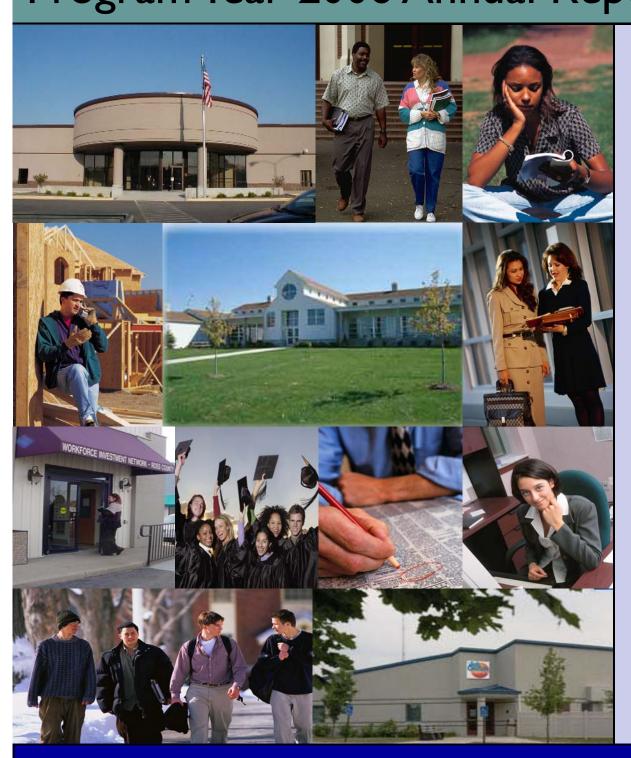
State of Ohio Workforce Investment Act Program Year 2006 Annual Report



July 1, 2006—June 30, 2007



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Program Year 2006 Participation Summary

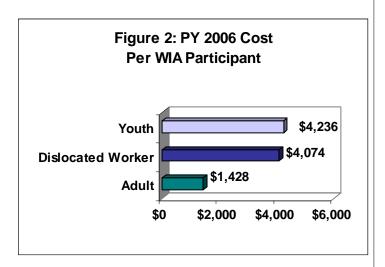
Ohio is pleased to report that the state met the negotiated performance levels for all 17 WIA measures and exceeded 13. In Program Year (PY) 2006, Ohio served a total of 55,142 WIA participants; placed 7,910 adults, dislocated workers, and older youth into jobs; and assisted 8,230 youth to obtain recognized skill upgrades, credentials, and diplomas. Ohio provided services to 3,737 out-of-school youth and 7,997 in-school youth. Ohio also provided assistance to 16,042 self-service only customers.

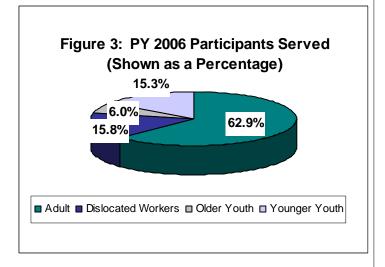
This year the average cost per participant (calculated by dividing the total adult, dislocated worker, and youth program expenditures and obligations by the number of individuals served) was \$2,444. As shown in Figure 2, Ohio expended an average of \$1,428 per adult, an average of \$4,074 per dislocated worker, and an average of \$4,236 per youth.

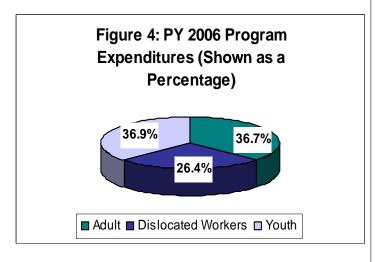
The Adult Program once again served the highest number of participants with 34,676, which was quadruple the number served by the Dislocated Worker (8,732) or Younger Youth (8,430) Programs. The Older Youth Program served 3,304 total WIA customers. These numbers are shown as percentages in Figure 3.

In PY 2006, Ohio spent \$134.8 million in workforce development funds on adult, dislocated worker, and youth program activities.

As noted in Figure 4, the largest portion of WIA spending occurred in the Youth Program. The Youth Program expended approximately \$49.7 million, the Adult Program \$49.5 million, and the Dislocated Worker Program \$35.6 million.









