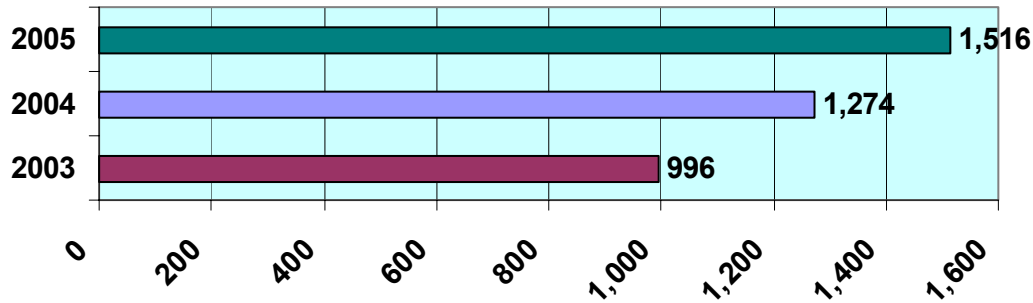


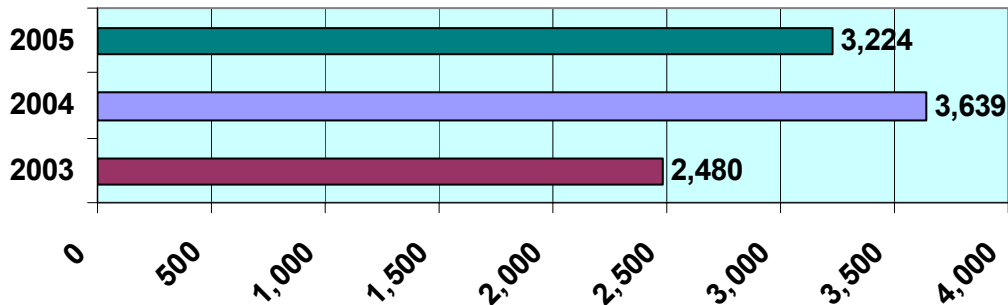

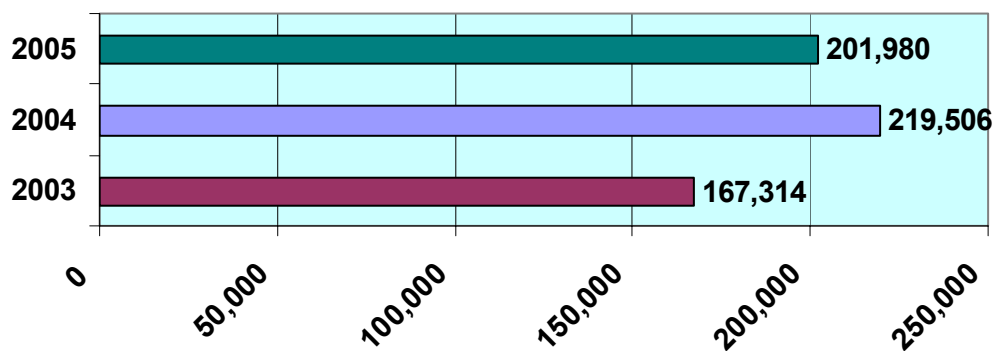
Formal Partnerships, 2003-2005



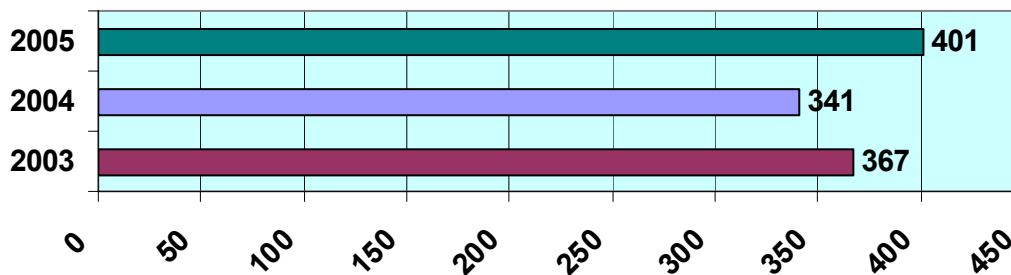
Relationship Partnerships, 2003-2005



Volunteer Hours, 2003-2005

