#### Section 4

#### LAW ENFORCEMENT, COURTS, AND PRISONS

The Hawaii State Department of the Attorney General issues semi-annual crime summary reports. Figures on crime, the courts, and corrections in earlier years appear in *Historical Statistics of Hawaii*, Section 10. National data are summarized in the *Statistical Abstract of the United States: 2007*, Section 5.
