RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

CONCEPT RELEASE ON REFORM OF REGULATION OF INVESTMENT COMPANIES

The Commission issued a release soliciting comments on reform of the regulation of investment companies under the Investment Company Act of 1940, the Investment Advisers Act of 1940, the Securities Act of 1933, and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST HARRY ABRAMS

The Commission instituted proceedings and imposed remedial sanctions against Harry Abrams (Abrams), President and controlling shareholder of Omni Mutual Inc. (Registrant), a broker-dealer that was registered with the Commission. Abrams consented to the findings and sanctions without admitting or denying the allegations.

The Commission found that Abrams violated the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws by making material misrepresentations in connection with the sale of shares in Registrant's Regulation D offering. Abrams also aided and abetted Registrant's violations of the financial responsibility, recordkeeping and reporting requirements of the federal securities laws. The Commission also found that Abrams was enjoined by a U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York for the above-mentioned violations. Furthermore, Abrams was the President and controlling shareholder of Registrant prior to and at the time that a trustee was appointed to liquidate Registrant's business pursuant to the Securities Investor Protection Act of 1970.

The Commission barred Abrams from association with any broker, dealer, investment company, investment adviser or municipal securities dealer. (Rel. 34-28091)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CLARENCE E. LONG AND JOSEPH A. LUGO ENJOINED

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that, on May 23, the Honorable Dale E. Saffels, U.S. District Court Judge for the District of Kansas, entered final judgments, by default, against Clarence E. Long and Joseph A. Lugo. Lugo and Long were both enjoined from the securities registration and antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. The Court set disgorgement sums, including prejudgment interest, against Long and Lugo of \$1,030,642.31 and \$325,863.33, respectively. The Commission's Complaint alleged Long and Lugo together effected a "free-riding" scheme. Furthermore, according to the Complaint, the broker-dealers had, in most instances, bought the shares underlying Long's repudiated purchase orders from accounts maintained by Long and Lugo. In 1988, Lugo had been permanently barred by the Commission from association with any broker-dealer or other registered entity. [SEC v. Clarence E. Long, et al. (D. KS CA 89-4075-S)] (LR-12512)

WOLFGANG MARCOUR PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Commission announced that, on June 14, the filing of an action in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia seeking a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and disgorgement of \$2062.50 plus interest against Wolfgang Marcour of Wiesbaden, Federal Republic of Germany, formerly an employee of the European subsidiary of Apollo Computer Inc., a Chelmsford, MA technology company. The Complaint alleged that Marcour sold 500 shares of Apollo stock on July 6, 1988, while in possession of material non-public information concerning an expected revenue shortfall and earnings loss for Apollo's second quarter ended July 2, 1988.

Simultaneous with the filing of the Complaint, Marcour consented to the entry of a permanent injunction, without admitting or denying the allegations of the Complaint, enjoining him from further violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder, and agreed to disgorge \$2062.50 plus interest, representing the loss he avoided by selling before Apollo's announcement of its anticipated quarterly results on July 7, 1988. [SEC v. Wolfgang Marcour, Civil Action No. 90-1390 (JGP)] (D.D.C., June 14, 1990) (LR-12513)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

NORMAN VANCE SENTENCED

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that, on June 7, Norman Vance was sentenced based upon his guilty plea to conspiracy and securities fraud charges arising from his role in a scheme with Arnold Kimmes and Michael Wright involving sham "blind pool" corporations. Vance was sentenced as follows: the imposition of a custodial sentence was suspended, Vance was placed on five years probation on each count, and a fine of \$2,500 was imposed. The terms of probation are to run concurrently with each other and with a previously imposed sentence in New Mexico for conspiracy and securities fraud (See LR-12391 and LR-12470). [U.S. v. Norman Vance, CR-S-89-275-LDG(LRL)] (LR-12514)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

SINGAPORE FUND

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 10 to request a hearing on an application filed by The Singapore Fund, Inc. for a conditional order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting applicant from the provisions of Section 12(d)(3) of the Act and related Rule 12d3-1 to the extent necessary to permit applicant to invest in equity or convertible debt securities issued by foreign issuers that derived more than 15% of their gross revenues from their activities as a broker, dealer, underwriter, or investment adviser, provided such investments meet the conditions described in proposed amended Rule 12d3-1. AMERITAS VARIABLE LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

An order has been issued under Sections 11(a) and 11(c) of the Investment Company Act approving an exchange offer of certain variable life insurance contracts and, under Section 26(b) of the Act, approving the substitution of shares of certain portfolios of the Variable Insurance Products Fund for shares of the Sower Series Fund, Inc. (Rel. IC-17531 - June 13)

TRIDENT INCOME SHARES

An order has been issued under Section 8(f) of the Investment Company Act declaring that Trident Income Shares, Inc. has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-17532 - June 14)

BERKSHIRE PARTNERS III, L.P.

A conditional order has been issued on an application filed by Berkshire Partners III, L.P., Berkshire Partners III (Retirement Fund), L.P. (together, the Funds), Berkshire Managers, L.P. (Managing General Partner), and BP III Advisers, Inc. (Advisory General Partner) under (i) Sections 6(c), 17(d), and 57(i) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 17d-1 thereunder permitting the purchase of securities by the Funds and affiliates of the Managing General Partner in joint transactions otherwise prohibited by Sections 57(a)(4) and 17(d); and (ii) Sections 57(c), 17(d), and 57(i) of the Act and Rule 17d-1 permitting the Funds to acquire one or more initial investments from affiliates of the Managing General Partner, the Advisory General Partner or an affiliate thereof. (Rel. IC-17533 - June 14)
