

A view of the National Heritage Areas in 2004

Visitation and Volunteerism

42,965,637 people visited heritage areas, and volunteers worked 219,506 hours in heritage areas.

Partnerships

Heritage areas have formalized relationships with 1,274 partners, and 3,639 informal relationships with partners.

Education

Heritage areas and their partners managed 558 educational programs, and 737,751 people participated in educational programs.

National Register of Historic Places

Heritage areas awarded 111 grants to National Register/ eligible structures, and contributed to 113 enhancements projects.

Grants

Heritage areas awarded 341 grants, which leveraged \$44,488,296 in additional funds.

Trails projects

Heritage areas awarded 66 grants for recreation trails, assisting in the creation and enhancement of 85 miles of trails and 83 trails projects.

Leveraging Federal funding

NPS Heritage Partnerships Program funding leveraged \$83,691,954 in other Federal, state, local, and private dollars, a ratio of 1:6.