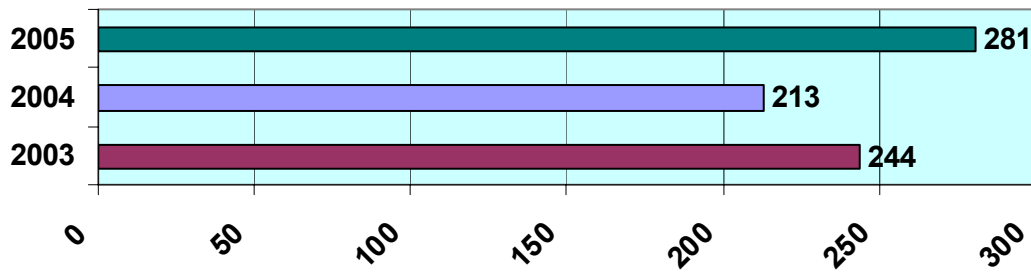

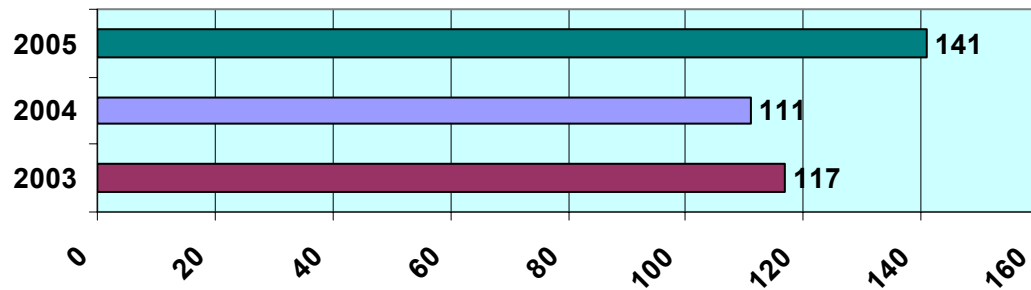

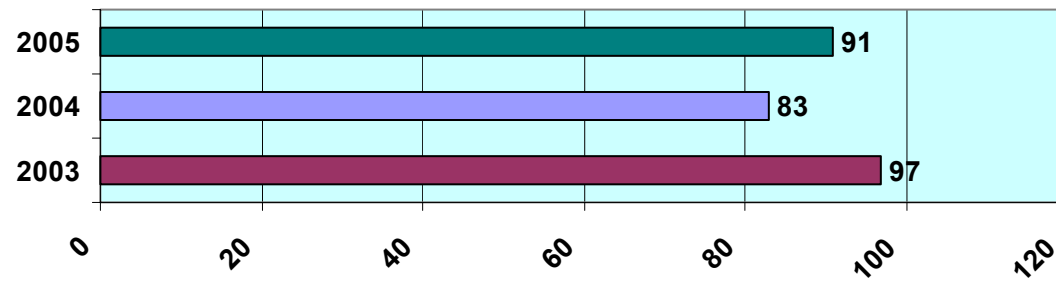

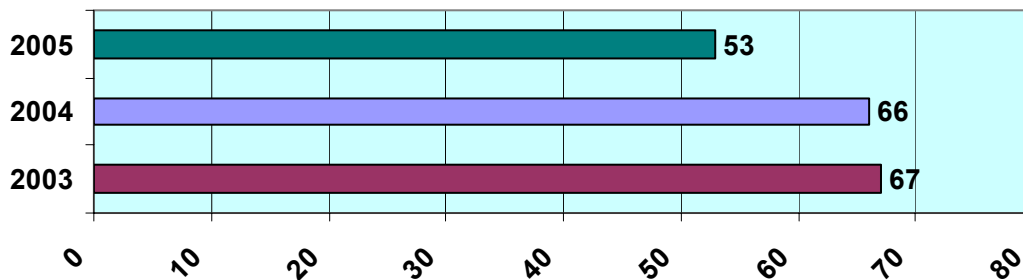
**Grants to National Register/ Eligible Properties, 2003-2005 (DOI Plan IIIa2C)**



