges and towboats and enter a lease relating to these vessels. (Rel. 35-19930 - Mar. 15)

KINGSPORT POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued approving a proposal of Kingsport Power Company, subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., whereby Kingsport will issue and sell unsecured notes maturing March 31, 1984, to banks in an amount not to exceed \$15 million. The proceeds of the sale will be used by Kingsport to pay maturing debt, to pay its outstanding short-term debt and to finance, in part, Kingsport's 1977 construction program. (Rel. 35-19931 - Mar. 15)

NATIONAL FUEL GAS COMPANY

An order has been issued approving proposals of National Fuel Gas Company and three of its subsidiaries, National Fuel Gas Distribution, National Fuel Gas Supply Corporation and Seneca Resources Corporation, whereby National will issue and sell up to \$6 million of short-term notes to The Chase Manhattan Bank of New York, and issue and sell up to \$40 million at any one time outstanding of other short-term unsecured notes to banks. It is also proposed that Seneca Resources and Supply Corporation will issue and sell to the holding company up to \$2 million and \$40 million, respectively, of unsecured short-term notes. Distribution Corporation will issue, and National Fuel Gas will acquire, up to \$22 million of long-term unsecured notes. It is further proposed that in the event of certain circumstances Supply Corporation will issue and National Fuel Gas will acquire up to \$8 million of short-term notes. (Rel. 35-19932 - Mar. 15)

JERSEY CENTRAL POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 12 to request a hearing on a proposal of Jersey Central Power & Light Company, subsidiary of General Public Utilities Corporation, that it be authorized to amend its mortgage and deed of trust and solicit the proxies of bondholders in connection therewith. PENNSYLVANIA ELECTRIC COMPANY
