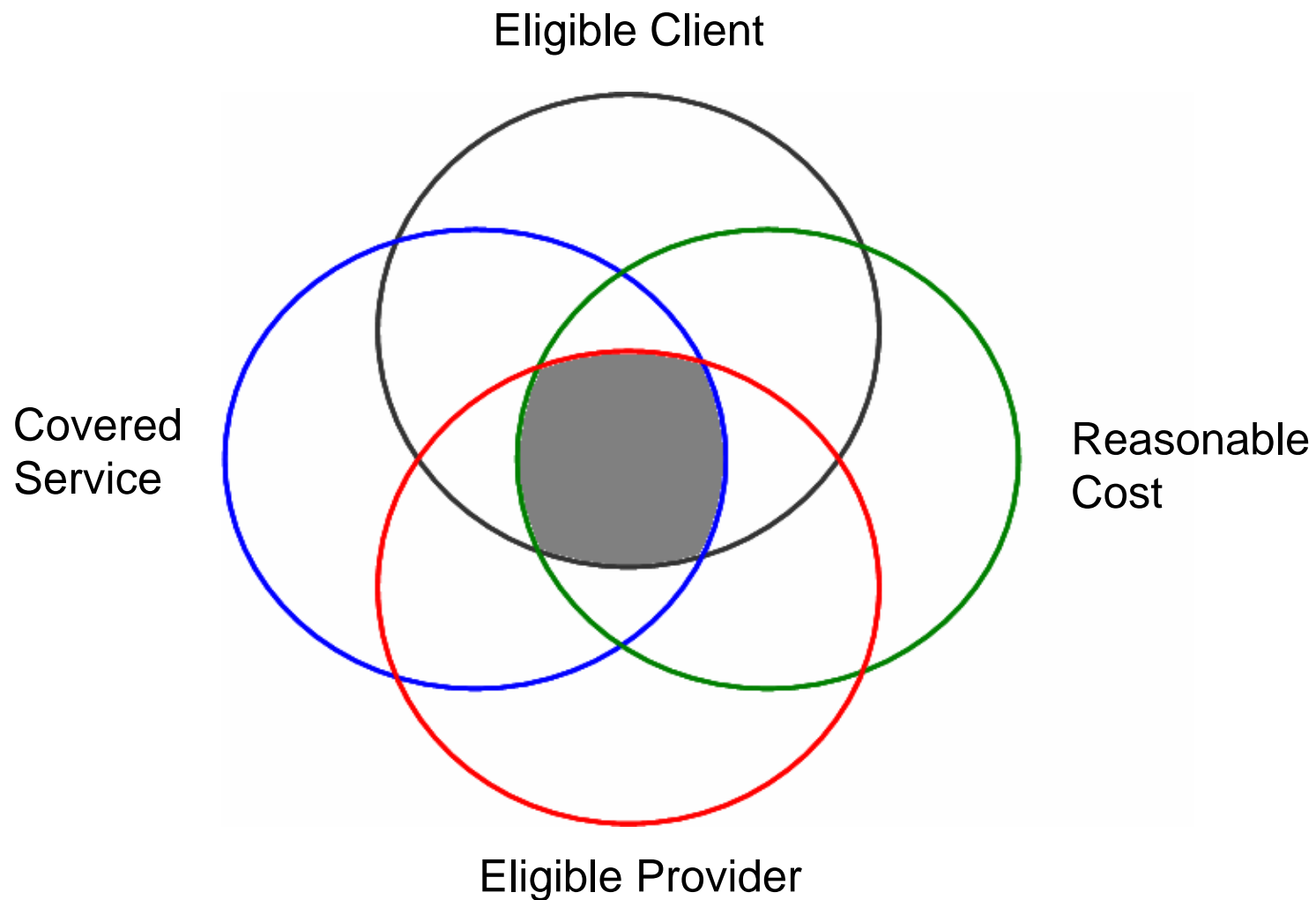

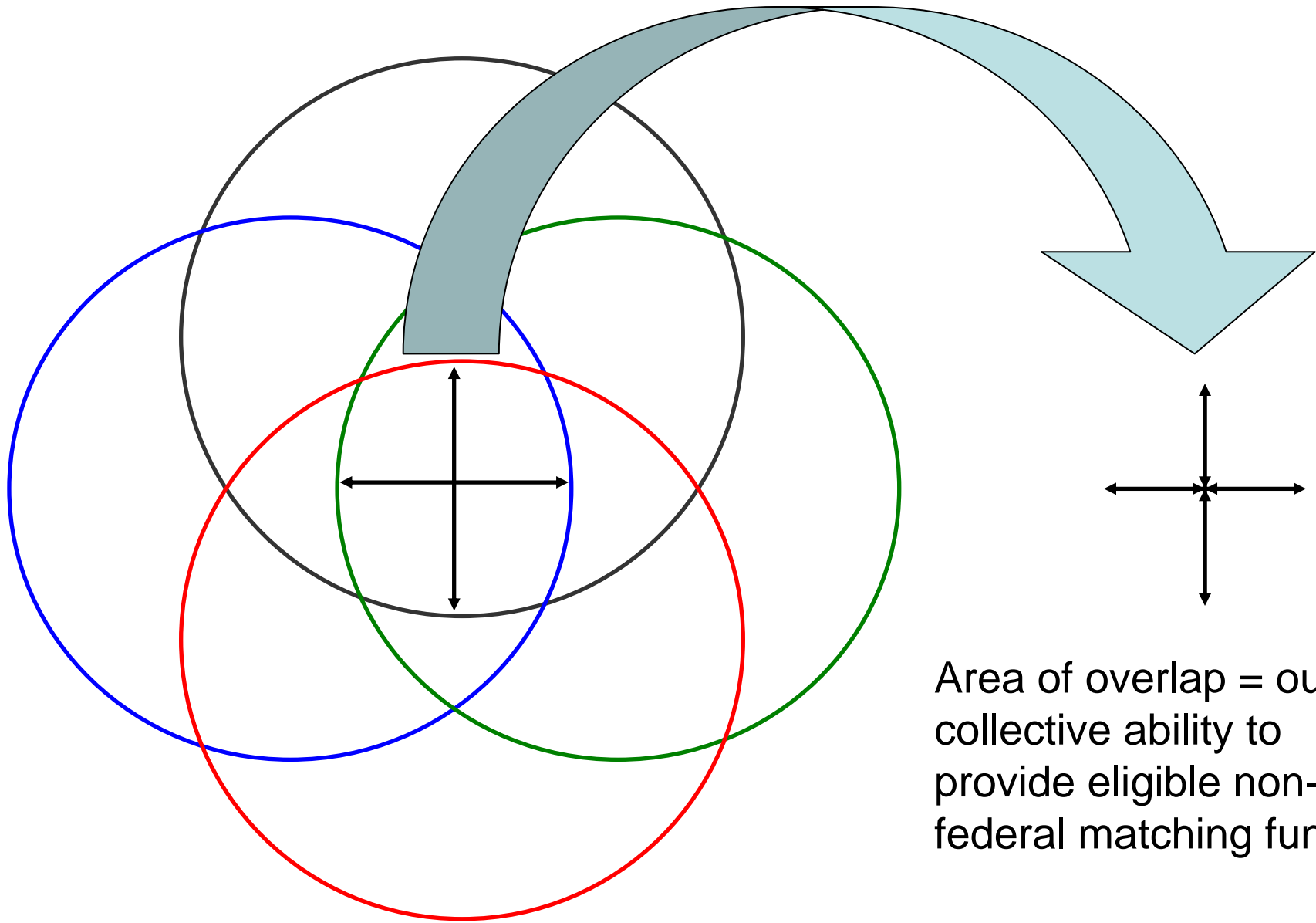

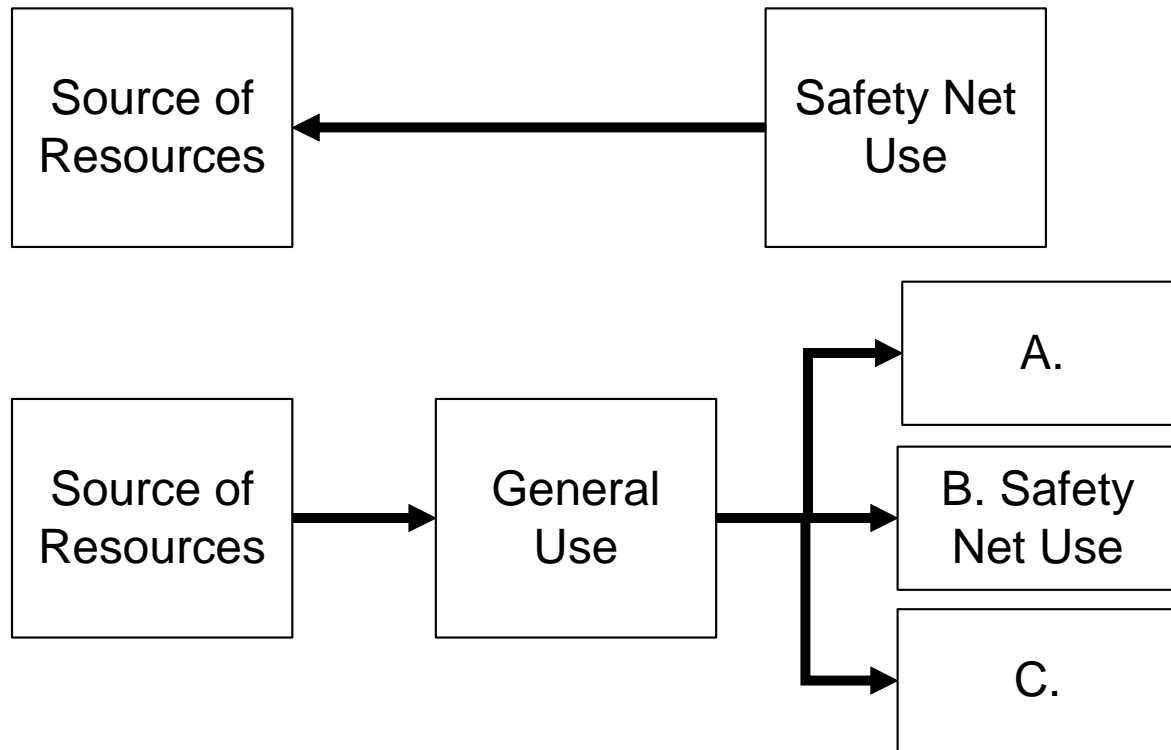
Shaded area of overlap = reimbursable Medicaid activity;

In all cases, Medicaid's relationship to environment realized through these four circles – enrollment, coverage, reimbursement rates, eligible providers



Area of overlap = our collective ability to provide eligible non-federal matching funds