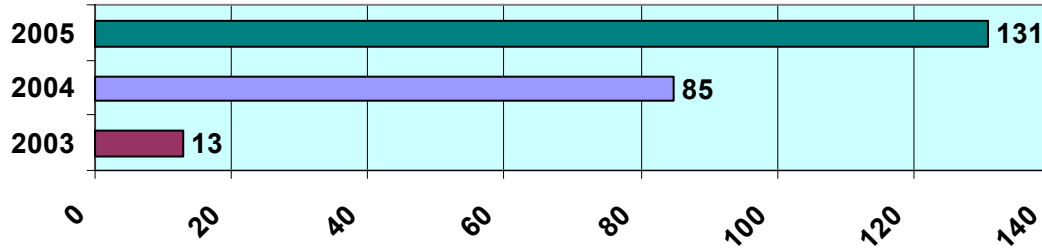

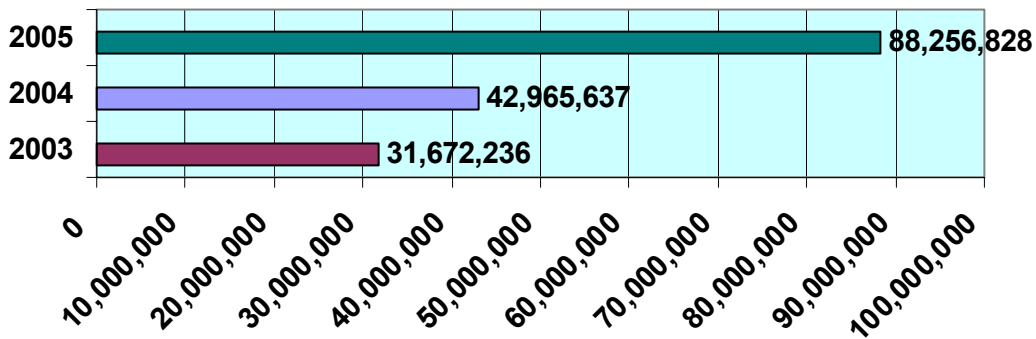


### Miles of New or Enhanced Trails, 2003-2005 (DOI Plan IIIb1A)

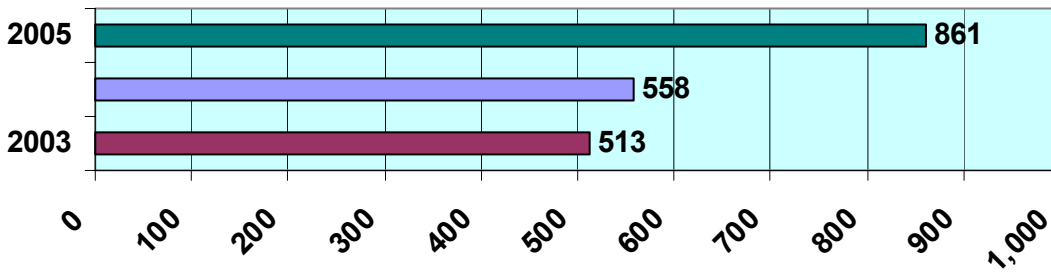

