Easter Nests



Ingredients:

7 oz. marshmallow cream
1/4 cup peanut butter
2 tbsp. melted butter
5 oz. chow mein noodles
1 and 1/4 cups candy
coated chocolates

Instructions:

1. In a mixing bowl, beat marshmallow cream, peanut butter and butter until smooth.
2. Fold in noodles and 1 cup of candy coated chocolates.
3. Chill for an hour.
4. On waxed paper, form mixture by 1/3 cupfuls into nests.
5. Chill for 30 minutes.
6. Place several candy coated chocolates in each nest.

Marshmallow Bunny Treats



Ingredients:

3 tablespoons butter
10 oz. bag of marshmallows
6 cups crisp rice cereal
bunny shaped cookie cutter

Instructions:

1. Melt butter in a non-stick pan and add the marshmallows.
2. Stir over medium heat until the marshmallows have completely melted.
3. Add crisp rice cereal and mix together well.
4. Pour mixture into a 9" x 13" pan that has been sprayed with non-stick cooking spray.
5. Use the cookie cutter to cut out the cooled treats.

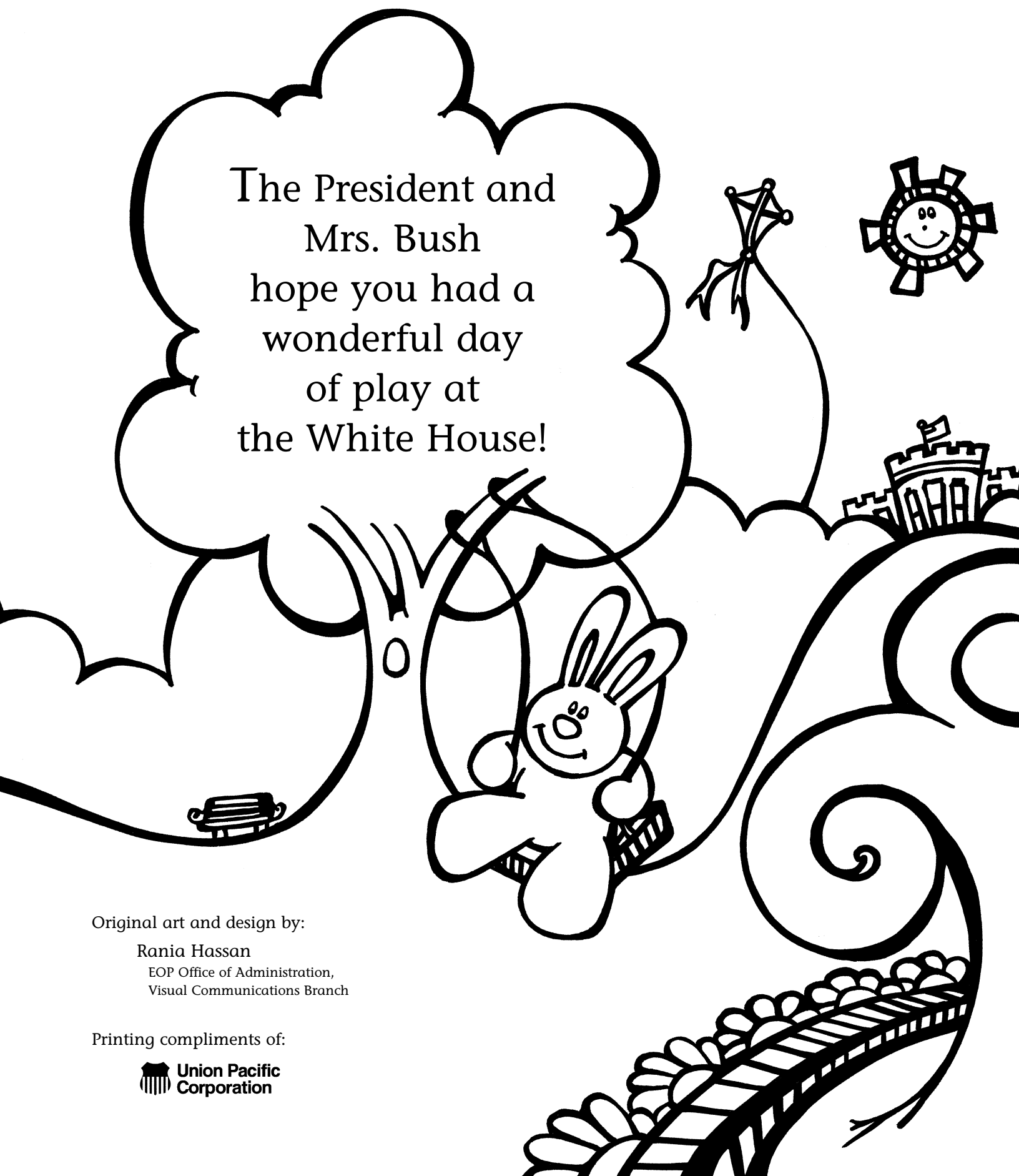
