Need for the Rule(s): The proposed rule amendments replace an erroneous reference to "fiscal year" with "budget period" in OAR 839-025-0008 relating to the period of time a public agency's list of planned public improvements must include, and clarify that pursuant to ORS 279C.836, Public Works Bonds are required to be filed with the Construction Contractors Board by contractors and subcontractors on public works projects of \$100,000 or more.
