ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

SANCTIONS IMPOSED ON PATRICK A. CARRIE

The Commission entered an Order Instituting Proceedings, Making Findings and Imposing Sanctions under Sections 203(e) and 203(f) of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 against Patrick A. Carrie (Carrie) and Patrick A. Carrie, doing business as Carrie & Associates, a registered investment adviser. Carrie consented to the Order without admitting or denying the findings contained therein. The Order finds that Carrie, from about June 1985 through the present, has routinely taken custody and possession of client funds and securities in violation of Section 206(4) of the Advisers Act. The Order further alleges that Carrie violated Sections 204 and 205 of the Advisers Act by failing to maintain required books and records, failing to file amendments to his Form ADV, failing to include non-assignment clauses in his client contracts, and failing to comply with the "brochure rule." The Order suspends him for 30 days, prohibits him from soliciting or accepting new clients for one year, and requires Carrie to retain independent legal and accounting advice to establish regulatory compliance. In addition, Carrie consented to remedial undertakings specified in the Commission's Order. (Rel. IA-1154)

THOMAS R. BLONQUIST TEMPORARILY SUSPENDED FROM PRACTICE

The Commission entered an order temporarily suspending Thomas R. Blonquist, a Salt Lake City, Utah attorney, from appearing or practicing before the Commission. The order was issued under Rule 2(e)(3)(i) of the Commission's Rules of Practice which allows the Commission to temporarily suspend an attorney or other professional who has been enjoined from violating securities laws or found by a court to have willfully violated or aided and abetted violations of securities laws. On October 26, 1988, Judge J. Thomas Greene, U.S. District Court for the District of Utah, entered findings that Blonquist had aided and abetted violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws through preparation of a false and misleading proxy statement for Magma Energy and Petrol Corp., a publicly held Utah corporation. On November 21, 1988, Judge Greene enjoined Blonquist from future violations of those provisions.

Under Rule 2(e)(3), Blonquist may petition the Commission to lift the suspension within 30 days after service of the order. If no petition is received within 30 days, the suspension will become permanent. (Rel. 34-26504)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES BRIAN H. KAY

The Los Angeles Regional Office filed a Complaint on February 1 in the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California against Brian H. Kay, an attorney. Kay consented to the order of permanent injunction sought by the Commission's complaint, without admitting or denying the allegations. The Order will enjoin Kay from aiding and abetting violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the antifraud provisions of the the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

The Complaint alleged that Kay fabricated a letter on Commission letterhead and forged a Commission staff attorney's signature on the letter. The fabricated letter stated that a Form S-18 registration statement, prepared by Kay and filed with the Commission on behalf of Kay's client, Cytotech Corporation, was effective. Kay sent the fabricated letter to principals of Cytotech. The company thereafter offered and sold unregistered securities. (SEC v. Brian H. Kay, USDC CDCA, Civil Action No. 89-611 MRP, Kx). COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST JOHN WESLEY GEORGE, JR.

The Philadelphia Regional Office filed a Complaint on February 2 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Maryland against John Wesley George, Jr., seeking a permanent injunction, an accounting of investor funds, and an order to disgorge all illegally obtained funds.

The Complaint alleges that George violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws by making misstatements of material fact, and omitting to state material facts necessary to make the statements made not misleading, in connection with fraudulent schemes to offer and sell interests in investment pools. George conducted the fraudulent schemes by offering and selling interests to customers in fictitious "jumbo" certificates of deposit and money market funds. The Complaint also alleges that George misappropriated funds received from customers for investment in legitimate ventures including limited partnership offerings and a common stock offering. George obtained in excess of \$4.5 million from investors.

The Complaint follows a Commission Order of Administrative Proceedings which barred George from association with any broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment company, or investment adviser, and revoked his registration with the Commission as an investment adviser and broker-dealer. (SEC v. John Wesley George, Jr., DMD, Civil Action No. R-89-328). (LR-11988)

Notices have been issued giving interested persons until February 27 to request a hearing on an application filed by Global Asset Portfolio, Inc.; MML Managed Bond Investment Company, Inc.; MML Money Market Investment Company, Inc.; and MML Blend Investment Company, Inc. for an order declaring that they have ceased to be investment companies. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

GENERAL PORTFOLIOS CORPORATION

Notices have been issued giving interested persons until February 27 to request a hearing on a proposal by the following companies filed under Release 35-24814, dated February 3: GENERAL PORTFOLIOS CORPORATION (GPC) and Energy Initiatives, Incorporated (EII), subsidiaries of General Public Utilities Corporation, to acquire, through one or more Delaware limited partnerships (Partnerships), a 50% ownership interest, up to an aggregate amount not to exceed \$11 million, in three closely held California corporations (collectively, Energy Companies), each of which is a lessee under a long-term lease of a natural gas-fired cogeneration facility which is a qualifying facility under the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978. EII further proposes to organize one or more wholly-owned Delaware subsidiary corporations which would be both the general partner and limited partners of the Partnerships or, alternatively, GPC may acquire one or more of such limited partnership interests. It is proposed that the Partnership acquire either all of the assets or all the outstanding shares of common stock of the Energy Companies for a total purchase price not to exceed \$22 million.

WITHDRAWAL GRANTED

An order has been issued granting the application of MCCLATCHY NEWSPAPERS to withdraw its Class A common stock, \$.01 par value, from listing and registration on the American Stock Exchange. (Rel. 34-26519)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Options Clearing Corporation filed a proposed rule change (SR-OCC-89-2) which would encompass an agreement with several other clearing agencies that would create the Securities Clearing Group which would, among other things, promote coordination among clearing organizations, and facilitate the sharing of clearance and settlement information. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of February 6. (Rel. 34-26517)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Depository Trust Company filed a proposed rule change which has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposal (SR-DTC-88-21) would authorize DTC's participants to use its Participant Terminal System to identify, for tax purposes, what securities they hold for investment purposes.
