*Summary statistics compiled from the unemployment insurance (UI) wage files and PRISM database on initial employment after completing services.  
**Only participants with employment as a goal are included in this report.***

**Total Exited:** The total number of participants who received services and exited the program.

**Total Employed:** The total number of participants with hours of work reported in the UI wage records.

**Placement Rate:** The percent of participants who were employed after receiving services.

**Calculation Placement Rate:** The total number of participants who were employed the quarter of exit or the first quarter after exit divided by the total number of participants who exited during the reporting period.
