COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

FRIEND-OF-THE-COURT BRIEF FILED

Daniel L. Goelzer, General Counsel of the Commission, announced that the Solicitor General, on behalf of the Commission, filed in the U.S. Supreme Court a friend-of-the-court brief in support of the petitioners in Bob Reves, et al. v. Arthur Young & Co. The petitioners, representatives of a class of purchasers of interest-bearing promissory notes sold by a farmers cooperative, seek reversal of a decision of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit, holding the cooperative's notes are not securities. The notes were widely sold in minimum denominations of \$100 to obtain funds for the cooperative's day-to-day operations and business ventures, were payable on demand, and were marketed as part of the cooperative's "investment program" to cooperative members and others. The Commission's brief urges the Supreme Court to adopt the Second Circuit's "family resemblance" test for determining whether an instrument is a "note" within the definition of "security" in the securities laws, and takes the position that the cooperative's notes are securities. The brief argues that the Eighth Circuit's conclusion that the demand feature of the notes disqualifies them from the definitional term "note" under the securities laws is erroneous. STAFF ACCOUNTING BULLETIN NO. 83

The staff released Staff Accounting Bulletin No. 83 which revises the staff's existing guidance set forth in Topic 4-D (cheap stock) regarding the computation of earnings per share and expresses the staff's position regarding the responsibility of the registrant to determine whether compensation expense must be recognized when securities are issued prior to the filing of a registration statement for an initial public offering. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

NASD ACTION AGAINST ROWE & COMPANY AND PRESIDENT AFFIRMED

The Commission affirmed disciplinary action taken by the NASD against Rowe & Company, Inc., of Dallas, an NASD member firm, and its president, Frederick Rowe, Jr. The NASD censured respondents and fined them \$5,000, jointly and severally.

The Commission found, as had the NASD, that applicants failed to comply with certain reporting requirements, and that the firm violated supervisory provisions governing customers' options accounts. In affirming the sanctions assessed by the NASD, the Commission pointed out that the violations at issue were not isolated incidents, noting that the NASD had also issued a letter of caution to respondents citing similar infractions. The Commission concluded that, in light of the violations committed and respondents' complacent attitude with respect to their compliance responsibilities, the NASD's sanctions were justified. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

LEONARD J. MULLEN ENJOINED

The Boston Regional Office announced that on July 11 U.S. District Judge Warren W. Eginton, District of Connecticut, ordered that Leonard J. Mullen, formerly the Assistant Controller - Audit with the Stamford, Connecticut based General Signal Corporation, Inc. (GSX), be permanently enjoined from future violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5. In addition, Mullen is ordered to pay \$11,250.50 in disgorgement and a penalty of \$11,250.50 under the Insider Trading Sanctions Act of 1984, to the U.S. Treasury.

In the June 30 Complaint, the Commission alleged that Mullen, while in the course of his employment, received and recklessly misappropriated material non-public information from his employer relating to GSX's confidential negotiations to acquire the Andover, Massachusetts based GCA Corporation, Inc. Simultaneous with the filing of the Complaint, Mullen, without admitting or denying the Complaint's allegations, consented to a Final Order of Permanent Injunction and to the ancillary relief described above. (SEC v. Leonard J. Mullen, USDC DCT, Civil Action No. B-89-364, WWE). (LR-12185)

PERMANENT INJUNCTION ENTERED AGAINST GRADY A. SANDERS

The Denver Regional Office announced that on July 18 Judge Jim R. Carrigan, U.S. District for the District of Colorado, entered a permanent injunction against Grady A. Sanders of Dallas, Texas. The Court also ordered Sanders to disgorge \$611,602, representing profits resulting from his fraud and misrepresentations but waived payment of disgorgement after Sanders filed a financial statement detailing his inability to pay. Sanders consented to the permanent injunction and other equitable relief without admitting or denying the allegations in the Complaint.

The Complaint alleged, among other things, that Sanders and others engaged in a scheme to distribute unregistered stock of a "shell" corporation, thereby violating the registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

The case is still pending against the remaining defendants, Donald E. Hoke, Jr. and Master Security Services, Inc., both of Las Vegas, Nevada. (SEC v. Grady A. Sanders, et al., USDC CO, 85-C-2542). (LR-12186)

An order has been issued declaring that Liberty Fund, Inc. has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-17092 - July 28)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

GENERAL PORTFOLIOS CORPORATION

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing General Portfolios Corporation and Energy Initiatives, Incorporated, subsidiaries of General Public Utilities Corporation, through December 31, 1989, to, among other things, acquire, through a Delaware limited partnership, a 50% ownership interest, up to an aggregate amount not to exceed \$11 million, in three closely held California corporations, each of which is a lessee under a long-term lease of a natural gas-fired cogeneration facility which is a qualifying facility under the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978. ACQUISITIONS OF SECURITIES

Companies and individuals must report to the Commission within ten days on Schedule 13D if after the acquisition of equity securities of a public company their beneficial interest therein exceeds five percent. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1).
