CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

FRAUD CHARGED IN REGULATION D OFFERING

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on September 6 the Honorable Robert M. Hill, U.S. District Judge for the Northern District of Texas, Dallas Division, entered orders permanently enjoining Frontier Resources Corporation, formerly of Irving, Texas and now located in Fort Lee, New Jersey, and Sam Merit, who resides both in Fort Lee, New Jersey and Irving, Texas, from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. Frontier and Merit con-

mented to the entry of the orders without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint, which was also filed on September 6. Also named as defendants are James B. Van Treese III of Paris, Texas and William C. Goodson of Dallas, Texas.

The complaint charges, among other things, that in July 1982, Merit as controlling shareholder, and Van Treese as president, caused Frontier, an inactive public "shell" corporation, to issue, purportedly under Regulation D, two million shares of common stock at four cents a share, ostensibly for sale to residents of Nevada; that the entire issue was in fact sold to Israeli residents related to Merit by marriage; and that the stock was immediately thereafter resold, at least in part, in the over-the-counter market, at prices as high as \$7 per share, by persons acting at the direction and under the control of Merit. At the same time, the complaint alleges, Merit, Van Treese and Goodson, a registered petroleum engineer and the then Chairman of the Board for Frontier, caused Frontier to issue a materially false and misleading press release concerning the management of Frontier and the value of Frontier's assets, claiming, among other things, that Frontier had "recoverable" reserves of 13 million barrels of oil and 26 billion cubic feet of gas.

The complaint further alleges that in September 1982, Van Treese caused 600,000 restricted shares of Frontier stock to be issued without appropriate legends and caused 500,000 unauthorized shares of Frontier stock to be issued, some of which he thereafter exchanged for property in Lake Tahoe, Nevada. Finally, the complaint alleges that in April 1983, Merit caused the issuance of a false and misleading press release concerning the value of certain entities newly acquired by Frontier as well as the financial condition of Frontier. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

KENTUCKY POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Kentucky Power Company (KPCo), subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to issue up to \$150 million principal amount of unsecured notes through December 31, 1984, at a fixed rate of interest no more than 200 basis points above the then current prime rate, but in no event higher than 14%. The notes will be issued either to prepay or repay outstanding notes which bear a fluctuating interest rate under an existing revolving credit agreement. KPCo also proposes to enter into hedging agreements whereby KPCo would agree to make payments at a fixed rate based on a principal amount of up to \$150 million, in return for a bank's agreement to make payments to KPCo based upon the same principal amount and calculated by reference to the variable rate which KPCo pays under the revolving credit agreement. The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. has filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-NYSE-83-43) to amend NYSE's rule regarding index options so that, with respect to any one class of index options, the NYSE may list at least three and as many as four series that expire in consecutive months, with series expiring in five different months being open for trading at any given time. ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange, Inc. (SR-CBOE-83-32) to establish exercise price intervals of five points for CBOE's Oil (Integrated International) Industry Index option, regardless of whether the index value is below or above 100.
