COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

CHANGE IN WEEKLY CALENDAR

Tuesday's hearing on the International Enforcement Cooperation Act of 1989 will be in Room 2218, Rayburn Bouse Office Building, and is scheduled to begin at 10:15 a.m. (not 9:30 a.m., as previously announced). The hearing, at which David S. Ruder, Chairman of the Commission, will testify, is before the Subcommittee on Telecommunications and Finance of the Energy and Commerce Committee of the House of Representatives.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

SANCTIONS IMPOSED AGAINST HARVEST FINANCIAL GROUP, INC. AND STEPHEN S. DUKLEWSKI, JR.

The Commission entered an Order Instituting Proceedings, Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 against Harvest Financial Group, Inc. and its president, Stephen S. Duklewski, Jr. Without admitting or denying the findings, Harvest Financial and Duklewski consented to the sanctions imposed.

In its Order, the Commission made findings that Harvest Financial violated and Duklewski aided and abetted violations of the Advisers Act by failing to update registration with the Commission, maintaining deficient books and records, failing to comply with the custody requirements of the Act, engaging in improper principal transactions, and distributing false and misleading advertising. Additionally, the Commission made findings that Duklewski aided and abetted violations by his affiliated corporation, Harvest Investment Management, Inc., by causing Harvest Investment to engage in the advisory business without registering with the Commission and causing Harvest Investment to distribute false and misleading advertising.

The Order censures Harvest Financial and Duklewski, prohibits them from accepting the business of any new clients for 45 days, prohibits them from advertising or distributing any promotional material for 90 days, and orders them to comply with certain undertakings. (Rel. IA-1155)

DECISION BARRING GEORGE AND JOHN INSERRA FINAL

The decision of an administrative law judge barring George and John Inserra, of Utica, New York, from association with any broker, dealer, or investment adviser has become final.

According to the law judge's decision, the Inserras, who were salesmen in the Utica branch office of Shearson Lehman Hutton Inc., engaged in a scheme to defraud Teamster pension and welfare funds. The Inserras would purchase stocks and place them in a holding account until just prior to the settlement date. Then, if the price of the stock had risen, they would transfer it to the account of a friend, relative, or associate. However, if the price of the stock had fallen, it would be transferred to a Teamster account. The law judge also found that John Inserra churned the account of an elderly customer. (Rel. 34-26623)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER ENTERED AGAINST RONALD D. WHEELER, SR.

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on February 22 the U.S. District Court for the District of Nevada entered a Temporary Restraining Order against Ronald D. Wheeler, Sr. On February 3, the Commission filed a 12-count Complaint against Wheeler and others alleging, among other things, violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws.

Wheeler was president of Stoneridge Securities, Inc., a Las Vegas, Nevada penny stock broker. The Complaint alleged that Wheeler and other defendants distributed the stock of CTI Technical, Inc. and Composite Design, Inc. through fraudulent means. Further, the Complaint alleged a scheme by which the defendants manipulated the price of CTI and Composite in after market trading. On February 21, the Commission moved for the entry of the Temporary Restraining Order alleging ongoing violations of the antifraud provisions by Wheeler in offers and sales of Composite stock. A hearing was held on the preliminary injunction on March 6. (SEC v. Stoneridge Securities, et al., DNV, Civil Action No. CV-S-89-096, PMP). (LR-12034)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE OTC-100 FUND, INC.

An order has been issued conditionally permitting The OTC-100 Fund, Inc. to suspend the right of redemption, and payments upon redemptions previously received, through March 22. A notice of the application and a temporary order permitting the request through March 15 was issued on March 3. (Rel. IC-16866 - Mar. 15)

L&N CMO FUNDING CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 10 to request a hearing on an application filed by L&N CMO Funding Corporation, on behalf of itself and certain Trusts, for an amendment to an existing conditional order exempting L&N and the Trusts from all provisions of the Investment Company Act in connection with the issuance of collateralized mortgage obligations, and the sale of residual interests in the Trusts to sophisticated institutional investors. The requested relief would permit (1) electing Trusts to issue and sell mortgage obligations collateralized by Non-Agency Certificates, (2) the use of certain funding agreements by the Trusts, and (3) the sale or assignment of residual interests in the Trusts to sophisticated non-institutional investors. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE SOUTHERN COMPANY

A supplemental noticer has been issued correcting a prior notice dated March 2 [Rel. 35-24830] giving interested persons until April 10 to request a hearing on a proposal by The Southern Company, a registered holding company, and two of its subsidiaries, Gulf Power Company and Mississippi Power Company, for Southern to make capital contributions through March 31, 1991 to Gulf, Mississippi, and Georgia Power Company, another subsidiary of Southern. The correction restates the aggregate amounts of capital contributions that Southern may make to Gulf, Mississippi, and Georgia as \$10 million, \$20 million, and \$200 million, respectively.
