professionals in the field and people in recovery an opportunity to educate their communities and offer

hope; and

WHEREAS: The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services

Administration's Center for Substance Abuse Treatment, and the Office of National Drug Control Policy have proclaimed September 2006 as National Alcohol and Drug Addiction Recovery Month.

THEREFORE: I, Theodore R. Kulongoski, Governor of the State of Oregon, hereby proclaim September 2006 to be

NATIONAL ALCOHOL AND DRUG ADDICTION RECOVERY MONTH
