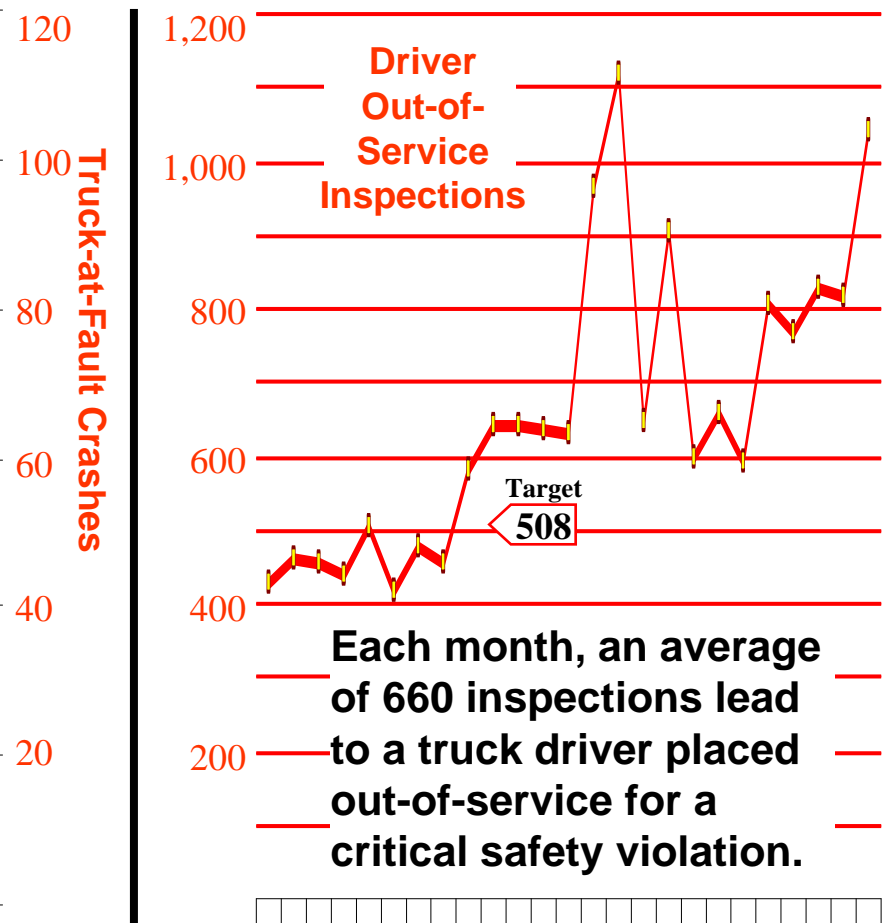
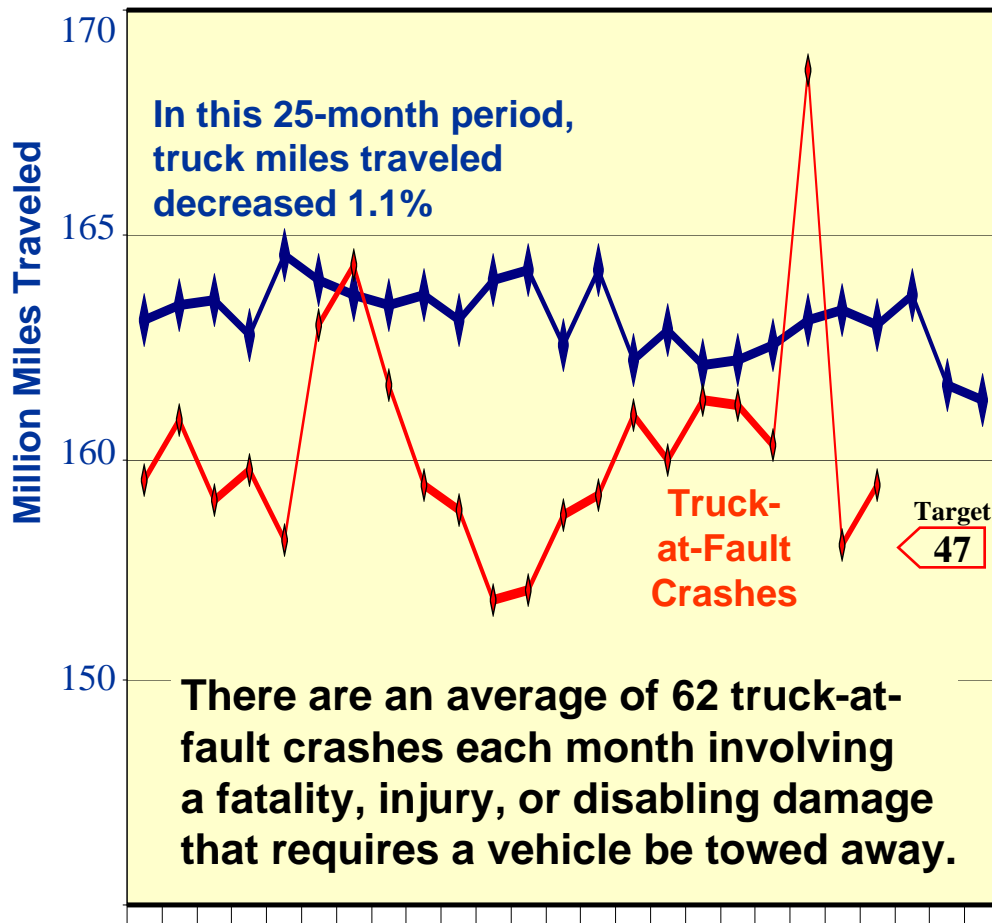

