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## **HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

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### LOUISIANA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 8 to request a hearing on a proposal by Louisiana Power & Light Company (LP&L), subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, and System Fuels, Inc. (SFI), subsidiary of LP&L and its affiliate operating companies, to enter into a Coal Sale and Purchase Contract under which LP&L will purchase from SFI coal which SFI has contracted to purchase from Antelope Coal Company, a non-affiliate. 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### FIRST TRUST TAX-FREE FUND

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### FILING AND ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Philadelphia Stock Exchange, Inc. has filed, and the Commission has approved on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change (SR-Phlx-83-12) to extend the effectiveness of Phlx temporary Rules 933 and 941 to August 31, 1983. ### DEFERRAL OF EXPANSION OF AUTOMATED INTERFACE

The Commission has issued an order extending the pilot phase of the interface between the Intermarket Trading System and the National Association of Securities Dealers' Computer Assisted Execution System from July 15, 1983 until September 15, 1983. The order also institutes procedures for replacing stocks that are no longer eligible for trading in the interface.
