

Instructions for Application and Verification Form for Residential Energy Tax Credit Certification

Geothermal Systems

Oregon Department of Energy

The Oregon Residential Energy Tax Credit program provides for closed-loop geothermal space or water heating systems. The tax credit amount is available on the Department of Energy yield table. It is based on 60 cents per kilowatt hour (kWh) saved during the first year of operation, up to a maximum of \$900.

Earth-coupled heat pumps and systems that use a secondary heat exchanger submersed in a well, lake, pond or stream qualify. Systems that pumpwater directly out of a well, lake, pond or stream are not eligible.

The Oregon Department of Energy has a list of tax-credit certified geothermal contractors for your convenience. You do not have to use a tax-credit certified contractor, but they can assist you with the necessary paperwork to qualify for the tax credit.

To qualify for a tax credit, you must have an Oregon income tax liability. If you are an Oregon resident and do not have an Oregon income tax liability, you may choose to transfer your tax credit to an Oregon resident who does. The Pass-through Option will allow you transfer your tax credit to an individual or business with an Oregon tax liability who will make a lump-sum payment to you equal to 95 percent of the certified tax credit amount. To use this option, complete this application form first and check off the Pass-through Option section of the application. Your application will be reviewed for eligibility. A Pass-through Option Application will be sent to you in return. You and your pass-through partner (the tax credit recipient) will complete and sign the Pass-through Option Application and mail it to the Oregon Department of Energy. You are responsible for finding your own pass-through partner. The Department of Energy will then issue the tax credit certification to the pass-through partner. There may be tax implications for the pass-through partner. We advise you to consult with your tax preparer.

Don't wait to apply for the tax credit. It usually takes at least four to six weeks to get the certification you need to claim the credit on your tax return. Applications must be received at the Oregon Department of Energy **no later than April 1** of the year following the purchase, even if the tax credit is carried forward.

Take the following steps to receive your tax credit:

- 1. Verify that your geothermal space or water heating system is installed in a closed-loop configuration. Only geothermal systems that use a subsurface coil of tubing or heat exchanger and do not remove water for the ground, lake, pond or stream are eligible.
- 2. Complete the Application and Verification Form for Tax Credit Certification Geothermal Systems. The form may be filled out on your computer. Please print it, sign it and mail it with your receipt to the Oregon Department of Energy. The forms can not be filed on line.
- 3. Provide an accurate description of the equipment or system on your application. Your contractor will provide the necessary details. Include a clear, itemized copy of proof of payment. (You may use a bid or proposal sheet that is marked paid-in-full by your contractor.) Be sure your contractor also signs the application form.

- 4. Submit the application to the Oregon Department of Energy. If the paperwork you submit demonstrates that your system qualifies for the tax credit, the Oregon Department of Energy will approve your application and send you a certification with the qualifying tax credit amount.
- 5. Claim the tax credit on your state income tax. Keep your certification, a copy of your application and proof of payment for your records. Do not attach them to your tax return. Upon audit or examination, the Oregon Department of Revenue may ask you to provide the information to verify your credit claimed. Tax credits, or portions of the tax credit, not taken in the first tax year may be carried forward up to five years.

Tips for buying, installing, and operating geothermal space or water heating system:

- Ask how much experience the contractor has installing geothermal heating systems. Ask for references and check them.
- If you are purchasing a system from a contractor certified by the Oregon Department of Energy, ask to see his /her certification and the list of systems he/she is certified to install.
- Check that the contractor has been trained by the system manufacturer and is following installation standards recommended by the system manufacturer.
- Be sure you understand how to operate and maintain your system. Your contractor should provide you with an owner's manual with operation and maintenance instructions. In the rare event that your closed-loop system fails, know what steps to take to shut off or bypass your system. Make sure your contractor fully explains all warranties provided by the manufacturer and contractor.
- Install night set-back thermostats to reduce the heating temperature to 60 degrees F. and increase cooling temperature to 80° F. during unoccupied or sleeping hours.
- Gaps, cracks or small holes in ductwork account for as much as 25 percent of home heat loss.
 You can get an additional tax credit for sealing existing ductwork or installing a well-designed
 and sealed duct system. To qualify for a duct tax credit, work must be performed by an Oregon
 Department of Energy tax-credit certified duct contractor.
