## **Background:**

On August 20, 2008 the Local Government Grant Program (LGGP) Advisory Committee met to hear ten presentations by local communities requesting grant funding assistance for park projects that would encourage young people to recreate outdoors.

This was a special grant funding allocation that OPRD developed in cooperation with the Oregon 150 to celebrate Oregon's sesquicentennial birthday in 2009. This cooperative effort is intended to help reconnect kids with nature and to get young people outdoors to play and learn about our natural resources.

Besides members of the LGGP Advisory Committee, general advice and recommendations were received from members of the Oregon 150 including The Honorable Wallace P. Carson, Jr., Henry Balensifer III, James Hamrick, and Frank Jagodnik of the Oregon Recreation & Parks Association.

While the original intention was to provide \$200,000 in total funding for four projects, the LGGP Advisory Committee and the Oregon 150 members are recommending five projects to be funded by awarding a total of \$202,425.

Subject to the Commission's approval, The Honorable Barbara Roberts will announce the results of the awards at the Oregon Recreation & Parks Association annual conference on Monday, September 22, 2008 in Bend, Oregon.
