## DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

### MARANTETTE & CO. AND TWO INDIVIDUALS SANCTIONED

An order has been issued suspending the broker-dealer registration of Marantette & Co. of Detroit, Michigan, for four weeks, and suspending David T. Marantette, III, and David T. Marantette, Sr., who were president and board chairman, respectively, from association with any registered broker-dealer or affiliate for four weeks. The suspensions will begin April 15. Following the expiration of Marantette & Co.'s suspension, it will be permitted to withdraw its registration.

According to the decision, Marantette & Co., aided and abetted by the Marantettes violated the securities laws by (1) selling unregistered securities, (2) bidding for and purchasing securities while participating in their distribution, and (3) effecting transactions for the accounts of customers without disclosing in writing that it controlled or was under common control with the issuer.

The Commission's order was based upon an offer of settlement in which the Marantettes, without admitting or denying the charges, consented to the findings and sanctions. (Rel. 34-10736)

### HYER & LOWE, INC. REVOKED, CARICATO AND RUSSO BARRED

An order has been issued revoking the broker-dealer registration of Hyer & Lowe, Inc., of New York, and barring Michael Caricato, its president and treasurer, and Matthew Russo, of Miami, from association with any broker-dealer.

The sanctions were based on findings that from about October 1, 1969 to May 14, 1970, the firm, Caricato and Russo participated in a manipulative scheme involving the common stock of Belmont Franchising Corp. That scheme involved initiating a market for Belmont stock at an artificial level and controlling and manipulating the stock thereafter; quoting fictitious prices for the stock in the "pink sheets" published by the National Quotation Bureau, Inc. and otherwise; and making secret arrangements to trade Belmont stock and quote it in the pink sheets in return for protection against loss, and engaging in transactions in the stock at the direction of others. It was also found that the firm and Caricato recorded false dates and times of trades for transactions in Belmont stock in the firm's books and records, and that they failed to report promptly a change in address by the firm.

The firm, Caricato and Russo failed to answer the charges against them and were deemed to default. (Rel. 34-10737)

## ORDERS FOR PUBLIC PROCEEDINGS

### JOHN L. COLMAR, JR.

Public administrative proceedings have been instituted against John L. Colmar, Jr. The Commission's order is based upon alleged violations by John L. Colmar, Jr., of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws.

A hearing will be scheduled to take evidence on the staff allegations and to afford Colmar an opportunity to offer any defenses. The hearing will be held to determine if the allegations are true and whether any action of a remedial nature should be ordered by the Commission. (Rel. 34-10750)

## COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

### WILLIAM GOLDSBERRY NAMED ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE

Chairman Ray Garrett, Jr. today announced the appointment of William D. Goldsberry as Administrative Law Judge effective April 28, 1974. Mr. Goldsberry joined the Commission as a staff attorney in the Chicago Regional Office in 1958. He served as Attorney-in-Charge of the St. Louis Branch Office from 1959 until early 1966 and as Attorney-in-Charge of the Detroit Branch Office from 1966 through 1968. In 1968 he was transferred to Chicago and promoted to Assistant Regional Administrator.

Before joining the staff of the Commission, Mr. Goldsberry practiced law in the State of Michigan. He graduated from the University of Detroit in 1951 with a Bachelor of Science degree, majoring in accounting. In 1955, he received the degree of Juris Doctor from the University of Michigan Law School. He is a member of the Bar of the State of Michigan and admitted to practice before various federal courts.

### REGULATION A EXEMPTION OF BENEFICIAL LABS, INC. TEMPORARILY SUSPENDED

An order has been issued temporarily suspending the Regulation A exemption from registration under the Securities Act of 1933 with respect to a public offering of securities of Beneficial Labs, Inc. of Oceanside, New York.

