

Our Adaptive Technology Centers place a high priority on assisting you and your employees with visual impairments. All recommendations are customized for vour individual circumstances.

Step 1: We assess the training, computer skills and adaptive equipment needs in your particular workplace.

Step 2: We tailor a training program to fit your employee's needs and provide the adaptive hardware and software training.

Step 3: If necessary, we adjust the technology to fit your company's unique hardware and software.

## What you get out of the deal:

We give you an employee who is well trained on adaptive tools and ready to be a productive employee. In turn, you give someone an opportunity for economic gain, social inclusion, and self-sufficiency. You can participate by either retaining an employee who is experiencing decreased vision, or by hiring an employee who is blind.

## **ATC Services:**

### No-Cost Services:

These services are free to eligible blind or visually impaired Oregonians and the companies that hire them.

Job-site Assessment One of our Adaptive Technology Specialists will review the work site to determine the needs of both the employer and visually impaired employee. Technology and environmental factors such as lighting will also be evaluated.

Equipment & Training Recommendations We will provide a written report of recommended training, and adaptive hardware and/or software. In addition, any required training can often be completed in one of our Technology Centers.

Job-Site Accommodation Most worksite accommodations are straightforward and can be completed quickly. If more complex modifications are needed, we offer vendor referrals and will assist with any coordination efforts. The cost of additional equipment and services may be negotiated with the employee's Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor.
