Topic: Fort Yamhill Easement for Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde

Background:

OPRD recently acquired a 14.4-acre site located adjacent to the Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde Pow-wow grounds. The "Graves" acquisition was for a maintenance site to service the Fort Yamhill State Heritage Area. At the time of acquisition, staff discussed a potential partnership with the Confederated Tribes to make mutually beneficial road connections from the "Graves property" to the Pow-wow grounds and the park service road.

The Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde has requested a non-exclusive easement over a corner of OPRD property to allow better access to a new traditional plank house being constructed on Tribal Lands. This easement would allow the Confederated Tribes to move forward with road construction that could also benefit OPRD by increasing access from the maintenance site to the park service road. The Confederated Tribes request the approval of the easement as we continue efforts for a reciprocal easement that would formally connect OPRD to the service road by easement right.

The normal process would be to complete a reciprocal easement for the entire road connection. This reciprocal easement is still of interest to OPRD and the Confederated Tribes, but is anticipated to require a lengthy review by the Bureau of Indian Affairs. The Confederated Tribes are requesting to move forward with this initial easement in order to complete construction of the road and traditional plank house for a November 2008 opening.

OPRD will benefit by a physical connection from the Graves property to the park service road at no cost to OPRD. The Confederated Tribes have agreed to maintain the road in the easement area.

Action Requested: Staff recommends and requests your approval of the easement to the Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde.

Prior Action by Commission: Commission approved the purchase of the Graves property on November 29th 2007.

This project will enrich the culture of the area and greatly benefit the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde. It is slated for opening this November.

Due to the time lines of this specific project, I am requesting that State Parks approve the easement as presented, with the idea that we will meet and discuss broadening the easement to reciprocate access in the very near future.