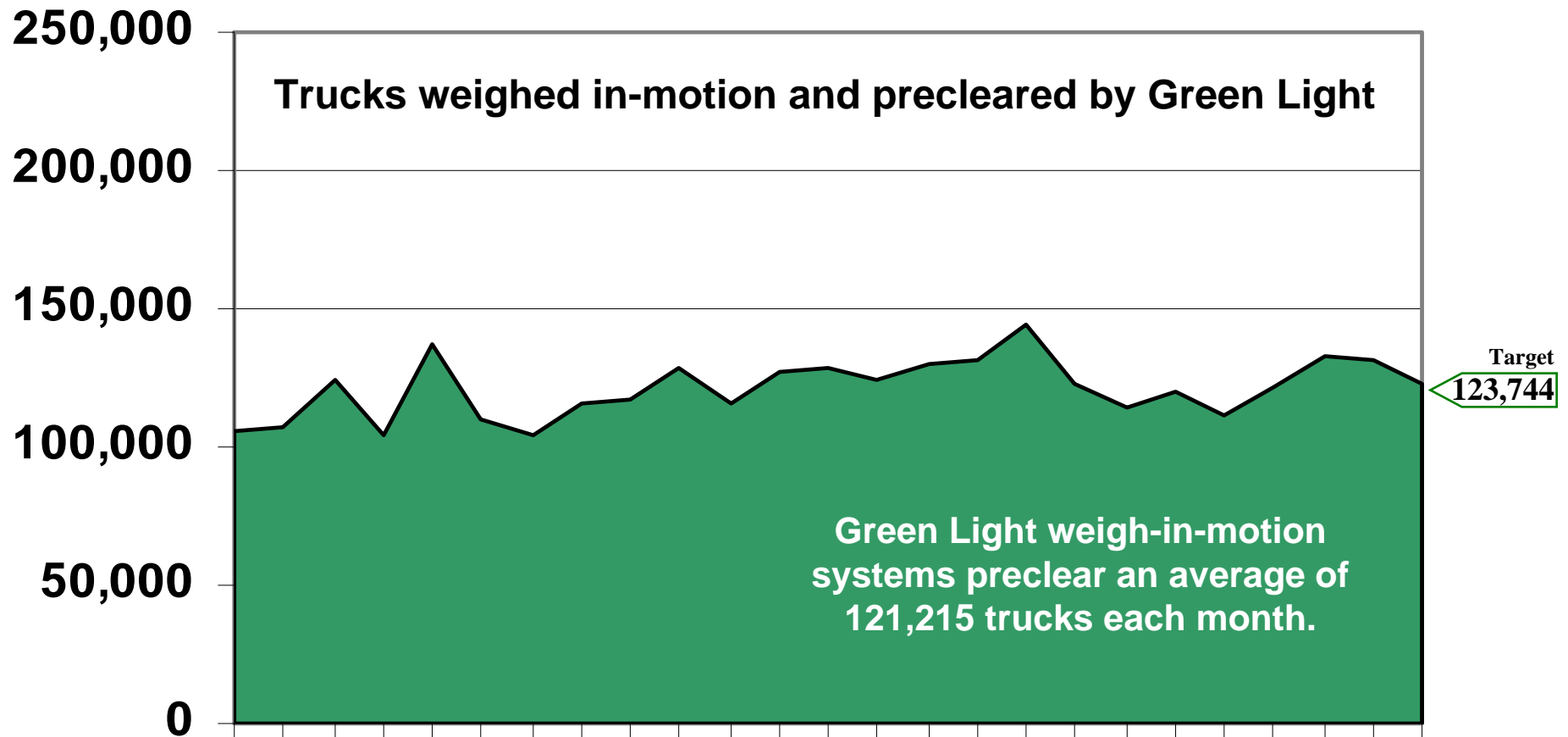

## Green Light activity exceeded target 9 times