ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

DOY L. DANIELS, JR. BARRED

The Commission ordered that Doy L. Daniels, Jr. be permanently barred from association with any broker or dealer. Daniels failed to answer the Order which instituted administrative proceedings on May 9, 1989. The Commission found, based on the Order Instituting Proceedings, that Daniels (1) from January 1986 to August 1987, was a registered representative associated with a registered broker-dealer; (2) on March 30, 1989, was enjoined by the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Tennessee for violating the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934; and (3) on January 20, 1989, was convicted upon a plea of guilty to securities fraud, mail fraud, and bank fraud, and sentenced to ten years imprisonment and ordered to pay restitution to the victim investors. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES TRX INDUSTRIES, INC., OTHERS

The Commission filed a Complaint for Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief on July 5 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against TRX Industries, Tony Radecki, John P. Stroup, and Noemi L. Rodriguez Santos. The Commission alleges that (1) TRX violated Sections 10(b) and 13(a)(1), (b)(2)(A), (B)(ii) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 10b-5 and 13a-11; (2) Radecki violated Sections 5(a), (c) and 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, Sections 10(b) and 13(d) of the Exchange Act, and Exchange Act Rules 10b-5, 13b2-1, 13b2-2, and 13d-1 and aided and abetted violations of Section 13(b)(2)(A),(B)(ii); (3) Stroup violated Sections 5(a), (c) of the Securities Act, Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act, and Exchange Act Rule 10b-5; and (4) Santos violated Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Exchange Act Rule 10b-5. Simultaneously, the Commission filed a consent and undertaking of each defendant. Without admitting or denying the Complaint's allegations, each defendant consented to a Final Judgment permanently enjoining that defendant from future violations of the securities laws and granting other equitable relief. (SEC v. TRX Industries, Inc., et al., USDC DC, Civil Action No. 89-1899, TPJ). (LR-12150; AAER-234)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

GUILTY PLEAS ENTERED BY FORMER STOCKBROKERS IN THEFT, UNAUTHORIZED TRADING SCHEME

On June 26, the Boston Regional Office and the U.S. Attorney for the District of Massachusetts announced guilty pleas by Jeffrey E. Gallagher and Allan D. Tigner to charges relating to a scheme to defraud customers and their employer. At the hearing, the Court was advised that Gallagher made unauthorized trades which earned commissions for him but resulted in losses of over \$271,000 to his employer and his customers. In connection with his scheme, Gallagher fraudulently endorsed and cashed 26 checks issued by his employer and gave 17 other checks issued by his employer to Tigner, who then fraudulently endorsed and cashed those checks. Gallagher also allegedly stole a customer's bond worth \$70,000. Sentencing has been set for July 24. (U.S. v. Jeffrey E. Gallagher and Allan D. Tigner, DMA, No. 89-30014-F). (LR-12147)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

SIMMS GLOBAL FUND

An order has been issued declaring that Simms Global Fund has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-17037 - June 30)

ELFUN TRUSTS

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 24 to request a hearing on an application filed by Elfun Trusts for an order exempting it from the provisions of Sections 10(a) and 15(c) of the Investment Company Act. The order requested would permit more than 60% of Elfun's trustees to be "interested persons" as defined in Section 2(a)(19) of the Act, and would exempt Elfun from the requirement that a majority of its disinterested trustees approve any renewal of its investment advisory contract. (Rel. IC-17038 - June 30)

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 24 to request a hearing on an application filed by Elfun Trusts, Elfun Tax-Exempt Income Fund, Elfun Income Fund, Elfun Global Fund, and Elfun Diversified Fund (Funds) for an order amending previous orders issued. The amended order requested would expand the class of potential Fund unitholders to include not only members of the Elfun Society, but all persons designed by the Funds' trustees, provided their participation does not alter the Funds' status as "employees' securities companies" within the meaning of Section 2(a)(13) of the Investment Company Act. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ALABAMA POWER COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued releasing jurisdiction over the issuance and sale of up to \$18.7 million principal amount of pollution control revenue bonds, Series E, 7.20% Series, due June 1, 2016, by Alabama Power Company, subsidiary of The Southern Company. Jurisdiction continues to be reserved, through March 31, 1991, over Alabama's financing of pollution control facilities in an additional amount of up to \$106.3 million, pending completion of the record. (Rel. 35-24913 - June 27)

LISTING, DELISTING AND UNLISTED TRADING ACTIONS

WITHDRAWAL GRANTED

An order has been issued granting the application of LOUISIANA-PACIFIC CORPORATION to withdraw its common stock, \$1 par value, from listing and registration on the Pacific Stock Exchange. (Rel. 34-26980)

UNLISTED TRADING GRANTED

Orders have been issued granting the applications of the following exchanges for unlisted trading privileges in the common stock of the specified number of issues which are listed and registered on one or more other national securities exchange and are reported in the consolidated transaction reporting system: Pacific Stock Exchange - five issues. (Rel. 34-26982); and The Philadelphia Stock Exchange - eight issues. (Rel. 34-26987)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Proposed rule changes have been filed under Rule 19b-4 by: The Pacific Stock Exchange (SR-PSE-89-7) to allow facilitated public customer orders to cross with orders from a source other than proprietary account of the executing member organization and to permit, under certain circumstances, the solicitation of a facilitation order. (Rel. 34-26973); The Chicago Board Options Exchange (SR-CBOE-89-10) to create a one-year pilot which allows approved market makers to elect delta based position limits in market index option classes. (Rel. 34-26974); The Options Clearing Corporation (SR-OCC-

89-5) to allow it to require clearing members to submit options clearance and settlement data via its on-line data entry system. (Rel. 34-26975); The New York Stock Exchange (SR-NYSE-89-8) to allow member organizations to cross facilitated public customer orders with the proprietary accounts of other member organizations. Currently such orders can only be crossed with the proprietary account of the public customers' member organization. (Rel. 34-26977); and The National Association of Securities Dealers (SR-NASD-89-18) that would amend Part XII, Section 2(b) of Schedule D of its By-Laws, to make trade reporting in NASDAQ/NMS securities more concise and understandable. In order to address instances of duplicative reporting in "agency cross" and "riskless principal" trades, the proposed rule change is intended to modify the NASD's trade reporting requirements to clarify their intent that only one party to the trade is reporting. Publication of the proposals are expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of July 3.

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by The National Association of Securities Dealers (SR-NASD-89-18) to amend Part VI, Section 1(d) of Schedule D of its By-Laws to provide that market makers may become registered in a NASDAQ issue on the day after a registration request is entered. (Rel. 34-26976)

Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
