PESTICIDE RULE CHANGES

The Oregon Department of Agriculture has been working to amend specific rules dealing with (1) pesticide user, dealer and consultant license fees, (2) the pesticide use reporting system, and (3) pesticide product registration fees. These rules are contained in Oregon Administrative Rules - Chapter 603, Division 057 (OAR 603-057). Following is a brief summary of the actions taken.

License Fee Increases - Amendment of OAR 603-057-0100 Adopted

This section states the annual license fees for Commercial Pesticide Operators, Applicators and Trainees, Public Pesticide Applicators and Trainees, Pesticide Dealers and Pesticide Consultants. The amendments proposed in August would have raised these fees to the maximum allowed by statutes. Based upon testimony received during the public comment period on the proposed amendments, the department explored increasing the fees for Commercial and Public Directly Supervised and Immediately Supervised Trainee licenses to amounts less than the maximum allowed. However, the statute was found to require that the fees for these licenses be the same as for the Commercial and Public Pesticide Applicator licenses. No change was made in the fees for Private Pesticide Applicators. The maximum base fees allowed were adopted October 16, 2003, to become effective with licenses for 2004. These fees are:

Pesticide Use Reporting System - Amendment of OAR 603-057-0410 Adopted

This section presents requirements for persons using pesticide products to report into Oregon's pesticide use reporting system. Owing to the status of the reporting system in late 2002 and early 2003, the department had enacted temporary rules in April, 2003, which stated that enforcement action would not be taken for failure to report pesticide use during 2002. This temporary rule was scheduled to end, with rule language reverting back to the original language, on October 18, 2003. The

department proposed permanent amendment of this section in August, and did adopt that proposal on October 15, 2003. The amendment adopted states that no enforcement action will be taken for failure to report pesticide use in 2002, 2003, or any year in which the department lacks a fully effective means for pesticide users to report.

Pesticide Product Registration Fee - Temporary Rule Amending OAR 603-057-0006 Adopted; Permanent Amendment Proposed; Previously Proposed Amendment of OAR 603-057-0006 Adopted

This section states the annual fee to register a pesticide product with the department. Registration is required for the product to be distributed, offered for sale or sold in Oregon. On October 15, 2003, the department adopted a temporary rule which decreased the annual registration fee from \$160 to \$120, beginning with registration for 2004. On the same day, a proposal to make this change a permanent amendment was filed. Previously, a proposal had been made to change sub-sections (2) and (3) of this section. That proposal was adopted on October 16, 2003. Sub-section (2), which stated that \$40 of the registration fee received for each product would be allocated for the pesticide use reporting system, was deleted. Sub-section (3), which stated that no more than \$12 for each product registered could be allocated for research needed to obtain product registrations for uses on Oregon crops, was also deleted. The statutes which authorize these allocations were not changed, and will be referenced by the department rather than having separate rules.

A hearing on the proposal to permanently change the product registration fee to \$120 is scheduled for Tuesday, November 25, 2003, at the department's Salem building. Location of the building is 635 Capitol Street NE, Salem, Oregon 97301-2532. The hearing will begin at 9:00 AM. The public comment period on this proposal will close at 5:00 PM on December 9, 2003. RESEARCHERS MUST NOTIFY ODA

Oregon's experimental use permit program is a valuable tool for researchers who want to run tests on less than 10 acres. One of the important provisions of this type of permit is that the applicant must notify ODA at least 72 hours before the application of the chemical takes place. This allows ODA investigators time to schedule an observation of the experimental application. (Note: not all experimental use permits are selected for observation.)

PLAN SECURITY WHEN TRANSPORTING PESTICIDES

The Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT), Motor Carrier Transportation Division, regulates the transportation of hazardous materials in the state by adopting Federal Hazardous Materials Regulations, Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations for both carriers and shippers. In addition, farmers who ship or transport hazardous materials (including fertilizers, pesticides, and fuels) in amounts that require the shipment to be placarded, must develop and implement security plans. WHAT IS A TOLERANCE AND TOLERANCE REVOCATION

Pesticides are used for a variety of reasons, including to protect food and feed crops from insect and disease injury, and weed competition. After a pesticide is applied, a residue of the pesticide, or components of the pesticide, may remain on or in the treated crop. Pesticides are broken down in the environment a number of ways, including by reacting with oxygen, light, water, or being metabolized by microorganisms or plants. These factors, among others, influence the residue level.

As part of its program to regulate the use of pesticides, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) establishes a "tolerance," or the maximum amount of a pesticide that may legally remain in or on food or animal feed. A specific tolerance is established for each pesticide on a particular crop, or crop group.

Pesticide manufacturers are required to submit data to EPA that answer questions about what residues are present in food and in what quantities. Among these are field trial data,

which are studies of residues found on crops grown in the field when pesticides are applied using the highest rate allowed by the pesticide product label. Thus, when using a product in accordance with the label (even a very old label), the grower would not expect the residue on a crop to be more than the tolerance. However, with quickly changing federal regulations, this may not always be the case.

In recent years, EPA has been increasing the number of tolerances revoked. Sometimes, all the tolerances of a particular active ingredient are revoked, and on other occasions just the tolerances on a few crops are revoked. It is important to remember that presently tolerance revocation is initiated after the use has been canceled only for a few years. In the past, the tolerance would remain active many years after the use on the crop was canceled.

Why should you as the grower and/or pesticide applicator care if EPA revokes certain tolerances? You may still have some of the old product left in your chemical storage area, and it is possible that the uses on the label have been canceled and the tolerances revoked. If you use the product on a crop that does not have a tolerance for the active ingredient in that product, your crop could have an illegal residue and could be embargoed in the field, or the marketplace. This scenario, which used to be quite rare, is becoming more common with the regulations of the Food Quality Protection Act of 1996 (FQPA).

So what can you do to avoid illegal residue problems on your crop?

- Be aware of what pesticides are currently labeled/registered for use on the crop you grow, or treat.
- Avoid "stocking up" on older labeled products, and try to buy only as much product as you will need for the season. Purchase only recently labeled products if you are in doubt.
- If you plan to use a pesticide, especially a product that was labeled several years ago, verify that the tolerance has not been revoked. Your county extension agent, crop consultant, or the product manufacturer may have this information. You can also obtain this information at the following web site: http://www.epa.gov/pesticides/tolerance/tolerance_reports.htm.

Most of the time, you will find that your old pesticide will still have a tolerance, but if it does not, checking first will save you the trouble and expense of a crop embargo.

ODA INSPECTIONS LEAD TO FINE

The U. S. Environmental Protection Agency recently issued a fine of \$40,040 to a pesticide registrant for various violations of their pesticide/fertilizer combination products which were shipped to Oregon. A routine fertilizer inspection conducted in Harrisburg, Oregon by ODA fertilizer staff, discovered large quantities of unregistered fertilizer and unregistered, mislabeled and/or adulterated pesticides which had been shipped by Lesco, Inc. from Stockton, California. Lesco, Inc. of Strongsville, Ohio operated a pesticide establishment in Stockton, California. The pesticide products were missing or had torn EPA registered product labels which are required by federal and state laws.