in the past 25 months

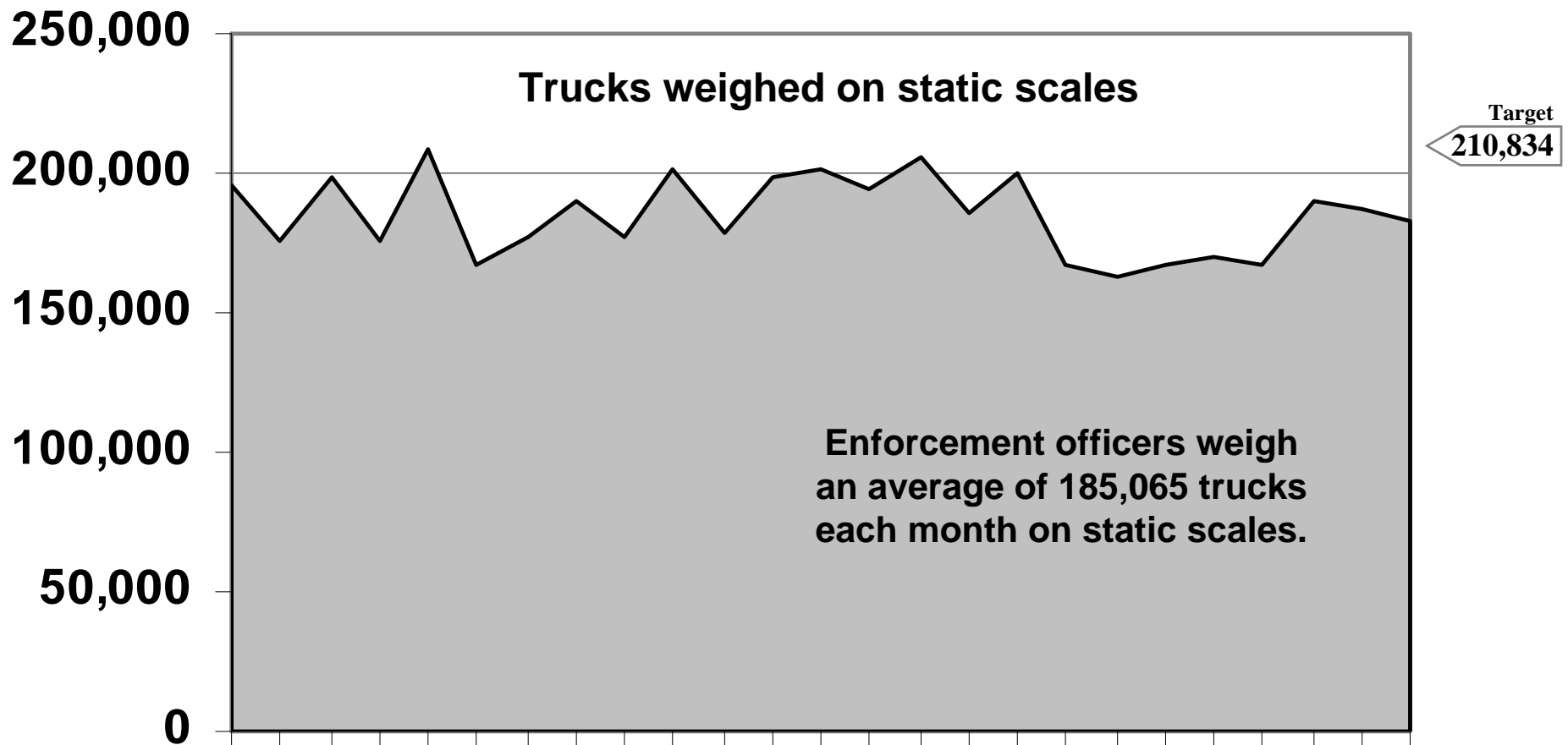

## Static scale weighings