Synectics' feedback on draft profile	<p>In December the draft profile on alcohol, preliminary summary on illicit drug use and the data sheets for alcohol and illicit drugs were submitted to Synectics for review. A one-page summary of findings was distributed to the workgroup. The most significant revisions called for in the final profile include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Adding an executive summary</li> <li>• Additional description of Oregon-specific data sources</li> <li>• Focusing on consequence data and consumption data and limiting program data such as arrest rates.</li> <li>• Analyzing underage drinking data (and youth data) separately in the alcohol section</li> <li>• Making noted formatting revisions on graphs, tables and charts</li> <li>• Adding a tobacco profile section</li> </ul>			
TPEP	Stacey Schubert provided an overview of the Tobacco			

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	<p>Prevention and Education Program (TPEP), including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>History on the up and down funding and its impact on TPEP;</li> <li>The 7 districts and 7 population networks currently funded;</li> <li>Enforcement of the indoor clean air act;</li> <li>Information available on the TPEP web sites—fact sheets, county data sheets and other tobacco data.</li> </ul> <p>Stacey also reviewed the data that she analyzes that would be useful for the epi profile.</p>			
Tobacco data	<p>Stacey's presentation helped frame the review and discussion of the tobacco data for the epi profile.</p> <p>Two measures will be added:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>PRAMS data regarding smoking the last 3 months of pregnancy; and</li> <li>Vital Statistics data (from birth certificates) on smoking during pregnancy.</li> </ul> <p>Key messages that need to be emphasized include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Tobacco is the leading cause of preventable death</li> <li>Cigarette consumption has declined quicker than prevalence.</li> <li>Per capita sales decline is a good indicator of decreased smoking. (Internet sales are thought to account for only 2 to 3% of tobacco sales and it is not cheaper for Oregonians to purchase cigarettes across state lines so that isn't a factor.)</li> </ul>	<p>Contact Ken Rosenberg for most recent PRAMS data. SEOW Charter	<p>The Charter was distributed and reviewed. It was noted that the Charter should be able to stand without major revisions at least through the grant period. 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	<p>Tobacco and illicit drug sections will be drafted and sent out for review in the first two weeks of Feb. Geralyn will develop two matrices, one for consequences and one for consumption that compare measures. As much as possible, they should be easy to understand by laypersons and be contained in one document. It would be nice if they included 3 criteria: trends over time, magnitude of impact, and comparison to national rates</p> <p>It was suggested that the Executive Summary be approached from a policy and strategic direction, so Geralyn will touch bases with Karen and Bob Nikkel for direction. It's also important that the Executive Summary be friendly to laypersons so Geralyn will consult with Jim Sellers regarding form style and content.</p> <p>Preliminary thoughts (in no particular order) on concepts for the Executive Summary:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Continued burden of tobacco use is a huge problem that needs to be addressed</li> <li>● Connection of suicide and substance abuse</li> <li>● Treatment capacity needs</li> <li>● Efficacy of tobacco control efforts in Oregon</li> <li>● Serious financial and programmatic commitment to surveys and value of survey tools (see Domino Effect).
