SUMMARY: The North Pacific Pishery Management Council (Council) bas submitted Revised Amendment 23 to the Fishery Management Plan for the Groundfish Fishery of the Bering Sea and Aleutian Islands Area, Revised Amendment 28 to the Fishery Management Plan for Groundfish of the Gulf of Alaska (GOA), and Revised Amendment 4 to the Fishery Management Plan for the Commercial King and Tanner Crab Fisheries in the Boring Sea and Aleutian Islands (BSAI) for review by NMFS. Revised FMP Amendments 23, 28, and 4 would establish a more torium on the entry of now vessels into groundfish fisheries af the GOA and the BSAI and the king and Tanner crab fisheries in the BSAL Comments are requested from the public.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:

The Maganson Fishery Conservation and Management Act (Magnuson Act) requires that each Regional Fishery Management Council submit any fishery management plan or plan amendment it prepares to NMPS for review and approval, disapproval, or partial disapproval. The Magnuson Act also requires that NMFS, after reviewing the plan or plan amendment, immediately publish a notice in the Federal Register that the plan or plan amendment is available for public review and

comment. NMFS will consider the public comments received during the comment period in determining whether to approve these revised FMP amendments.

The three revised FMP amendments

would establish a 3-year moratorium on the entry of new vessels into the groundlish fisheries of the GOA and the BSAI and the king and Tenner crab fisheries of the BSAI. The purpose of the moratorium is to curtail increases in harvesting capacity and provide industry stability while the Council assesses inng-term management alternatives for the affected fisheries.

The vessel moretarium would be implemented through the issuance of a Federal morstorium permit to a vessel that meets specific length restrictions and on which a legal landing of any moratorium species was made dupny the qualification period. A moratorium permit will not be valid unless the permit has at least one endorsement for the use of authorized fishing gear. Specific eligibility requirements for the moratorium permit and the fishing gear endorsements are contained in the Federal regulations proposed by the Council to implement Revised FMI' Amendments 23, 28, and 4. The proposed regulations are scheduled to be published within 15 days of this document.
