U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

COMMENTS REQUESTED ON PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO RULE 145(d)

The Commission requests comments on proposed amendments to the resale restrictions of Rule 145(d). If adopted, the amendments would provide that certain persons receiving securities in registered business combination transactions will not be deemed underwriters and may freely transfer such securities if they are not affiliates of the issuer and: (a) have beneficially owned the securities for at least three years; or (b) have beneficially owned the securities for at least two years and the issuer meets the public information requirements of paragraph (c) of Rule 144.

Comments should be submitted in triplicate to George A. Fitzsimmons, Secretary, SEC, 450 Fifth St., N.W., Washington, DC 20549, on or before November 11 and should refer to File No. S7-994. All submissions will be available for public inspection at the Commission's Public Reference Room. (Rel. 33-6487)

ADOPTION OF AMENDMENTS TO RULE 144

The Commission announces the adoption of an amendment to Rule 144 under the Securities Act of 1933. The amendment removes the requirement that current information be publicly available for the resales of securities held for three years or more by non-affiliates of the issuer. The amendments also rescind Rule 237, an exemption for the resale of certain securities held for five years, and Form 273, a notice of sales under Rule 237. (Rel. 33-6488)

ADDITION TO WEEKLY CALENDAR

Commissioner Bevis Longstreth will be a panelist at the Sixth Annual Commodities Law Institute in Chicago on September 29, 1983. The Panel will discuss Current Legal Issues Facing the Futures Industry.

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

UNITED GREENWOOD EXPLORATIONS LTD., HOWARD L. TOBAN ENJOINED

The Commission filed a civil injunctive action in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against United Greenwood Explorations Ltd. and its president, Howard L. Toban, both of Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. The Commission's complaint alleges that Greenwood and Toban violated the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

According to the complaint, from at least July 1980 to the present, Greenwood and Toban engaged in a course of conduct to induce persons in the United States to purchase Greenwood securities on NASDAQ. They did this by creating a false impression of the value of and expected return on Greenwood's investments in oil and gas properties located in the United States.

Without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint, Greenwood and Toban consented to the entry of a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction enjoining them from violating the antifraud provisions of the Exchange Act. (SEC v. United Greenwood Explorations Ltd. and Howard L. Toban, USDC DC, Civil Action No. 83-2814). (LR-10131)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE EQUITY INCOME FUND, S&P 500 INDEX, FIRST MONTHLY PAYMENT SERIES AND SUBSEQUENT SERIES

An order has been issued on an application of The Equity Income Fund, S&P Index, First Monthly Payment Series and Subsequent Series (the Fund), a unit investment trust, and its depositors, Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith Inc.; Dean Witter Reynolds Inc.; Prudential-Bache Securities Inc.; and Shearson/American Express Inc., for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 exempting the Fund from the provisions of Section 12(d)(3) of the Act to permit the Fund to acquire the securities of any broker, dealer, underwriter, or investment adviser, provided that: (1) such securities are included in the Standard & Poor's 500 Composite Stock Price Index (S&P Index); and (2) the percentage of the Fund's assets to be invested in the securities of any such entity will be approximately the same as the percentage such securities represent in the S&P Index. An order has also been issued on an application of the Fund and its depositors for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 exempting the applicants from the provisions of Section 22(d) of the Act to permit the sale of units of beneficial interest in the Fund at a reduced sales charge under a reinvestment plan. FIRST MIDWEST CAPITAL CORPORATION

An order has been issued on an application of First Midwest Capital Corporation, a closed-end, non-diversified, management investment company registered under the Investment Company Act of 1940 and a "small business investment company", under Section 17(d) of the Act and Rule 17d-1 thereunder, to permit the participation of the applicant in additional financing of Datatext Systems Inc., one of its portfolio companies. EASTERN UTILITIES ASSOCIATES

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until October 17 to request a hearing on a proposal by Eastern Utilities Associates, a registered holding company, to issue and sell up to 1.2 million shares of its common stock, \$5 par value, on or before December 31, 1983. EUA proposes to use the proceeds to make capital contributions to its subsidiaries, Eastern Edison Company (Eastern) and Blackstone Valley Electric Company. NOTICE OF APPROVAL OF AMENDMENTS TO CTA AND CQ PLANS

The Commission has approved amendments to the Consolidated Tape Association Plan (CTA Plan) and Consolidated Quotation Plan (CQ Plan) that (1) permit subscribers to install display devices using CTA and CQ system information in enclosed, controlled locations accessible to the general public, and (2) permit the CTA and CQ administrators to waive subscriber fees for those participating in programs testing new services. (Rel. 34-20216)

NOTICE AND ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved, on an accelerated basis, proposed rule changes filed by the New York Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-NYSE-83-32, SR-NYSE-83-35, SR-NYSE-83-38, SR-NYSE-83-39, SR-NYSE-83-40, SR-NYSE-83-41, SR-NYSE-83-42 and SR-NYSE-83-44) to establish contract specifications for the NYSE Composite Index option; to adapt to options trading certain NYSE rules regarding floor officials and telephone contacts with the NYSE floor; and to bring NYSE options rules concerning closing rotations, facilitation orders, exercises and exercise cut-offs, and parity with off-floor orders into conformity with the rules of other options exchanges. Publication of the proposals are expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of September 26. (Rel. 34-20218)
