TRADING HALTED IN FIVE COMPANIES

The SEC announced the suspension of over-the-counter trading for a ten-day period beginning February 26 and terminating at midnight (EDT) on March 7, 1974 in the securities of the following companies:

Applied Devices Corp., of Hauppauge, Long Island, New York;
Building Systems, Inc., of Cleveland, Ohio;
Electrogasdynamics, Inc., of Hanover, New Jersey;
United General Corporation, of Boulder City, Nevada; and
Urban Computer Systems, Inc., of Chelmsford, Massachusetts.

The Commission initiated the suspensions because the companies failed to comply with the reporting provisions of the securities laws resulting in the lack of current and accurate information available to the public. (Rel. 34-10657)

TRADING SUSPENSIONS

The SEC has announced the suspension of exchange and over-the-counter trading in the securities of Canadian Javelin, Ltd., and over-the-counter trading in the securities of Royal Properties, Inc. and Republic National Life Insurance Company for the further ten-day period February 27 - March 8, inclusive.

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COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

CHARLES PARDEE NAMED ASSOCIATE CHIEF ACCOUNTANT

The SEC today announced the appointment of Charles A. Pardee as Associate Chief Accountant, Division of Corporation Finance. Mr. Pardee joined the staff of the Commission in 1958 as a financial accountant in one of the Division of Corporation Finance's processing branches. Mr. Pardee has served continuously in the Division in progressively more important positions. From 1961-1965 he was the Division's investigative accountant in the Branch of Administrative Proceedings, from 1965-1968 he served as Assistant Chief Accountant of the Division and from 1968 until his present appointment he was Chief of one of the Division's eighteen processing branches.

Mr. Pardee received his B.B.A. from the University of Miami in Coral Gables, Florida, and his CPA certificate from the State of Texas. He served as a Major during World War II and currently is a Colonel, Finance Corps, U. S. Army Reserve (Retired).

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

COMPLAINT NAMES ALLSTATE LEASING AND ACCEPTANCE CORPORATION, OTHERS

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on February 15 a complaint was filed in the U. S. District Court in Atlanta seeking to enjoin Allstate Leasing and Acceptance Corporation, Atlanta, Ga., Allstate Leasing and Acceptance Corporation, Chattanooga, Tenn., Allstate Leasing and Acceptance Corporation, Charlotte, N. C., Rex Thorn, Atlanta, president, and M. Catherine Thorn, Atlanta, secretary-treasurer of the three Allstate corporations, from the sale of investment notes of these companies in violation of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws.

The complaint alleges that the notes were distributed through the use of false and misleading information concerning, among other things, the financial condition of the companies and the uses of the proceeds of note sales.

The court, on the same date, issued a temporary restraining order prohibiting the defendants from selling the notes in violation of the registration provisions of the securities laws and from disposing of the assets of the defendant corporations pending further order of the court. (LR-6254)

CLIFFORD W. RUSSELL, OTHERS ENJOINED

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that the Federal District Court at Dallas has ordered a permanent injunction of Clifford W. Russell, Sawood Petroleum Corporation, Charles Stafford Jackson, all of Dallas, Texas, and Emile Z. Gilutin, Lake Dallas, Texas, and a preliminary injunction of Olympic Petroleum Corporation, Olympic Energy Corporation, Tipco, Inc. (now known as Alliance Energy Corporation), William R. Cook, Aubrey Gene Gassaway, John D. Wilson and Sanford Dvorin, all of Dallas, Texas, and Robert W. Wessel of Mesquite, Texas. All defendants consented to the court orders without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint, which charged violations of various provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale by Olympic Petroleum, Olympic Energy, Tipco, and Sawood of fractional undivided working interests in oil and gas leases and investment contracts evidenced by limited partnership interests. LYSEN, GEEL SENTENCED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on January 5 the Federal District Court in Chicago sentenced William J. Lysen to seven years imprisonment following his conviction in a bench trial on December 12, 1973, for violations of the Mail Fraud Statute and sale of stolen securities.

Donald Geel, who had pled guilty to mail fraud on November 29, 1973, was sentenced on January 4, 1974, to five years probation, the first ninety days of which were to be spent in confinement. (LR-6256)

INSTITUTIONAL INVESTMENT ASSOCIATION, INC., OTHERS, ENJOINED

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on February 21 the Federal court in Atlanta permanently enjoined Institutional Investment Association, Inc., Alpha 21 Group, Inc. and Randall C. Jackson, president of both companies, all of Atlanta, from violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of investment certificates and notes of Institutional Investment Association.

The defendants consented to the court order without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint. (LR-6257)

COMPLAINT NAMES WORLD ACCEPTANCE CORP., OTHERS

The New York Regional Office announced the filing of an injunctive complaint in U. S. District Court in New York against World Acceptance Corp., of Minneapolis, Minn.; Billy Lee Perkins, of Aptos, Cal.; Hilmer B. Sandine, of Atlanta, Ga.; Robert Schwartz, of Bay Shore, N. Y.; Adolph Spear, of Fort Lauderdale, Fla.; and William Goldworn, of Miami, Fla. The complaint charges violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of World's securities. In the complaint it is alleged that the defendants disseminated false and misleading documents to consummate a merger between World and a public shell and subsequently sold or offered for sale millions of shares of unregistered World stock. (LR-6260)

VINCENT ALOI, JOHN DIOGUARDI, OTHERS, SENTENCED

The New York Regional Office announced that on February 5 Vincent Aloï was sentenced to a term of nine years imprisonment and fined \$16,000; John Dioguardi, also known as Johnny Dio, was sentenced to ten years imprisonment; Ralph Lombardo was sentenced to five years imprisonment and fined \$16,000; and John Savino was sentenced to two and a half years imprisonment. All four defendants, with the exception of Savino, had been found guilty, after trial, of conspiracy to violate and substantive violations of the securities laws and wire fraud in the sale of the common stock of At-Your-Service Leasing Corp. Savino was found guilty of conspiracy and securities law violations only. (LR-6261)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NATIONAL INVESTORS CORPORATION

An order has been issued on an application of National Investors Corporation, New York, New York, a mutual fund, for exemption from certain provisions of the Act to permit the issuance of its securities at a price other than the public offering price in exchange for the assets of Hicks Investment Co., of Denver, Colorado, a privately-held investment company. (IC-8247)

T. ROWE PRICE GROWTH STOCK FUND

An order has been issued declaring that D. Reid Weedon, Jr. shall not be deemed an "interested person" of T. Rowe Price Growth Stock Fund, Inc., a Baltimore mutual fund, solely by reason of his status as an officer and shareholder of Arthur D. Little, Inc., the parent of a broker-dealer. (IC-8248)

FORD INTERNATIONAL FINANCE CORPORATION

An order has been issued exempting the Ford International Finance Corporation, wholly-owned subsidiary of the Ford Motor Company, from all the provisions of the Investment Company Act of 1940. (IC-8252)

MERIDIAN INCOME SECURITIES

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 25 to request a hearing on a proposal of the Commission to declare that Meridian Income Securities, Inc., of Baltimore, has ceased to be an investment company. (IC-8253)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

AMERICAN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 19 to request a hearing on a proposal of American Electric Power Company, a registered holding company, to sell up to 7,000,000 shares of common stock in an underwritten rights offering. (Rel.35-18291)