fell short of target in the past 25 months

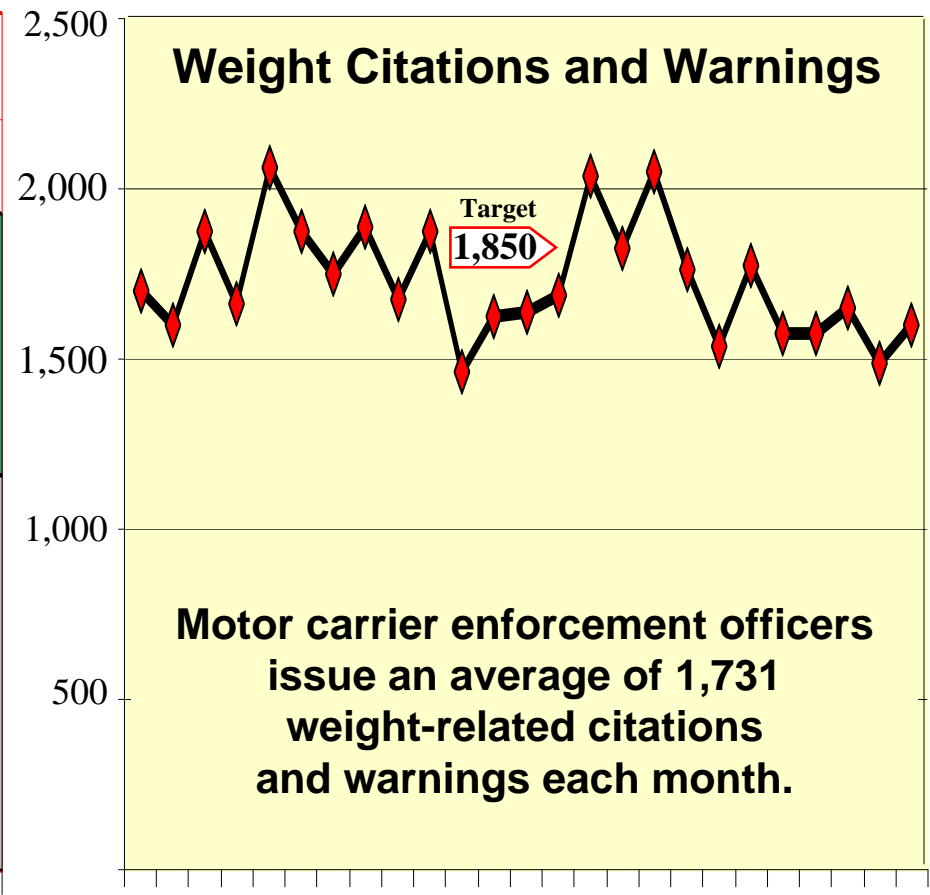
