ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS AGAINST TWO BROKERAGE FIRMS AND FIVE INDIVIDUAL RESPONDENTS DISMISSED

The Commission dismissed proceedings against two Denver brokerage firms, Wall Street West, Inc. (WSW) and General Bond & Share Co. (GBS), and various persons associated with those firms. Proceedings were also dismissed against Theodore V. Abbruzzese, WSW's president, John L. Brown, its executive vice president, Walter G. Asmus, a salesman and WSW's former trader, Kenneth W. Sandberg, a WSW salesman, and Sam C. Pandolfo, principal owner and an officer of GBS.

In late 1979, WSW was the principal underwriter of an offering of six million shares of the common stock of Lake City Mines, Inc. (LCM), and GBS was a member of the selling group. The respondents, other than Brown, were charged with manipulating the aftermarket price of LCM common stock. The Commission, although noting that there were a number of suspicious circumstances in the underwriting of LCM and aftermarket trading in that security, concluded that the evidence did not establish that respondents engaged in a manipulation.

The Commission also dismissed charges that WSW, Abbruzzese, Asmus and Sandberg violated the anti-manipulative provisions of Rule 10b-6 under the Securities Exchange Act. That rule prohibits persons participating in the distribution of a security from inducing purchases of the same security that are not a part of the distribution until such persons have completed their participation in the distribution. The Commission concluded that respondents had completed their distribution of LCM before they solicited additional purchases of that stock.

Finally, the Commission dismissed charges that WSW and Asmus failed to comply with recordkeeping provisions in the time-stamping of certain LCM order tickets, and that Brown failed to exercise reasonable supervision over Asmus. (Rel. 34-20557)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission granted accelerated approval of a proposed rule change filed by The Options Clearing Corporation (SR-OCC-83-17). The proposal enables OCC clearing members to satisfy their OCC margin obligations by depositing common stocks that have a market value of over ten dollars, and are traded either: (1) on a national securities exchange and reported on the consolidated tape; or (2) over-the-counter and designated as National Market System Securities under Securities Exchange Act Rule 11Aa2-1.
