CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

ORMONT DRUG & CHEMICAL CO., INC. MOTION TO SET ASIDE JUDGMENT DENIED

The Commission announced that on January 17 the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia denied the motion of Ormont Drug & Chemical Co., Inc. of Miami, Florida, to set aside the Judgment by Default in favor of the Commission which was entered on December 22, 1982, and to set aside the default entered on October 8, 1982, against Ormont.

In its complaint filed on June 17, 1982, the Commission alleged that Ormont, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct extending over several years, failed to file and timely file certain annual and quarterly reports required to have been filed with the Commission. On December 22, 1982, the Court entered a Permanent Injunction restraining and enjoining Ormont from failing to file timely periodic reports and ordering it to file all of its delinquent reports no later than January 10, 1983. The Court's Order of January 17 was based upon consideration of the motion as well as the entire record, and Ormont's "repeated and ongoing refusal to take meaningful steps to respond to the complaint or to remedy the violations alleged." (SEC v. Ormont Drug and Chemical Co., Inc., U.S.D.C. D.C., Civil Action No. 82-1685). (LR-9873)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

NOTICE OF EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Rule changes filed by the following, pursuant to Rule 19b-4, have become effective in accordance with Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934: The Midwest Clearing Corporation (SR-MCC-82-21) which revises MCC's schedule of fees. MCC has increased its monthly fixed service fees and several transaction fees, primarily those related to labor intensive functions. In addition, MCC will continue to offer a variable rate settling trade volume credit to participants with a substantial number of trades settling in the MCC/Midwest Securities Trust Company (MSTC) system. Generally, under the revised fee schedule, MCC has reduced the settling trade volume credits for all participants except those settling over 4,500 trade sides per month. Participants settling over 4,500 trade sides per month will receive a slightly larger settling trade credit under the revised fee schedule. This variable rate schedule was the subject of a previous Commission order in which MCC was asked to satisfy certain stated conditions. [See order approving SR-MCC-82-8 and SR-MSTC-82-11 in Rel. 34-18823 dated June 21, 1982]. (Rel. 34-19443); and the Stock Clearing Corporation of Philadelphia (SR-SCCP-83-2) which authorizes SCCP to accept from other self-regulatory organizations and service bureaus input trade data on behalf of SCCP participants, and transmit to those self-regulatory organizations and service bureaus reports of clearing trade data on behalf of those participants.