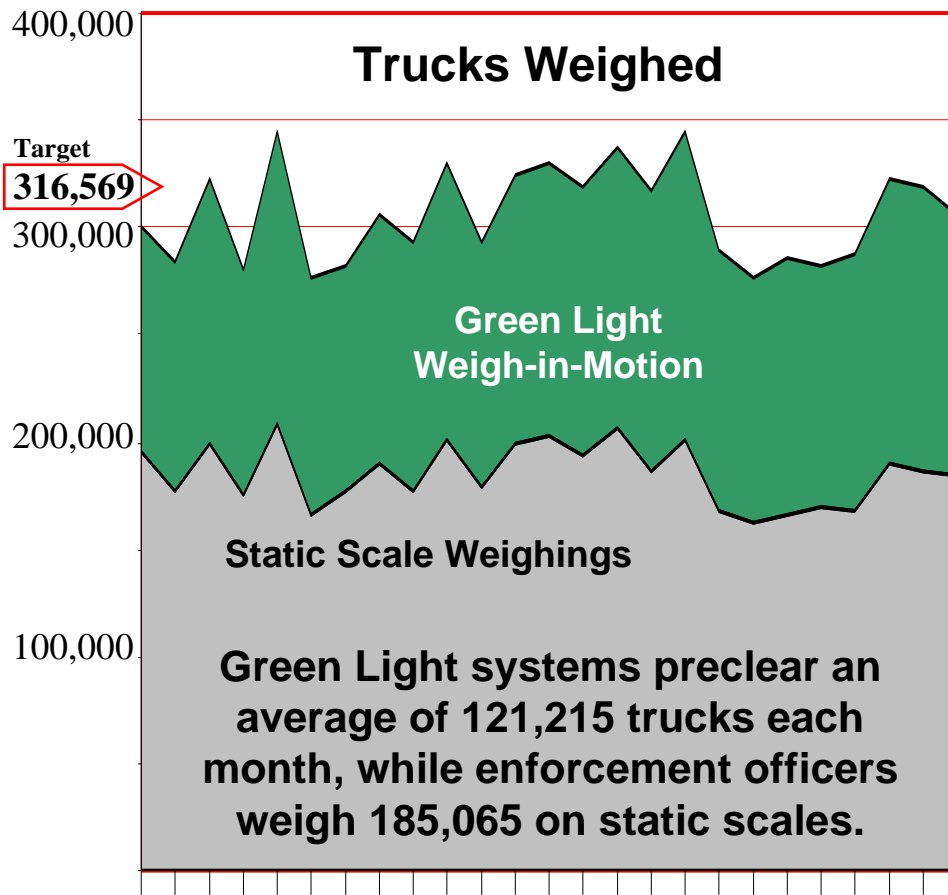

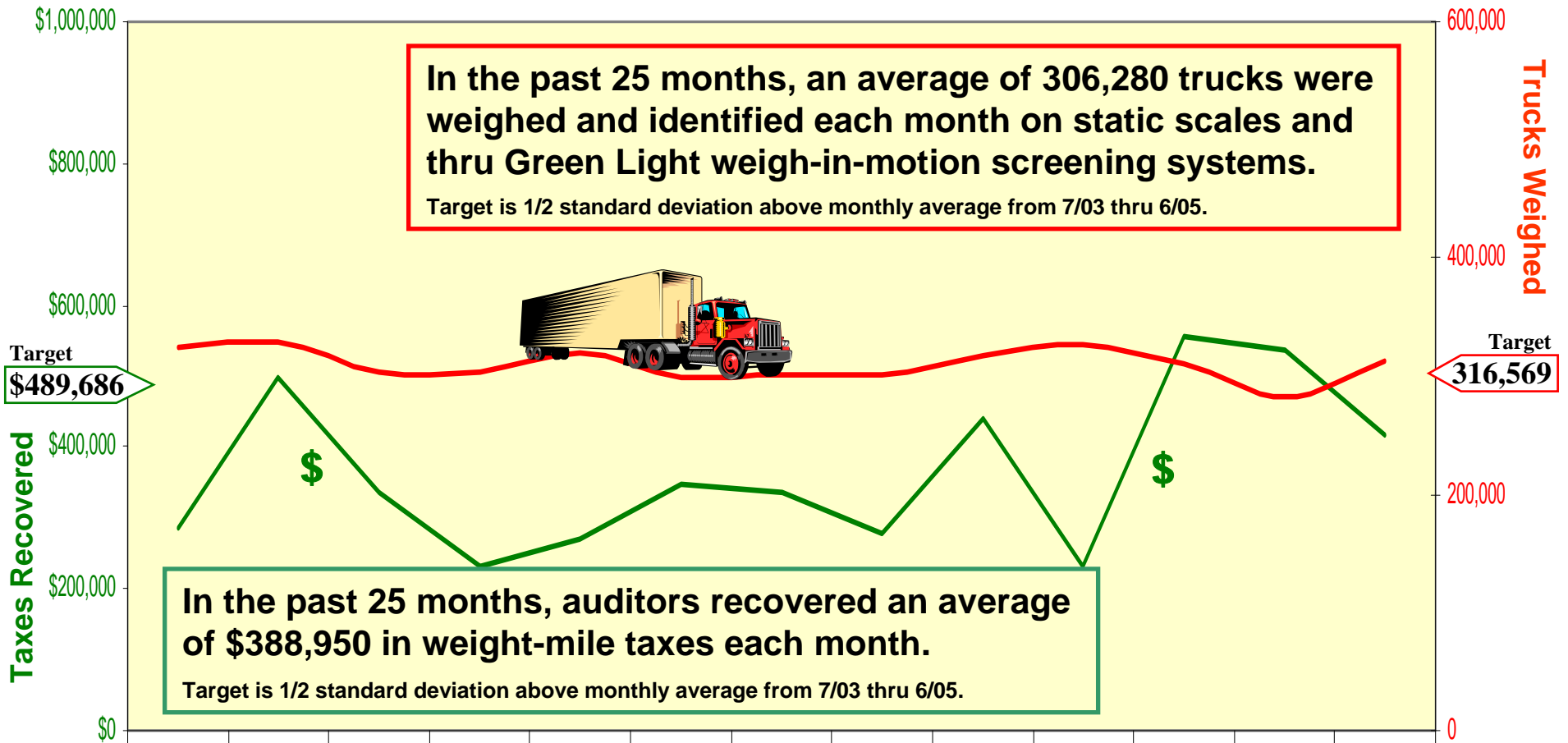