WIA Adult Program

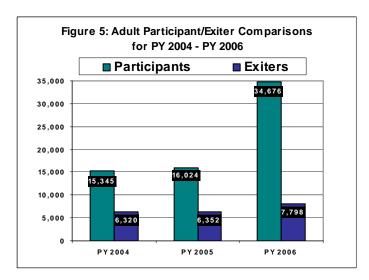
During PY 2006, Ohio's Title I-B WIA Adult Program served 34,676 participants, which is more than double the 16,024 adults served in PY 2005. Overall, 7,798 adults exited the program between July I, 2006 and June 30, 2007 (see Figure 5). The state met all four and exceeded three of the negotiated measures — entered employment rate, average earnings, and the employment and credential rate for the Adult Program.

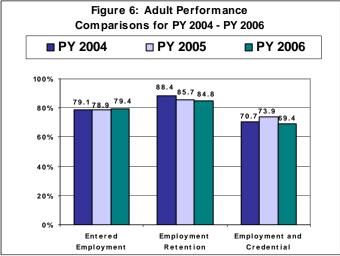
A total of 4,541 adults were placed in unsubsidized employment during the performance reporting period, exceeding the entered employment rate performance goal of 75.0% with an actual performance level of 79.4% as shown in Figure 7. This was slightly higher than last year's performance of 78.9%. All 19 local workforce investment areas (LWIAs) met and 15 exceeded this measure.

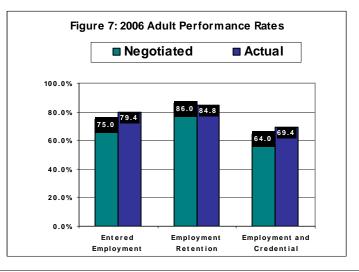
The state exceeded the established goal of \$14,221 for the adult average earnings measure, which focuses on the average earnings achieved over a sixmonth period following program participation, with an actual performance level of \$14,860. All 19 LWIAs met the adult average earnings standard and 13 exceeded it.

Additionally, during this program year, the state exceeded its employment and credential rate measure with an actual performance level of 69.4%. As shown in Figure 6, this was lower than last year's performance level of 73.9%. Fifteen LWIAs exceeded the standard.

The state also met the employment retention rate performance goal established by the Department of Labor with 84.8% of all employed exiters still employed six months or more after entering employment. All LWIAs met or exceeded the standard.







WIA Dislocated Worker Program

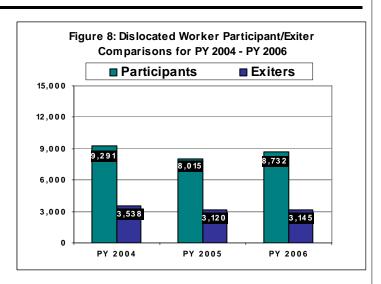
During PY 2006, Ohio served a total of 8,732 participants in the Title I-B WIA Dislocated Worker Program. As shown in Figure 8, a total of 3,145 dislocated workers exited the program between July 1, 2006 and June 30, 2007.

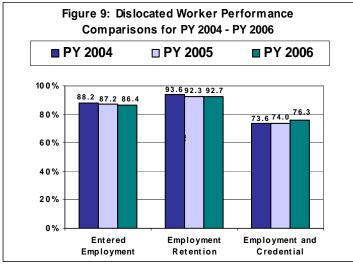
The ODJFS Rapid Response Unit received 101 Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification Act (WARN) notices, which involved 18,309 workers from companies experiencing plant closures and layoffs affecting 50 or more workers. This was up from the 60 WARN notices and 11,220 workers whose companies experienced plant closures and layoffs in PY 2005. The WARN provides protection to workers, their families, and communities by requiring employers to provide notification 60 calendar days in advance of plant closings and mass layoffs.

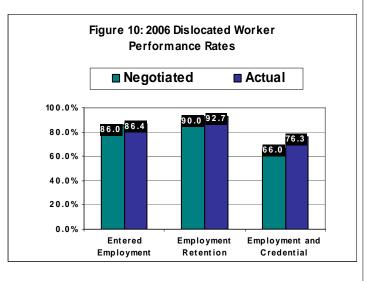
The state achieved similar results as in PY 2005 and exceeded all four of the negotiated performance standards for the PY 2006 Dislocated Worker Program (Figure 9). Statewide, 2,663 dislocated workers were placed in unsubsidized employment during the reporting period, and Ohio exceeded its entered employment rate performance goal of 86.0% with an actual performance level of 86.4%. All 19 LWIAs met or exceeded the goal for this measure.