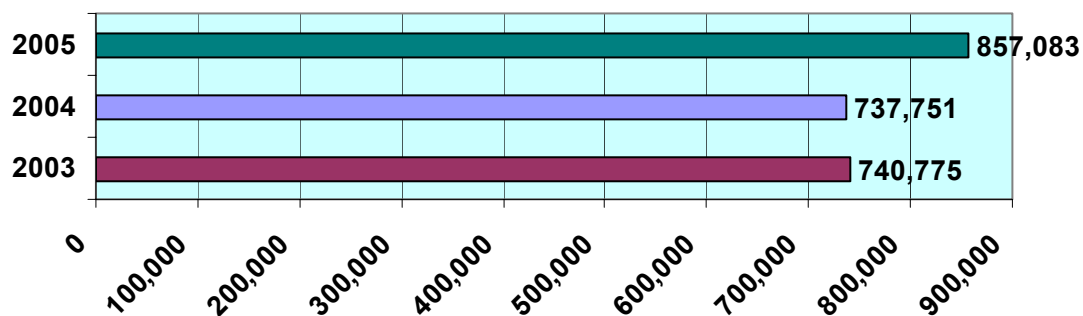
### Visitation, 2003-2005



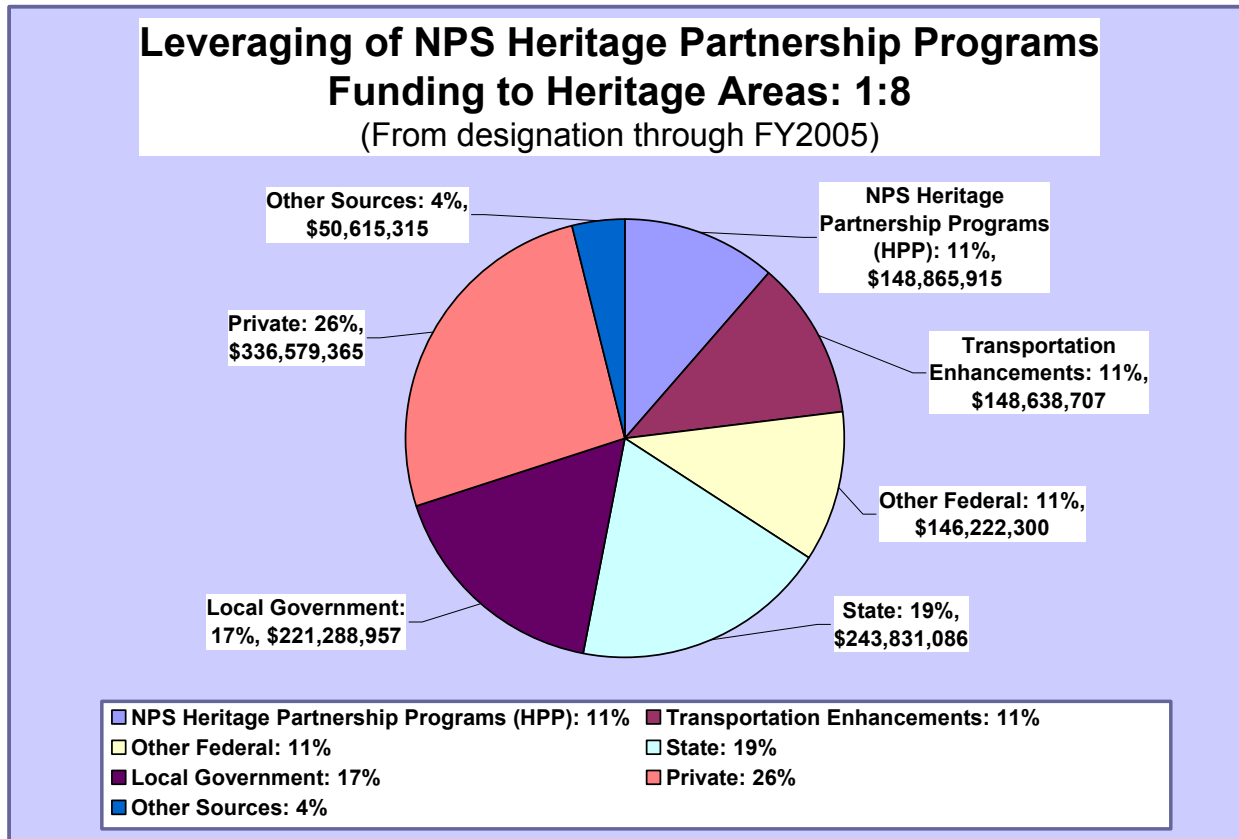

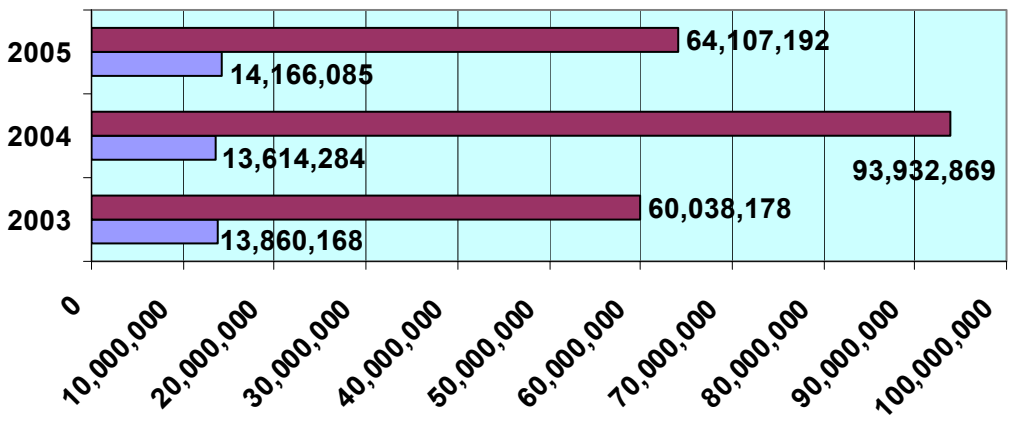
