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Purpose of Document

USDA DM 3515-002 states: “Agencies are responsible for initiating the PIA in the early stages of the development of a system and to ensure that the PIA is completed as part of the required System Life Cycle (SLC) reviews. Systems include data from applications housed on mainframes, personal computers, and applications developed for the Web and agency databases. Privacy must be considered when requirements are being analyzed and decisions are being made about data usage and system design. This applies to all of the development methodologies and system life cycles used in USDA.

Both the system owners and system developers must work together to complete the PIA. System owners must address what data are used, how the data are used, and who will use the data. System owners also need to address the privacy implications that result from the use of new technologies (e.g., caller identification). The system developers must address whether the implementation of the owner’s requirements presents any threats to privacy.”

The Privacy Impact Assessment (PIA) document contains information on how CFPS affects the privacy of its users and the information stored within. This assessment is in accordance with NIST SP 800-37 *Guide for the Security Certification and Accreditation of Federal Information Systems*.

1 Applicability

1.1 Applicability of System

The information in this document is applicable to the system and its subsystems as listed below.

1.2 System Overview

The Common Farm Programs Systems enclave consists of a family of automated systems providing management of and access to foundational data in support of FSA program areas. The enclave includes systems for managing basic customer information, business entity structures, payment eligibility determinations, third party representation, farm and tract composition and acreage, agricultural land ownership, agricultural crop production reporting and history, and generic crop reference data. Additionally, the enclave automates several generic office functions that integrate with these data areas, such as customer mailings and county office committee elections.

1.2.1 Acreage Reporting and Compliance Systems

The Acreage Reporting and Compliance Systems aid in checking the accuracy of producer reported acreage and that producers are complying with conditions of other farm programs (typically soil and water conservation measures). Summarized data are provided to other automated applications to update farm crop records and for use by the Conservation Reserve Program and the Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program.

The missions for the individual systems are:

- **Report of Acreage (FSA-578):** This system automates the entry and revision of crop, acreage, and producer share data at the county office level. Producers annually report their acreage and crop information on form FSA-578 to the County Offices.
- **Automated Farm Inspection Selection (AFIS):** This system automates the selection of the farms to be inspected (*spot checked*) for compliance. It generates a list (*register*) of the farms to

be inspected. Data from the inspection report is entered into the acreage records and an FSA-468 Notice of Determined Acreage report for producer notification of the compliance inspection results.

- **Fruit and Vegetable Payment Reductions (FPR):** This system provides the capability to apply reductions to Direct and Counter-Cyclical payments based on non-compliance findings resulting from the farm inspections.
- **Compliance Data Reporting (CDR):** This system, by providing reports, aids PECD in monitoring the progress of counties and states on the timely completion of compliance inspections.
- **Highly Erodible Land/Wetland Conservation Violation (HELIC):** This Farm Service Agency website is provided to review Highly Erodible Land Conservation and Wetland Conservation violation data, and provide various reports about reported violations.
- **Compliance Validation System (CVS):** This system empowers the Production, Emergencies, and Compliance Division (PECD), to maintain control of the crops and crop characteristics database (to control the entry selections for acreage reporting fields).
- **Crop Acreage Data Warehouse (CADW):** This system serves as a repository of producer crop acreage reports and producer shares which FSA Headquarters and field personnel will use for management, county, state, and National reporting purposes. The Headquarters Office will also use this repository for making policy decisions regarding new legislation passed for various FSA programs.
- **Compliance Web Service (CWS):** This system is a web service that provides acreage reporting and compliance data to web applications.
- **Compliance Query Tool (CQT):** This system provides the National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) with administrative producer information so as to determine a producer's operating status for his entire farm acreage.

1.2.2 Farm Programs Management Systems

The Farm Program Management Systems (FPMS) supports the recording of farm, crop, owner, and tract data. Additionally, this group of systems includes a series of reference tables that capture detailed information about crops. This data is stored to support various FSA applications and congressional programs.

The missions for the individual systems are:

- **S/36 Farm and Tract files:** A repository of data about farms, tracts, crops, farm operators, and tract owners. Management of this data was previously controlled through S/36 data management software applications, but these have now been replaced by a centralized web-based system (see below). The web Farm Records Management System implements a centralized database, and a transactionally synchronous downloading of data to these distributed local S/36 files. There is no longer direct local user-accessible update of this data via S/36 software, but the data is still available to other S/36 resident client software applications.
- **Noninsured Crop Disaster Program Table:** This table contains descriptive information for crops eligible for the Noninsured Crop Disaster Program; it consists of non-farm-specific reference data only.

- **National Crop Table:** This system is a web based table that maintains prices and yields for all crops used by SCOAP. It is downloaded to the SCOAP system on the A/36 where it is actually used by the counties.
- **Crop Disaster Table:** This system is in Disposal Phase; data is not accessible.
- **Program Parameter File:** This file contains payment rates by crop year for crops within the Direct Payment and Counter Cyclical payment systems; it consists of non-farm-specific reference data only.

1.2.3 Web-Based Farm Records Management System

This is a web-based Intranet application for FSA field office employees to manage farm, tract, crop, and producer data. Data was previously housed on county office AS400/S36 systems, but now resides in a central database housed in the Kansas City web farm, and is synchronously updated to the distributed county office files. The application implements business processes and business rules to correctly perform create/read/update/delete activities. The system also implements a listener application that detects transactional changes made to the data and notifies several client applications through messaging utilities.