Under a notification filed on August 4, 1974, Beneficial offered 100,000 units (consisting of one share of common stock and one redeemable warrant to purchase one share) at \$2.25 per unit. According to the order, the Commission has reason to believe that: (a) the notification and offering circular contain untrue statements of material facts and omit to state material facts necessary to make the statements made not misleading, particularly with respect to the failure to accurately state the terms of the offering and the plan of distribution; (b) the terms and conditions of Regulation A were not met, in that, the Form 2-A report falsely states the number of shares that actually had been sold and failed to indicate that the distribution was continuing subsequent to the reported termination date of the offering; and (c) the offering was made in violation of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. ## COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

---

### GARY L. MATTHEWS ENJOINED

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on April 10 Gary L. Matthews of Thomson, Georgia was permanently enjoined by the Federal court in Augusta, Georgia from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of the common stocks of Security Land and Development Corporation, Coastal States Land and Development Corporation and Southeastern Land and Development Corporation, all of Augusta. Matthews consented to the court order without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint. (LR-6327)

### ALVEY B. COLLINS, SR., OTHERS, ENJOINED

The Washington Regional Office announced that on April 15 the Federal court in Alexandria, Virginia permanently enjoined, by consent, Alvey B. Collins, Sr. of Lorton, Virginia, Alvey B. Collins, Sr. Drilling Company, James S. Collins and Green Valley Oil and Gas Company, Inc., all of Oneida, Tennessee, from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of fractional undivided interests in oil and gas leases or any other securities. The defendants consented to the court order without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint. (LR-6328)

## NEIL T. NAFTALIN INDICTED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on April 11 a Federal Grand Jury in Minneapolis, Minnesota, returned an eight-count indictment charging Neil T. Naftalin, of Minneapolis, Minnesota, with a fraudulent scheme in which \$8 million of securities which he did not own were sold through various broker-dealers by misrepresenting or by omitting to state to the broker-dealers the fact that the sales of the specific securities were short sales. ## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

### AMERICAN EXPRESS CAPITAL FUND

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 9 to request a hearing on an application of American Express Capital Fund, Inc., a mutual fund, for an order exempting from Section 22(d) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 and Rule 22c-1 under the Act public offerings of shares of the Fund in Japan to non-United States nationals in accordance with Japanese law and regulations but under terms and with sales charges which differ from those described in the prospectus of the Fund used in the United States. ### INVESTORS DIVERSIFIED SERVICES

An order has been issued on an application of IDS Growth Fund, Inc., IDS New Dimensions Fund, Inc., IDS Progressive Fund, Inc., Investors Mutual, Inc., Investors Selective Fund, Inc., Investors Stock Fund, Inc., Investors Variable Payment Fund, Inc. (the Mutual Funds), IDS Life Variable Annuity Fund A and IDS Life Variable Annuity Fund B (the Variable Annuity Funds), Investors Syndicate of America (ISA), Investors Diversified Services, Inc., the investment adviser to the Mutual Funds, ISA, and the Variable Annuity Funds and principal underwriter for the Mutual Funds and ISA, and IDS Life Insurance Company, investment adviser to and principal underwriter for the Variable Annuity Funds. The order permits the continuation of such investment advisory and principal underwriting relationships during periods commencing when existing contracts relating to such relationships might be deemed to have been terminated by the death of Allan P. Kirby (Kirby), a prominent shareholder in The Alleghany Corporation (Alleghany), which controls the investment advisers and principal underwriters, by the distribution of Kirby's estate, and by the resignation of certain trustees of Kirby family trust funds holding in the aggregate a controlling interest in Alleghany and ending when new contracts are approved by shareholders and directors of ISA, the Variable Annuity Funds, and the Mutual Funds in the manner provided by Section 15 of the Investment Company Act. ### THE ML GOVERNMENT GUARANTEED SECURITIES TRUST, FIRST MONTHLY PAYMENT SERIES

An order has been issued on an application of The ML Government Guaranteed Securities Trust, First Monthly Payment Series (a unit investment trust) and Subsequent Monthly Payment Series, of Boston, Massachusetts, a unit investment trust. The order exempts the trust (a) from the provisions of Section 14(a) of the Act insofar as such provisions would prohibit the Trust from offering shares of the several series to the public without a series having received investments in the amount of at least \$100,000, from not more than 25 investors; (b) from the provisions of Rule 19b-1 under the Act to permit each series to distribute capital gains more often than annually; and (c) from the provisions of Rule 22c-1 under the Act to permit Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith Incorporated, the sponsor of the series, to maintain a secondary market for the purchase and sale of units of each series at prices based on past valuations.
