This Worksheet is designed to aid you in determining if you may be eligible for relief under this law change; however, nothing prohibits you from filing for relief. **NOTE: Providing false information can lead to Perjury charges.** If you have any questions regarding this Worksheet or the instructions to petition for relief under ORS 181.830 (House Bill 2333), please contact the Oregon State Police Sex Offender Registration Unit at (503) 378-3720. - Attempted Transporting child pornography into this state
- Attempted Paying for viewing a child's sexually explicit conduct
- Attempted Compelling prostitution

- Attempted Kidnapping in the first degree if the victim was under 18 years old
- Attempted Contributing to the sexual delinquency of a minor
- Attempted Sexual misconduct, if offender is at least 18 years of age
- Attempted Possession of materials depicting sexually explicit conduct of a child
- Attempted Kidnapping in the second degree if the victim was under 18 years of age, except by a parent or by a person found to be within the jurisdiction of the juvenile court