1.2.4 Service Center Information Management System (SCIMS)

SCIMS provides for the collection and maintenance of customer data for the Farm Service Agency (FSA), the lead agency for SCIMS, the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), and Rural Development (RD). This eliminates redundant work necessary to maintain common customer information at each agency. SCIMS is a database application that provides an interface for the Service Center Agencies and its customers to enter customer data into a centralized data repository. It also contains some demographic data about customers. Farmers and rural residents benefit from a common customer database used by agencies in USDA Service Centers.

All SCIMS database updates are accomplished through the web browser interface. Authorized employees can input name and address data into the database. A growing number of applications then access this database on a periodic basis to retrieve this data. Examples of these applications include: Electronic Loan Deficiency Payment System (ELDP), Conservation Reserve Program (CRP), Web Centralized Authorization and Authentication Facility (eAuth), and Web Registration. These applications query SCIMS for customer information on a read-only basis.

1.2.5 Customer Name / Address (MF – S/36)

Customer Name/Address provides for the collection and maintenance of customer data for the FSA's legacy common customer information. It also contains some demographic data about customers.

1.2.6 Subsidiary (MF – S/36)

Subsidiary Files are maintained on combined producers, multiple county producers, permitted entities, payment limitation, fiduciary and Power of Attorney status, and producer eligibility for use in controlling producer payments and participation in farm programs. Information maintained in this system is needed by all automated payment systems at the county, state, and the Kansas City FSA office to effectively deliver and administer FSA programs. This repository of customer information also supports the business needs of other agencies. Information in the Subsidiary Files is used by a variety of automated applications to effectively deliver and administer FSA programs at the Service Centers.

Subsidiary Files include:

- Multiple County Producers - tracks producers who meet criteria for being active in multiple counties
- Eligibility – producer eligibility to receive payments under FSA programs
- Permitted Entity – this tracks producer interests and ownership shares in joint operations and corporations, estates and trusts
- Fiduciary – this records information on guardians, conservators, or trustees when one of these is assigned to represent a member's interests
- Power of Attorney – this records information about a person designated by a member to conduct business for that member at the state or county office
- Payment Limitations – this tracks the maximum payment amount per person per program
- Combined Entity – in some cases producers are combined as one entity, typically for husband and wife ownership or when a single producer has controlling interest

1.2.7 Web-Based Subsidiary Systems

The missions for the individual systems are:

- **Eligibility:** This system manages producer eligibility to receive payments under FSA programs.
- **Combinations:** This system manages cases producers are combined as one entity, typically for husband and wife ownership or when a single producer has controlling interest
- **Payment Limitation:** This system tracks the maximum payment amount per person per FSA program.
- **Fiduciary:** The Fiduciary system is a web-based application used to manage fiduciary agreements; recording, updating, terminating and reporting capabilities are provided through the application. Agreement types supported in the initial release are conservatorships, guardianships, power of attorney, and spousal relationships. Additionally, capability is provided to record the death of a FSA customer. Note that recording a conservatorship or a death notification will also result in the termination of any other fiduciary agreement that the incompetent or deceased party participates in. Fiduciary consumes the following services and components:

- **Business File:** This system, MIDAS MVSR3.1 - Business File has an interview-style process that service-center personnel will use to enter information online that was previously collected only manually in a paper-based 502 Farm Operating Plan form. Usage patterns should be heavy up-front and level off to minimal usage once the data-load period is complete. Business File consumers the following: components:

1.2.8 COC Elections

The County Office Committee (COC) Elections system automates FSA-681 reporting by County Offices to expedite the process for electing committee members (eligible producers) for the county offices. These County Committees, of three to five members, are major decision makers and an authority on county programs, and decisions. The committee's functions are very important to FSA's mission and have specific regulations defined in the farm bills from Congress. The COC Elections System supports the elections process by the following functions:

- Collection of the nominee and organization information
- Selection of all the producers that are eligible to vote (based on information such as committee and local administrative area (LAA) codes in the name and address file)
- Build and send county-specific list of all producers eligible to vote (for printing onto ballot self-mailer forms, FSA-681)
- Collection of election data from returned ballot forms (the County Election and Media Outreach Report)
- Creation of COC Directory showing all members and information related to their terms.

1.2.9 Representative Link Manager System (RLMS / EREP)

The Representation Link Manager System (RLMS) provides functions that are used to maintain the Representation-Roles database and the database that stores the relationship between Representative and the individual or Entity that is being represented. This system creates the structure needed for the Representative to logon to web-based applications for his client.

RLMS is in operation and is a web client-server being application used by the State and County offices. The eRepresentative SOAP service (EREP) is also in operation; it allows other applications to validate a representative's access to his client's information.

1.2.10 SCOAP Mailings

The SCOAP Mailings system performs the business function of mailings, defined as the specific set of common activities performed for any application that has determined the need for sending addressed messages to some FSA constituency. The system provides the county office user the capability to provide efficient and effective mail service. In addition to interfacing with applications that have identified selected recipients, the SCOAP Mailings system provides many specific selection options such as types of producers or farms on which specific crops are grown. SCOAP Mailings software provides County employees greater flexibility in the initiation and composition of a mailing, and a considerable staff-hour reduction in its final assembly. This system provides for address retrieval, sorting, printing, preparation of bulk mailing reports, and recording of management information. Additionally, it supports Postnet bar-coding and automated mail sorting rules, enabling the Counties to take advantage of sizeable USPS postage discounts.

SCOAP Mailings is in operation on the county office S/36.

1.2.11 COF Newsletter

The FSA County Office (COF) Newsletter is a FSA Web Farm system for building name and address lists for use in state-wide bulk mailings to farmers and specifically for the high volume DANKA printer systems at the state offices. The supported newsletter is sent out four times a year and relieves individual county offices of the printing burden.
