OPEN MEETING - THURSDAY, MAY 31, 1990 - 10:00 A.M.

The subject matter of the May 31st open meeting will be:

1. Consideration of Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board proposed Rule G-36. The proposed rule would require underwriters to submit copies of final official statements and other documents to the MSRB for certain new-issue municipal securities, would create a public access facility for copying the documents, and would amend Rule G-8 on recordkeeping. 2. Consideration of a proposed Joint Industry Reporting Plan that would govern the collection, consolidation and dissemination of quotation and transaction information for NASDAQ/National Market System securities traded on an exchange pursuant to listed or unlisted trading privileges. 3. Consideration of whether to issue a concept release soliciting public comment on the appropriateness of permitting certain tender and exchange offers to proceed in the United States based on foreign law documentation and procedures where the U.S. holdings are insignificant to the transaction. The conceptual approach proposed to

be explored is a response to the exclusion of U.S. holders from tender and exchange offers for the securities of foreign issuers, where the amount of securities held in this country is so slight that the bidder or offeror would exclude U.S. holders rather than incur the costs of complying with an additional regulatory scheme. 4. Consideration of proposed amendments to Form S-8 under the Securities Act and Form 11-K under the Securities Exchange Act and related rules that revise registration and reporting requirements relating to employee benefit plans. These amendments are intended to reduce costs and expedite the effectiveness and updating of Form S-8 registration statements for such plans by streamlining Form S-8 registration procedures and by amending Form 11-K to eliminate the requirement for the annual description of the plan. COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

MARKET DECLINE OF 1989 REPORT RELEASED

Yesterday, the Commission released a report entitled, "Trading Analysis of October 13 and 16, 1989." The report, prepared by the Division of Market Regulation, reconstructs trading in the securities markets on those days. (Press Rel. 90-28)

FOUR FOIA OFFICER'S DECISIONS AFFIRMED

The General Counsel affirmed the timeliness and merits of the FOIA Officer's initial decisions in four administrative appeals filed by Safecard Services. In two of the decisions, the General Counsel determined that the FOIA Officer correctly determined that there were no responsive documents. In the third decision, the General Counsel found that the appeal was moot because no documents were withheld. In the fourth decision, the General Counsel concluded that the FOIA Officer appropriately denied access to two intra-agency memoranda regarding CUC International, pursuant to the deliberative process privilege. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES RICHARD H. TOWLE, OTHERS

The Commission announced that, on May 23, it filed a Complaint for Permanent Injunction against Richard H. Towle, Arthur O. Whipple, Arthur H. Stromberg, and Franklin J. Agardy. The Complaint alleges that each defendant aided and abetted violations of the periodic reporting provisions of the Securities Exchange Act, and that Towle violated the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act, and requests a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction as to all defendants. Without admitting or denying the allegations in the Complaint, all of the defendants consented to the

relief sought. According to the Complaint, the defendants are former executive officers of Thortec International, Inc. (Thortec), now known as URS Corp.

The Complaint alleges that, from in or about June 1986 until June 1987, the defendants, during the process of preparing consolidated financial statements and periodic reports, engaged in activities which resulted in Thortec's filing materially false and misleading financial statements with the Commission. According to the Complaint, defendants caused Thortec to record unsupported adjustments to the amount of revenue reported by Thortec's regional offices. These adjustments were recorded in violation of generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP), which resulted in Thortec's materially overstating revenue and earnings on financial statements filed with the Commission. COMPLAINT NAMES BOMBAY PALACE RESTAURANTS, OTHERS

The New York Regional Office on May 24 announced the filing of a civil action in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York seeking permanent injunctive and other relief against Bombay Palace Restaurants, Inc. (Bombay), an owner and operator of restaurants; Sant Chatwal (Chatwal), its chairman of the board; and Kewal Chopra (Chopra), its former vice president and chief financial officer.

Simultaneously, with the filing of the Commission's Complaint, Bombay, Chatwal and Chopra, without admitting or denying the allegations of the Complaint, consented to the entry of Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction against future violations of the federal securities laws. Bombay consented to be enjoined from violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act, Sections 10(b), 13(a), 13(b)(2) and 14(e) of the Securities Exchange Act and Rules 10b-5, 12b-20, 13a-1 and 13a-13 thereunder. Chatwal and Chopra consented to be enjoined from future violations of Sections 10(b) and 14(e) of the Exchange Act and Rules 10b-5, 13b2-1 and 13b2-2 and from aiding and abetting violations of Sections 13(a) and 13(b)(2) of the Exchange Act and Rules 12b-20, 13a-1 and 13a-13 thereunder. In addition to the injunctive relief, Bombay consented to: (a) engage independent auditors to review its financial recordkeeping systems and (b) adopt policies and procedures to ensure that its books, records and internal accounting controls comply with Section 13(b)(2) of the Exchange Act.