Ohio's Dislocated Worker Program exceeded its employment retention rate negotiated performance level of 90.0, with an actual performance level of 92.7% for dislocated workers employed six months or more after entering employment (see Figure 10). All 19 LWIAs met or exceeded this measure.

Additionally, the state exceeded the dislocated worker average earnings measure of \$16,577 for PY 2006, with an actual performance level of \$16,744. All 19 LWIAs met or exceeded this standard. The program also exceeded its employment and credential rate for dislocated workers with an actual performance level of 76.3%. Sixteen LWIAs exceeded this measure.









WIA Older Youth Program

For PY 2006, Ohio served 3,304 WIA participants in the Older Youth Program. Between July 1, 2006 and June 30, 2007, 1,287 individuals exited the program (see Figure 11).

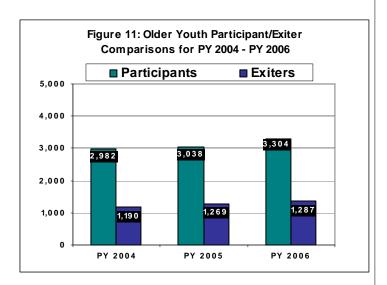
Again, as in PY 2005, Ohio exceeded all four of the negotiated measures — entered employment rate, employment retention rate, six month earnings increase, and the credential rate — for PY 2006 older youths (ages 19 to 21). As can be seen in Figure 12, the PY 2006 Older Youth Program showed a slight improvement in its overall performance from the two previous years (PY 2005 and PY 2004).

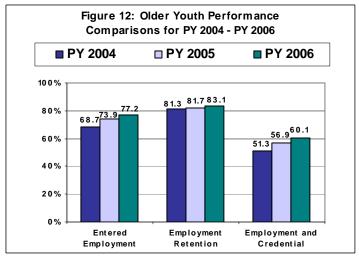
Ohio's entered employment rate for older youth was up from the levels attained in the previous two years (77.2%, compared to 73.9% in PY 2005 and 68.7% in PY 2004). The state exceeded this measure and placed 706 older youths in unsubsidized employment. At the local level, 16 LWIAs met or exceeded this measure.

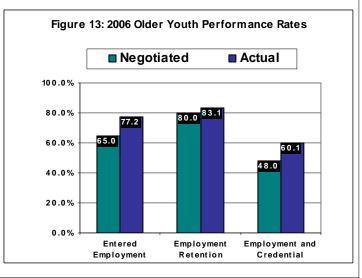
Statewide, Ohio exceeded the older youth employment retention rate goal of 80.0% with an actual level of 83.1% (Figure 13). Retention for older youths was slightly better than in PY 2005 and PY 2004 (83.1%, compared to 81.7% and 81.3%, respectively). All 19 LWIAs met or exceeded the retention measure.

Additionally, the state obtained a performance level of \$6,100 for the six months earnings increase, which was \$2,500 higher than the negotiated goal established for this measure. Twelve LWIAs met or exceeded this measure and three received non-applicable designations and were not counted in the overall status of local performance.

As with the Adult and Dislocated Worker Programs, Ohio exceeded its older youth credential rate with an actual performance of 60.1%. Fifteen LWIAs exceeded the older youth credential rate measure.







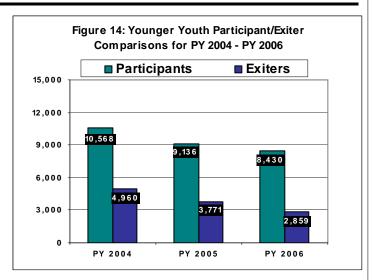
WIA Younger Youth Program

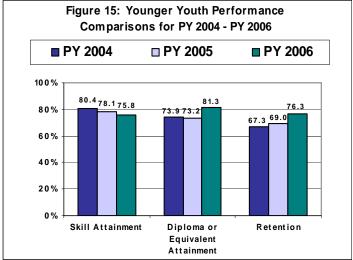
In PY 2006, as shown in Figure 14, Ohio's WIA Younger Youth (ages 14 to 18) Program served 8,430 participants. The program exited a total of 2,859 participants from younger youth WIA services/activities.

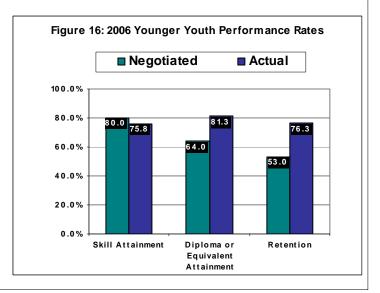
This year, Ohio met all three and exceeded two of the negotiated younger youth measures. The state exceeded its negotiated performance level of 53.0% for the younger youth retention rate with an actual outcome of 76.3%. This performance outcome was 7.3% higher than the actual performance of 69.0% reported for PY 2005 (see Figure 15). At the local level, all 19 LWIAs exceeded the younger youth retention measure.

The state also exceeded the youth diploma or equivalent attainment goal with an outcome of 81.3%. As illustrated in Figure 15, the younger youth diploma or equivalent attainment rate was up from the levels attained in the previous two years (81.3% in PY 2006, compared to 73.2% in PY 2005 and 73.9% in PY 2004). Like the youth retention measure, all 19 LWIAs exceeded this standard.

Additionally, Ohio met the younger youth skill attainment rate with an actual outcome of 75.8% (Figure 16). Eighteen of the LWIAs met or exceeded this standard.









Statewide Evaluation Activities

Ohio's Evaluation Project is an on-going, multi-phase study of the statewide workforce development system. It incorporates both contracted research and in-house analysis to identify performance issues and promote methods for continuously improving activities, services, and outcomes. Within Ohio, the Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS), Office of Research, Assessment, and Accountability, manages the evaluation project and, in coordination with state and local partners, sets the research agenda.

Ohio's evaluation strategy is designed to assess performance and operations within the workforce development system and involves multiple phases in which a combination of evaluative methods are utilized over a period of time. Phase I activities began in Program Year 2002 with a multi-stage



evaluation of Ohio's workforce investment system. Phase I activities included an outcome evaluation that examined performance outcomes and analyzed performance results; a process evaluation that focused on WIA program implementation; and an impact study that incorporated the results from the outcome and process evaluations and provided an analysis of the program's long-term impacts on former participants. Phase II activities began during Program Year 2006 and are designed to build upon the evaluations completed during Phase I of the study. Phase II commenced with the implementation by ODJFS of the Data Analysis, Tabulation, and Assessment (DATA+) Project. DATA+ is based upon the Performance Enhancement Project (PEP) funded by U.S. DOL and developed by Social Policy Research Associates (SPR). PEP provides states with a blueprint for conducting data analysis as a method to enhance their performance under current and common measures.

The DATA+ Project is designed to utilize WIA participation and performance data from the state's

management information system, also known as Sharing Career Opportunities Through Information or SCOTI, to analyze service levels and performance issues through a combination of evaluative methods. The first step of Phase II involves conducting a comparative analysis of local level participation, services, and outcomes data and reporting the results. Following the PEP framework, the second step of the project adds a diagnostic component to the evaluation. This investigative approach utilizes data analysis to first identify key performance issues and secondly to diagnose causative factors contributing to these performance issues. Once performance issues and contributing factors are identified, the State intends to prepare a corrective action plan with recommendations for performance improvement and enhancement. The third step of the DATA+ Project that is being developed is the performance analysis piece. It is also based upon the PEP blueprint and utilizes real-time indicators of performance (versus the lag time associated with WIA and common measures) to assess the progress of programs in meeting key outcomes. In addition, the analysis will be used to create essential tools for tracking and monitoring on-going performance achievement in such areas as employment, educational gains, skill basic skills, entry into advanced attainment, training/military, and certificate/diploma achievement.



Additional evaluation studies are planned for Phase II and will be conducted by independent evaluator selected for this project. Αt minimum, these studies will include replication of the outcome evaluation

completed during Phase I for Program Years 2002 and 2003 and a process evaluation that focuses on activities at the state and local levels and includes an analysis of outcomes and customer feedback.

Program Year 2006 Cost Effectiveness Analysis

In PY 2006, Ohio served 55,142 participants at an average cost of \$2,444. As shown below, the state expended \$134,793,591 on core, intensive, and training services for the three WIA population groups. This amount includes obligatory expenses for participants in WIA programs, but does not include local administrative expenses, rapid response, or statewide activities.

Ohio expended an average of \$1,428 per adult, \$4,074 per dislocated worker, and \$4,236 per youth. The state placed 4,541 adults and 2,663 dislocated workers into unsubsidized employment at an average cost per placement of \$11,811. Additionally, the state assisted 8,230 youth obtain skill upgrades, credentials, and diplomas at an average cost per positive outcome of \$6,039.
